School Rebuilding Programme

Published 5 February 2021

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The <u>School Rebuilding Programme was announced in June 2020</u> to carry out major rebuilding and refurbishment projects at school and sixth-form college buildings across England, prioritised according to their condition. The programme works alongside other existing capital funding schemes and programmes.



Current confirmed projects

We announced the first 50 schools in the programme in February 2021.

The <u>first 50 schools were prioritised</u> either because:

- they have buildings of specific construction types that require replacement
- their buildings have the highest condition need, identified in data collected by the department in the <u>Condition Data Collection</u> and verified through collecting additional condition information

Prioritisation of future projects

We plan to publish details of the process for prioritising the next projects later in 2021.

We also plan to consult on the approach to prioritising projects for later rounds in the 10-year programme.

There will be opportunities in future rounds for the bodies responsible for school buildings to submit supplementary information about severe condition need, where it is not fully captured in the Condition Data Collection, to be considered for the programme.

Construction sector suppliers

The Department for Education typically delivers school rebuilding projects using contractors sourced from the DfE construction frameworks:

- 2017 Construction Framework
- Modern Methods of Construction (1) Framework

We are in the process of procuring a replacement framework for the 2017 Construction Framework which expires in November 2021. The Official Journal of the European Union (OJEU) notice was published on 28 December 2020.

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
