The timetable shows the dates by which exam boards have to send their specifications to Ofqual for consideration. As we receive and accredit specifications, we will update the attached table showing the progress.

Number of qualifications accredited

All 26 GCSE subjects have all specifications accredited.

All of the 20 AS and A level subjects have at least 1 specification accredited. 19 of 20 subjects have all specifications accredited.

All of the 44 GCSE specifications have been accredited.
