



## Statistical release: EBacc and non-EBacc subject entries and achievement: 2010/11 to 2014/15

This statistical release is being published alongside the Consultation on Implementing the English Baccalaureate. Most of the data and research evidence used in the consultation document is already in the public domain. For transparency and to ensure users have access to all available information, this release contains additional key stage 4 data that was used in the EBacc consultation which has not been published elsewhere.

### Entry and achievement of EBacc pillars

Table 1a shows the time series of pupils at the end of key stage 4 in state-funded schools entering different numbers of the EBacc component pillars.

Table 1b shows, for those who did not enter the full EBacc but entered four of the five component pillars, which EBacc pillars these pupils did not enter, for the 2014/15 cohort.

Table 1c shows, for those who entered the full EBacc and achieved four of the five component pillars, which EBacc pillars these pupils did not achieve, for the 2014/15 cohort.

## Entry to non-EBacc subjects

Table 2 shows the time series for the number of pupils at the end of key stage 4 in all schools and state-funded schools with entries into art subjects<sup>5</sup> and the number and percentage of pupils with an entry into at least one arts subject. A time series between 2009/10 and 2013/14 for all schools was published in July 2015<sup>6</sup>.

1. The English Baccalaureate requires entry into GCSEs from 5 distinct subject areas, or pillars, English, maths, science, a language, and history or geography. Achievement at grade C or or above in each pillar is needed to achieve the measure. 2. State-funded schools include academies, free schools, city technology colleges, further education colleges with provision for 14- to 16-year-olds and state-funded special schools. They exclude independent schools, independent special schools, non-maintained special schools, hospital schools, pupil referral units and alternative provision. Alternative provision includes academy and free school alternative provision.

3. Including entries and achievements by pupils in previous academic years. Early entry policy, under which only a pupil's first attempt at a qualification is counted in performance measures, has been applied to EBacc subjects from 2013/14 and all subjects from 2014/15.

4. Figures for 2014/15 are provisional, all other figures are final.

5. For the purposes of these figures arts subjects include Applied Art and Design, Art and Design, Drama, Media/Film/TV, Music, Dance and Performing Arts. Does not include History of Art and Creative Writing. Dance entries are included in the number of entries to Physical Education in the Statistical First Release and there were 11,982 entries to GCSE Dance in 2015.
