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1. Information: ESFA e-bulletin subscriptions

Along with many other organisations, we are currently reviewing the way that we send out information as we prepare to implement the new General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). As a result of our review, we have decided to change the way in which people subscribe to the ESFA bulletin, which will take affect from 24 May 2018.

If you are an accounting officer, chief financial officer or chair of trustees at an academy trust or headteacher at an academy school, you will not need to do anything and you will continue to receive the email if we hold your contact information. To make sure we have up-to-date contact information for your academy, please follow the guidance on our <u>providing and updating academy trust governance contacts page</u> on GOV.UK.

If you are not one of the roles listed above and you want to continue receiving an email when we have published our newsletter, then you will need to <u>subscribe to GOV.UK alerts</u>. This way you will find out when we have published it online for you to read.

4. Information: data protection toolkit for schools

The Department for Education (DfE) has published a <u>toolkit on data protection</u> to help schools prepare for the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) coming into force in May 2018.

GDPR requires all organisations, including schools, to have robust governance in place for handling personal data. This toolkit is designed to help schools develop their own policies and processes for managing data, and provides advice on how to comply with the new legislation.
