Main Headlines

Applications received and applications ready for payment	The number of applications received for 24+ advanced learning loans decreased from 70,820 in the 2013/14 academic year to 67,280 in 2014/15. However, the number of applications ready for payment (approved) increased from 56,220 in 2013/14 to 56,870 in 2014/15.
Total loans approved and average (mean) loan	The total value of loans ready for payment increased from £139.8m in the 2013/14 academic year to £148.8m in 2014/15. The average (mean) loan ready for payment also increased from £2,490 in 2013/14 to £2,620 in 2014/15.
Provision type	Level 3 Diplomas received the most applications in the 2014/15 academic year. There were 34,880 applications received for Level 3 Diplomas, with 29,280 ready for payment. Overall, this amounted to a total of £84.8m awarded loans, with an average (mean) loan of £2,890.
Applicant demographics	The highest number of applications received were from the 24-30 year old age group, with 27,000 being received for the 2014/15 academic year. On average, the value of loans approved and ready for payment for younger applicants were larger than those for older applicants. 72 per cent of applications received were by females (48,670) and 85 per cent of applications were received by UK nationals (57,070) .
Top 10 qualifications	The Diploma in Accounting (QCF) qualification awarded by the Association of Accounting Technicians (AAT) received the most 24+advanced learning loan applications in the 2014/15 academic year. This qualification received 3,460 applications, with 3,030 applications ready for payment.
Sector Subject Area	For the 2014/15 Academic Year, the QAA access to HE in the Health, Public Services and Care received 10,690 applications, with 9,030 ready for payment. This was the largest amount of applications received for any provision type.
Learning provider type	General Further Education and Colleges (including Tertiary Colleges) received 44,570 applications for the 2014/15 academic year, of which 38,430 were ready for payment. There were also 16,500 applications received for Private Sector Public Funded learning providers, of which 13,120 were ready for payment.


- 1. This is a Department for Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS) report from the 24+ Advanced Learning Loans applications system and contains information relating to courses starting in the 2014/15 academic year (August 2014 to July 2015). This final report uses data from the Student Loans Company's (SLC) live database. Data used includes applications received up until 30th September 2015, although applications closed for the 2014/15 academic year on 31 July 2015. This allows any applications that were submitted after the closing date due to certain circumstances to be included, as well as final processing to be completed on applications already submitted.
- 2. The report contains an outline of the data source as well as tables presenting; the number of applications received, the number of applications ready for payment, the amount of loan awarded to those ready for payment and the average (mean) amount awarded. Given the nature of the SLC live database, the information presented is at 30 September 2015 and is subject to change.
- 3. The next release of 24+ Advanced Learning Loans Information will be on 26 November 2015, and will relate to applications submitted to the end of October 2015 for the 2015/16 academic year. A final report for the 2015/16 academic year is planned for release in October 2016.

2. Data Source

The data used to produce this report are sourced from the live Student Loans Company (SLC) application database. The data refer to all applications received for 24+ Advanced Learning Loans, which include both unprocessed and processed applications, but exclude those ineligible, cancelled, deleted and in data entry. The live database provides information on applications, and is updated on an ongoing basis due to applications being processed, therefore data presented throughout the academic year are subject to change. A database snapshot provides data on applications (including application state) as it was held for any given date. This final report uses data on applications on the 30th September 2015 for the 2014/15 academic year and 30th September 2014 for the 2013/14 academic year. Data presented in this report may also change for particular applications at some point in the future, but the number of cases is now likely to be very small and unlikely to affect the results presented here.

Figure 1.1 provides an overview of different application states. The state of an application can depend on various factors, including how much progress has been made processing the application, as well as the accuracy of the information and supporting evidence provided. In the 24+ Advanced Learning Loans report, the definition of applications received exclude those that are in data entry, ineligible, cancelled or deleted.

Figure 2.1 – Process map of application states



Applications move between different states on an ongoing basis. For example, an application may be in data entry and move to awaiting approval or an application that has been approved may move into the cancelled, deleted or in data entry state. It is therefore possible that the number of applications received could decrease from one month to the next if a large amount of applications move to the states in the red boxes (and are not classed as an application received), although this is highly unlikely in practise. Also, due to the changing of states, the sum of monthly application states over the course of the academic year will not equal the total for the full academic year.

Since the data held by the SLC relate to applications only, they are not necessarily indicative of actual learner starts. For information on leaner starts, see other related statistics.

All applications received by the Student Loans Company for 24+ advanced learning loans, excluding those with application states; In Data Entry, Cancelled, Deleted and Ineligible (see Figure 2.1).
Applications in the 'approved' state (see Figure 2.1).
A snapshot of the Student Loan Company application database provides information on the status of applications for any chosen date, including dates in the past. For example, if a snapshot of 30 th September 2015 is chosen, then the information provided by the database will show application status held on the database on this day.

3. Other Related Statistics

On Wednesday 14th October 2015 the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills published the <u>Further Education and Skills Statistical First Release</u>, which contains full year provisional figures relating to the number of learners participating in FE in the 2014/15 academic year who were funded through the 24+ Advanced Learning Loans system (<u>see Table 25</u>). This also includes learners whose course started in the 2013/14 academic year that continued into the 2014/15 academic year, and so these figures are not comparable to those in this report.

The next release of the Further Education and Skills Statistical First Release will be on Wednesday 18th November 2015, and will show final data on participation for the full 2014/15 academic year.

The Student Loans Company also published their <u>24+ Advanced Learning Loans Paid in England</u> publication on Wednesday 14th October 2015, which includes information on payments made to FE providers on behalf of loans-funded learners during the 2013/14 and 2014/15 academic years. Data presented here also relates to learners who are participating on a further education loan funded by a 24+ advanced learning loan, and hence are not directly comparable to the figures presented in this report.

On Thursday 18th June 2015 the Student Loans Company published <u>Debt and repayment statistics for England</u>, which included figures debt and repayment relating to some 24+ Advanced Learning Loans for the 2014/15 academic year.




