

About Ofsted

1. The Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills (Ofsted) regulates and inspects to achieve excellence in the care of children and young people and in education and skills for learners of all ages.

Purpose and background to the consultation

- 2. In September 2012, Ofsted introduced an inspection judgement of 'requires improvement' to further education and skills inspections. A provider judged to require improvement is re-inspected within 12 to 24 months of the inspection.
- 3. Since 2013, Ofsted has been carrying out support and challenge visits to providers judged to require improvement, resulting in unpublished letters.¹
- 4. While around 80% of providers are currently good or outstanding, our evidence shows that:
 - too few providers are improving from requires improvement to good
 - overall, the proportion of providers judged to require improvement has increased.
- 5. We feel the time is now right to review our approach to providers that require improvement.
- 6. We are proposing that for providers that are judged to require improvement, instead of carrying out support and challenge visits that result in unpublished letters, we conduct a **single monitoring visit** with a **published report** that has **progress judgements**.
- 7. We are proposing to make this change because:
 - using progress judgements and publishing reports will provide a clearer sense of direction and help providers improve
 - we need to be more transparent in what we do so that learners, apprentices and employers can also see the progress providers are making
 - we want to ensure that our constrained resources are directed to where they will have the most impact.
- 8. Published monitoring visit reports will tell readers:
 - what the provider has achieved since the last inspection and what improvement they still need to make

- show what steps the provider has taken to tackle the weaknesses identified at the previous inspection and how effective these steps have been.
- 9. We are proposing that this single monitoring visit will take place around 7 to 13 months after the inspection at which the provider was judged to require improvement. This will apply to any provider found to require improvement from the beginning of this consultation (10 November 2017), subject to the outcome of this consultation.



The consultation process

- 10. We would like to hear your views on the suggested changes.
- 11. This consultation opens on 10 November 2017 and closes on 22 December 2017.
- 12. Your views will inform how we inspect to check the progress made by further education and skills providers judged to require improvement.
- 13. We will publish a response to the consultation in February 2018.
