What you must tell Ofsted about

You must tell us about:

- an allegation of serious harm or abuse committed either at the premises or elsewhere by people who:
 - live on the premises
 - work on the premises
 - look after children on the premises
- the disqualification of the registered provider, an employee or someone living on the childcare premises (see <u>guidance on how to waive</u> <u>disqualification</u>)
- any significant event that may affect someone's suitability to look after children, or be in regular contact with children (for instance, health changes or involvement with the police or social services)
- events that might affect the condition and safety of the premises or the quality of childcare offered, or lead to ongoing closures (such as a fire or flooding)
- the death of a child while in your care
- a child's <u>serious accident, injury or illness</u> while being looked after, including food poisoning affecting at least 2 children

Things you do not need to tell us about

You do not need to tell us about:

- minor injuries
- general hospital appointments
- routine treatments by a doctor
- any confirmed case of COVID-19 affecting a child or member of staff
- your setting closing only for a day or two, as long as there's no significant effect on how you provide childcare

Minor injuries include:

- sprains, strains and bruising
- cuts and grazes
- wound infections
- insect and animal bites
