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# Final decisions on changes to the performance tables in 2003

### **Overview:**

This note announces the Secretary of State's final decisions following consultation on changes in 2003 to the content of the primary school, secondary school (Key Stage 3), secondary school (GCSE/GNVQ) and post-16 performance tables.

Following consultation earlier this year, the Secretary of State has decided that the content of this year's performance tables will be subject to the changes over the page.

The content of the 2003 tables is listed at Annex A.

A more detailed explanation of the content of the 2003 performance tables will be provided to schools and colleges in September when they are asked to check their results data prior to publication.

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# **Primary School (Key Stage 2) Performance Tables**

The Secretary of State has decided to extend the data published in the primary school tables this year. Therefore, in addition to the existing threshold indicators, the 2003 tables will include:

- a value added measure showing the progress made by pupils from Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 2, using the methodology proposed in consultation; and
- an indicator showing the percentage of pupils achieving Level 5 in the tests in each of the core subjects of English, mathematics and science.

The consultation proposed that we publish the Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 2 value added measure for schools with fewer than 11 eligible pupils. However, after careful consideration of the responses received on this proposal, the Secretary of State has decided <u>not</u> to publish a value added measure for small schools.

Also, based on the responses to our proposal in consultation to publish the primary school performance tables, the Secretary of State has decided that the Department will publish the primary school tables instead of local education authorities (LEAs).

# **Secondary School (Key Stage 3) Performance Tables**

The Secretary of State has decided to make no change to the performance indicators showing the achievements of pupils at the end of Key Stage 3. He has also decided to report separately school and LEA level Key Stage 3 results in stand-alone Key Stage 3 performance tables.

After careful consideration of the responses to consultation on our proposal to publish Key Stage 3 results for maintained schools only, the Secretary of State has decided that Key Stage 3 results for pupils in independent schools will not be published.

# Secondary School (GCSE/GNVQ) Performance Tables

The Secretary of State has decided to retain the same format and content for the secondary school tables this year as last year.

This year, a pilot study will report value added measures showing the progress pupils make from Key Stage 2 to GCSE/GNVQ. The Department will publish the outcome of this study at the same time as the secondary school (GCSE/GNVQ) tables.

# **Post-16 Performance Tables**

The Secretary of State has decided to make the following changes to the Post-16 tables:

- to report Key Skills at Level 3 together with A/AS results in combined indicators; and
- to report Advanced Extension Awards in a separate column in the tables.

# Pupils recently arrived from overseas whose first language is not English

Key Stage 2, Key Stage 3 and GCSE/GNVQ results will again be discounted in respect of pupils recently arrived from overseas with little or no English, provided the pupils meet <u>all</u> of the following criteria:

- they were admitted to an English school for the first time on or after the start of the 2001/2002 school year; and
- they arrived from overseas prior to their admission; and
- their first language is not English.
