# Further Education & Skills 24+ Advanced Learning Loans

1. This is a Department for Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS) report for the 24+ Advanced Learning Loans (Loans) system and contains information relating to courses starting in the 2014/15 academic year.
2. The report contains an outline of the source of the data, headline information and tables presenting application and processing figures. Information presented is as given in application forms and is subject to change.
3. This release of 24+ Advanced Learning Loans Application Information covers only applications for courses starting in the 2014/15 academic year, as applications for courses starting in the 2013/14 academic year closed at the end of July 2014 (although changes can be made after July through change of circumstances).
4. The next release of 24+Advanced Learning Loans Information will be on 26 March 2015, and will relate to applications submitted to the end of February.

# Main Headlines

- The total number of applications received for the 2014/15 academic year, from 14 April 2014 to 31 January 2015, was **55,100** (excludes ineligible applications).
- The total number of applications received for the 2014/15 academic year, from 1-31 January 2015, was **3,270** (excludes ineligible applications).
- The total number of processed applications from 1-31 January 2015 for applications for Loans to fund 2014/15 provision was **2,670** (includes ineligible applications).
- The largest amount of applications received from 1-31 January 2015, to fund provision in the 2014/15 academic year (**1,210**, excluding ineligible applications), was in the **24-30** age band.

# Data Sources

The statistics published in this release relate to applications for 24+ Advanced Learning Loans for Level 3+ provision starting in the 2014/15 academic year.

The data used to produce this monthly report are sourced from the Student Loans Company (SLC) application database. It should be noted that the data refer to all received applications for 24+ Loans (both unprocessed and processed, but excluding those ineligible, cancelled, deleted and in data entry) and are subject to change. Therefore, application figures are not necessarily indicative of actual learner starts.

The data used in this report are sourced from an operational database that is updated on an ongoing basis, and therefore month to month application figures may fluctuate due to further processing of received applications. This may sometimes result in total application figures from launch in a particular table category increasing more or less than would be expected based on the previous month's submitted applications, or even decreasing from one month to the next.

## Other Related Statistics

On Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> January 2015 the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills published the Further Education and Skills Statistical First Release, which contains figures relating to learners participating in FE in the first three months of the 2014/15 academic year who were funded through the 24+ Advanced Learning Loans system.

The next release of the Further Education and Skills Statistical First Release will be in March 2015, and will show provisional participation data for the first three months of the 2014/15 academic year.

# Table Guide

This section provides a brief summary of what is included in each table of this report. The tables for the 2014/15 academic year show figures for the total applications received in January as well as the total applications received since the 2014/15 application system was launched.

- **Table 4** shows figures for received applications for the 2014/15 Academic Year to date, broken down by applicant age, sex and UK/Non-UK status.
