Keeping children safe

The Childcare Offer for Wales, which provides up to 30 hours of early education and childcare for 3 and 4 year olds, is closed to new applications.

This is so that the funding can be used to support key workers with their

childcare costs and support vulnerable children during the coronavirus

pandemic. This funding is provided through the Coronavirus Childcare Assistance Scheme (C-CAS).

From 22 June 2020, older siblings who are already being funded to attend a setting with a younger sibling can do so until the end of the summer term at the latest (your local authority will decide the closing date). Older siblings however are expected to attend school.
