national standards, are now available for post-16 learners. We set out in our <u>improving adult basic digital skills consultation response</u>

national standards that meet our qualification eligibility principles would be eligible for adult education budget funding from August 2020. We also confirmed our intention to remove funding from functional skills qualifications in ICT at entry level and level 1. We extended funding approval for existing ICT for Users qualifications for

Students who are already enrolled onto an existing ICT or digital skills qualification prior to the date that funding approval ends will be funded to complete their qualification or to the certification end date.
