1 September 2016: EHC needs assessments for LDA pupils

From 1 September 2016, learning difficulty assessments (LDAs) will cease to have any legal effect. All young people who continue in further education and training beyond that point, who previously received support as a result of an LDA and who need an education, health and care (EHC) plan, must have an EHC plan. Local authorities will issue an EHC plan after an EHC needs assessment. To avoid disruption, we have updated the High needs funding: operational guide 2016 to 2017 to explain the exceptional circumstances, for a limited time, where we will provide continuing high needs funding for 19- to 25-year-olds.

April 2017: gender pay differences
