## General notes for users of the children in need COLLECT reports

1. The reports are available to the Collector (Department for Education) and local authority contacts with COLLECT (collections online for learning, education, children and teachers) access. The DfE can access the reports for each local authority. Each local authority has access only to their own reports.
2. Reports can be run from the launch reports option within the children in need (CIN) COLLECT blade.
3. The majority of the reports are not live, but instead show the position in COLLECT at close on the previous working day.
4. All reports are exportable in the following formats: xml, csv, tiff, pdf, web archive and MS Excel.

# 1. Assessments working days list

## 1.1 Report description

This report shows the number of working days taken to complete an assessment, from the start of the assessment to the end of the assessment.

The report shows the position at close on the previous day.

## 1.2 Definitions

The report shows the number of working days taken to complete an assessment, for assessments authorised between 1 April 2021 and 31 March 2022.

The number of working days taken to complete an assessment is calculated by subtracting the assessment start date from the assessment authorisation date and then subtracting any bank holidays and local authority non-working days.

If a start date and authorisation date fall on the same day, the number of working days is counted as zero. If a start date is after an authorisation date, the number of working days will be a negative figure.

When an assessment starts on a weekend or a non-working day (for example a bank holiday) local authorities should return that date. The examples below demonstrate how the number of working days taken to complete the assessment is calculated.

### Example 1:

'AssessmentActualStartDate' 30-05-2021

'AssessmentAuthorisationDate' 21-06-2021

The duration of this assessment is calculated as 14 working days. Since the assessment started on a Sunday, we move forward to the next working day which is Tuesday 1 June 2021 (since Monday 31 May 2021 is a bank holiday) and count this as day zero. We then count the working days to the authorisation date, which means the duration of this assessment is 14 working days.

### Example 2:

'AssessmentActualStartDate' 04-05-2021

'AssessmentAuthorisationDate' 08-05-2021

The duration of this assessment is calculated as 4 working days. The assessment started on a Tuesday, which is counted as day zero. We then count the working days to the

authorisation date, which falls on a Saturday. Since Saturday is not a working day, we count the assessment as ending on the next working day (Monday 10 May 2021), which means the duration of this assessment is 4 working days.

### 1.3 Report format

Component	Description
Rows	When a record meets the selection criteria (assessment authorisation date is $\geq 01/04/2021$ and $\leq 31/03/2022$ ) it is added as a row in the report. The records are ordered by local authority child id.
Columns	'LACChildID' – the local authority child id; 'Referral date' – referral date of the child; 'Actual start date' – date the assessment started; 'Authorisation date' – date the assessment was authorised; 'No. of working days' – number of working days taken to complete the assessment.

A child may be included more than once if they have more than one completed assessment during the year.

This report shows children who were the subject of a child protection plan (CPP) at 31 March 2022, by initial and latest category of abuse.

The report shows the position at close on the previous day.

### 3.3 Report format

Component	Description
Rows	There is a row for each category of abuse and the total number of records included in the report.
Columns	'Initial category of abuse' – a count of the initial category of abuse recorded for the child; 'Latest category of abuse' – a count of the current category of abuse recorded for the child.

## 4. Error counts

### 4.1 Report description

This report shows a count of the validation rule errors and queries.

The report shows the position at close on the previous day.

### 4.2 Report format

Component	Description
Rows	The rows in the report show the validation errors and queries ordered by the number of occurrences (highest to lowest).
Columns	'Occurrences' – how many times the error or query occurs; 'Validation rule number' – states the validation code as listed in the technical specification; 'Error message' – displays the validation rule error or query message.

## 5. Error report

### 5.1 Report description

This report lists all the individual validation rule errors and queries for a local authority.

The report shows the position at close on the previous day.

### 5.2 Report format

Component	Description
Rows	Each occurrence of a validation error or query is added as a row to the report. Errors are listed in order of validation rule number (lowest to highest).
Columns	'LA Number' – the local authority number; 'UPN' – the unique pupil number of the child; 'LA Child ID' – the local authority child id; 'DOB' – the date of birth of the child; 'Expected DOB' – the expected date of birth of the child (if unborn); 'Referral date' – date the child was referred; 'Error/query' – if it is an error or a query; 'Error okayed' – if it is an ok error; 'Validation rule no'. – the associated validation rule number; 'Error message' – what the error message is; 'Record name' – data module that the error/query is associated with; 'Data item name' – specific data item that the error/query relates to; 'Data item value' – value of the data item that the error/query relates to.

## 6. Factors at assessment

### 6.1 Report description

This report provides a count of factors identified at the end of completed assessments. More than one factor can be recorded against the same assessment, which means the total sum of factors may exceed the number of completed assessments in the year.

The report shows the position at close on the previous day.

Rows	There is a row for each factor identified at the end of an assessment and the total number of completed assessments.
Columns	<p>'Factors identified at the end of assessment' - the factors identified at the end of an assessment;</p> <p>'Number of completed assessments' – a count of the number of completed assessments where the factor was identified. A child may be included more than once if they have more than one assessment in the year.</p>

## 7. Transfer-in ICPC working days summary

### 7.1 Report description

This report provides a summary of the total number of transfer-in initial child protection conferences (ICPCs) in the year and the time taken from the referral date to the date of the initial child protection conference (recorded in the 'CIN details module') banded by working days. The report is restricted to only those CIN details records where the date of the initial child protection conference is within the census year and is not missing.

The report shows a table with the following bandings:

Date of ICPC before referral date

0-10 working days

11-15 working days

16-20 working days

21+ working days

No referral date

Total episodes subject to a transfer-in ICPC in the year

The report shows the position at close on the previous day.

### 7.2 Definitions

The number of working days is calculated by subtracting the referral date from the date of the ICPC (on the 'CIN details module') and then subtracting any bank holidays and local authority non-working days.

If an ICPC starts on the same day as the child is referred, the number of working days is calculated as zero. If the ICPC starts before the referral date, the number of working days will be a negative figure.

The examples below demonstrate how the number of working days taken from referral to transfer-in ICPC is calculated.

#### Example 1:

'ReferralDate' 30-05-2021

'DateOfInitialCPC' ('CIN details module') 21-06-2021

The time taken between referral date and initial ICPC is calculated as 14 working days. Since the referral was on a Sunday, we move forward to the next working day which is Tuesday 1 June 2021 (since Monday 31 May 2021 is a bank holiday) and count this as

day zero. We then count the working days to the date of the initial ICPC, which means the time taken from referral to initial ICPC is 14 working days.

### Example 2:

'ReferralDate' 04-05-2021

'DateOfInitialCPC' ('CINDetailsModule') 08-05-2021

The time taken between referral date and initial ICPC is calculated as 4 working days. The referral was on a Tuesday, which is counted as day zero. We then count the working days to the date of the initial ICPC, which falls on a Saturday. Since Saturday is not a working day, we count the date of the initial ICPC as the next working day (Monday 10 May 2021), which means the time taken from referral to initial ICPC is 4 working days.

## 7.3 Report format

Component	Description
Rows	There is a row for each working day band and the total number of episodes included in the report.
Columns	'Time from referral to date of transfer-in ICPC' – the working day bands for time from referral to transfer-in ICPC; 'Number of transfer-in ICPCs' – a count of the number of transfer-in ICPCs which fall into the working day banding. A child may be counted more than once if they have more than one transfer-in initial child protection conference (ICPC) during the year.

## 8. ICPC working days summary

### 8.1 Report description

This report provides a summary for the total number of initial child protection conferences (ICPCs) in the year and the time taken from section 47 (S47) actual start date to the date of the ICPC, banded by the number of working days. The report is restricted to only S47 records where the date of initial child protection conference is within the census year and is not missing.

The report will produce a table with the following bandings:

Date of ICPC before S47 actual start date

0-10 working days

11-15 working days

16-20 working days

21+ working days

No S47 start date

Total episodes subject to an ICPC in the year

The report shows the position at close on the previous day.

### 8.2 Definitions

The number of working days is calculated by subtracting the S47 actual start date from the date of ICPC and then subtracting any bank holidays and local authority non-working days.

If a S47 enquiry starts on the same day as the ICPC, the number of working days is zero. If an ICPC starts before the S47 enquiry, the number of working days will be a negative figure.

Actual start dates have been collected since 2012 to 2013. When a S47 enquiry starts on a weekend or a non-working day (for example a bank holiday) local authorities should return that date.

The examples below demonstrate how the number of working days from S47 start date to date of ICPC is calculated.

#### **Example 1:**

'S47ActualStartDate' 30-05-2021

'DateOfInitialCPC' 21-06-2021

The time taken between the S47 start date and initial ICPC is calculated as 14 working days. Since the section 47 started on a Sunday, we move forward to the next working day which is Tuesday 1 June 2021 (since Monday 31 May 2021 is a bank holiday) and count this as day zero. We then count the working days to the date of the initial ICPC, which means the time taken from referral to initial ICPC is 14 working days.

**Example 2:**

'S47ActualStartDate' 04-05-2021

'DateOfInitialCPC' 08-05-2021

The time taken between the S47 start date the date of initial ICPC is calculated as 4 working days. The referral was on a Tuesday, which is counted as day zero. We then count the working days to the date of the initial ICPC, which falls on a Saturday. Since Saturday is not a working day, we count the date of the initial ICPC as the next working day (Monday 10 May 2021), which means the time taken from referral to initial ICPC is 4 working days.

This report provides a summary of the three child protection plan key indicators and shows the numerator, denominator and percentage value for each indicator.

This report shows the current position. Please note that the associated child-level reports show the position at close on the previous day.

## 10. 'KI Children – CPP – 2 Years or more'

### 10.1 Report description

This report shows child protection plans which lasted two years or more. It runs in two parts:

1. The denominator which shows the number of child protection plans which ended during the year.
2. The numerator which shows the number of children who were the subject of a plan continuously for 2 years or longer (more than 729 days).

The report shows the position at close on the previous day.

### 10.2 Definitions

Output	Selection criteria
Child protection plans ending in the year (denominator)	For any Child Protection Plan with a Child Protection Plan End Date $\geq$ CIN Census Start Date (01/04/2021) and $\leq$ CIN Reference Date (31/03/2022) the record is added to denominator.
Plans identified in the denominator which have durations of 730 days or more (numerator)	For each plan included in the denominator, the length of the plan is calculated by subtracting the Child Protection Plan Start Date from the Child Protection Plan End Date and converting the result to days. 1. Summary: an aggregate count for CIN plans at any point in the year; starting during the year; ending during the year and at 31 March.
2. Details: episode-level CIN plan data for each of the above counts (a value of 1 indicates a plan is counted in the CIN plan measure).

The report shows the current position.
