This document is intended to assist staff in planning and delivering the overall vision for Curriculum for Excellence.

The vision for the new national qualifications is to create assessment opportunities that follow and support learning and teaching. This follows the principles laid out in *Building the Curriculum 5* and makes assessment a natural part of learning and teaching.

Added Value Unit: Media Assignment: The purpose of this unit is to provide learners with the opportunity to apply and integrate their skills in analysing and creating straightforward media content. Learners analyse, plan, create and evaluate media content on a chosen topic that develops their personal interests.

There is a full package of unit assessment support available on the <u>SQA Secure</u> website for these mandatory units. The package includes unit assessments for both combined and unit-by-unit approaches.

Unit assessment

The above units are mandatory when taken as part of the Media National 4 course but they can also be standalone units. Unit support notes follow on from the course support notes.

Added Value Unit

For this unit learners will be required to provide evidence of:

- · media analysis skills
- straightforward planning and research skills
- straightforward production skills (from pre-production, production, post-production as appropriate)
- straightforward evaluation skills
- knowledge of appropriate key aspects of media literacy.

The assessment method for this unit is an assignment in which the learner will apply their analysis and production skills to analyse, plan, create and evaluate media content on a chosen topic.

Setting the assessment

The assignment is set by SQA and applied to a brief set by centres. It will be a meaningful and appropriately challenging task that allows learners to demonstrate application of analysis and production skills at an appropriate level.

Evidence will be internally marked by centre staff in line with SQA guidelines.

Verification

The verification process is intended be supportive to staff.

Internal verification is the process of ensuring standards are applied uniformly and consistently within a school in line with national standards. External verification is the process of ensuring that national standards are maintained consistently across all schools.
