1 Introduction

- 1.1 The Government is committed to raising the status and professionalism of teaching assistants. We want to ensure that the skills and experience of teaching assistants are used to best effect by schools.
- 1.2 Although previous <u>standards for higher level teaching assistants</u> were published in 2006, we know that they cannot be applied to all teaching assistants and that the current school landscape is now very different. More teaching assistants are employed in a wider range of roles in diverse school settings. These schools make their own decisions about how they are employed.
- 1.3 It is timely to establish new standards for all teaching assistants in schools that reflect the diversity of the existing schools landscape and encompass wide ranging responsibilities in a self-improving system. The new standards will take into account the different types of teaching assistant, working at all levels and across all phases of education with pupils. As well as covering all mainstream provision, they will also reflect effective working with pupils who require additional support eg pupils with special educational needs, disabilities and children with medical conditions.

2 Teaching Assistant Standards

- 2.1 This review is a significant step towards a self-improving system within education and gives teaching assistants a genuine opportunity to contribute to reviewing and setting their own professional standards. The aim of the review is to establish a set of standards for teaching assistants that:
 - are unequivocal, clear and easy to understand;
 - can be used to assess the performance of teaching assistants;
 - steer the professional development of teaching assistants at all levels;
 - are designed to inspire confidence in teaching assistants and ensure that schools use their skills and expertise to best effect; and
 - focus primarily on the key elements of their professional relationship with teachers to ensure that all pupils attain the highest possible standards.
- 2.2 The new standards will be designed by a small independent panel chaired by Kate Dethridge . As a first step, the Department for Education is launching this call for evidence on behalf of the expert panel to gather views and evidence from the sector.

2.3 The review group will provide a report including new draft standards to the Secretary of State in the spring.

3. Call for evidence

The expert panel sees this call for evidence as a great opportunity to engage with front line professionals and experts in order to gain useful insight that can inform the expert panel during the process of drafting new standards. The panel wants this review to be open and inclusive to ensure the new standards are as useful as possible for the profession.
