Key Findings

This bulletin covers all National Vocational Qualifications (NVQ), Vocationally-Related Qualifications (VRQ), Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF) qualifications and Occupational Qualifications (OQ), at all levels. For the purposes of this bulletin these four types are considered to be 'Vocational Qualifications'. The qualification type is that recorded in the Register of Regulated Qualifications; please see the Glossary for further details. There is some overlap between the figures in this bulletin and the Higher Qualifications Quarterly which covers all qualifications at Level 4 and above.

National Vocational Qualifications (NVQ)

In Apr-Jun 2011, 128,550 NVQ achievements were recorded, a decrease of 40 per cent from the same quarter of the previous year. These achievements covered 938 different qualifications, offered by 39 different awarding organisations. The decline in achievements reflects in part the restructuring of some qualifications, which have then been recoded as QCF type. Please note: these figures refer to qualifications coded as NVQ type, and do not include 'NVQs' on the QCF.

The NVQ with the greatest number of achievements was the City & Guilds (C&G) Level 2 NVQ in Health and Social Care, which recorded 7,750 achievements. The awarding organisation that recorded the most NVQ achievements was C&G, with 52,250 achievements (41 per cent of all NVQ achievements).

Vocationally Related Qualifications (VRQ)

Apr-Jun 2011, 386,900 VRQ achievements were recorded, a decrease of 47 per cent from the same quarter of the previous year. These achievements covered 1093 different qualifications, offered by 69 different awarding organisations. The decline in achievements reflects in part the restructuring of some qualifications, which have then been recoded as QCF type. Please note: these figures refer to qualifications coded as VRQ type, and do not include any qualifications on the QCF.

The VRQ with the greatest number of achievements was the OCR Level 2 National First Award in ICT, which recorded 57,050 achievements. The awarding organisation that recorded the most VRQ achievements was OCR, with 140,800 achievements (39 per cent of all VRQ achievements).

Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF) qualifications

Apr-Jun 2011, 713,400 QCF achievements were recorded; more than triple the figure for the same quarter of the previous year (202,600). These achievements covered 3,011 different qualifications, offered by 89 different awarding organisations. Please

note: these figures refer to full qualifications, not units. The increase in achievement numbers reflects the restructuring of many qualifications, which have been put onto the QCF. This is a credit-based framework which enables learners to accumulate and transfer credit towards a regulated qualification.

The QCF qualification with the greatest number of achievements was the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health (CIEH) Level 2 award in Food Safety in Catering with 51,400 achievements. The two awarding organisations that recorded the most QCF achievements were Pearson Education Ltd (Edexcel) and City and Guilds, each with 92,300 achievements (each having 13 per cent of all QCF achievements).

Occupational Qualifications (OQ)

Apr-Jun 2011, 3,600 Occupational Qualification achievements were recorded; this was a decrease of 36 per cent from the same quarter of the previous year. These achievements covered 58 different qualifications, offered by 17 different awarding organisations. Please note: these figures refer to qualifications coded as OQ type, and do not include any qualifications on the QCF.

The Occupational Qualification with the greatest number of achievements was the C&G Level 3 Award in Assessing Candidates Using a Range of Methods, which recorded 950 achievements. The awarding organisation that recorded the most Occupational Qualification achievements was C&G, with 1,350 achievements (38 per cent of all OQ achievements).

Introduction

This statistical bulletin is published by the regulator for vocational qualifications in England and Northern Ireland. It presents data on achievements for regulated Vocational Qualifications in England, Wales and Northern Ireland during the Apr-Jun 2011 quarter.

This bulletin is one of a suite of three publications presenting quarterly data on achievements for regulated qualifications, excluding GCSEs, GCEs¹ and Diplomas. The other two bulletins are:

- Higher Qualifications Quarterly (qualifications at Level 4 and above)
- Supplemental Qualifications Quarterly (covers Entry to Level 3 for Basic Skills, Entry Level, ESOL, Free-Standing Mathematics Qualifications, Functional Skills, Key Skills and Other General qualifications)

All awarding organisations submit data to Ofqual each quarter on the number of achievements for regulated qualifications (excluding GCSE and GCE) during the quarter. Achievements are recorded in the quarter during which the final certificate is issued. This bulletin presents this data, giving information on number of achievements recorded by awarding organisations, and the sector subject area, qualification type and level of achievements. All regulated qualifications are included, regardless of age of learner, centre type and funding status of the qualification.

Geographical coverage: This bulletin covers the regulated qualifications of all recognised awarding organisations in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. Only one figure for the total number of achievements for each qualification is available, so it is not currently possible to present the data at country level.

Qualification type: At the point of accreditation, regulated qualifications are allocated to one of 18 qualification types, which are used to classify qualifications in this bulletin. It is recognised that this is not currently an ideal classification system, as very similar qualifications may appear under different types e.g. NVQ and QCF, and some qualifications are miscoded. We are investigating how this situation might be resolved in the future.

Revisions: Once published, data on the number of achievements for any qualification are not usually subject to revision. Data may be revised in subsequent bulletins due to late-received data or if an error is identified. Qualifications may also be re-

categorised to a different type, level, sector subject area or awarding organisation. In some cases, this may result in previous data being amended to reflect the new categorisation.

In this bulletin some figures have been revised since the first quarter 2011 bulletin. These were due to a late submission of data received from one awarding organisation, a duplicate qualification found in a correction file from one awarding organisation and a historical update from one awarding organisation.

Completeness of the data: Data is sent to Ofqual every quarter by each awarding organisation. Any awarding organisation that does not return a complete set of data within the collection period is contacted to ensure the data is as complete as possible. For this quarter data was received from all but one awarding organisation, the Accrediting and Assessment Bureau for Post-Secondary Schools.

Figures in the commentary for the numbers of achievements recorded are rounded to the nearest fifty. This reflects the inaccuracies inherent in any large-scale data collection.

Due to seasonal variation in the number of achievements over the year, comparisons in this bulletin are only made to data in the same quarter of the previous year.

In this bulletin quarter numbers in the charts refer to calendar quarters; thus Q1 refers to January to March, Q2: April to June, Q3: July to September and Q4: October to December.

Achievements this quarter

To provide an overall perspective on achievements during the latest quarter, this section presents figures for all qualifications types, except general and Diploma types. Further details for types not included in this bulletin can be found in the companion bulletins on Vocational and Supplemental qualifications.

In April to June 2011 the total number of achievements across qualification types was as follows (with April to June 2010 shown for comparison):

From the table above we can see the impact of qualifications being restructured into QCFs with a three fold increase in the number of achievements. We also see a six fold increase in Functional Skills, which is replacing Key Skills, which has decline of 87,700 achievements (40%). With qualifications being restructured onto QCF we see a decline in all other qualification types, with the largest decreases in achievements reported to VRQs (47%), ESOL (53%), Higher Level (42%), NVQ's (40%) and Occupational Qualifications (36%).

Those with a rather smaller decline were Other General (32% decrease), Basic Skills (29%) and Entry Level (26% decrease)

In April to June 2011 the 20 qualifications with the highest numbers of achievements across all qualification types, were as follows:



Vocational Qualifications Quarterly: April to June 2011

Regulated Vocational Qualifications

There are currently 12,460 available regulated Vocational Qualifications i.e. qualifications that have not yet passed their certification end date and so are available to be awarded. These comprise 8,544 QCF qualifications (69 per cent of available Vocational Qualifications), 2,296 VRQs (18 per cent), 1,530 NVQs (12 per cent) and 90 Occupational Qualifications (1 per cent) (see figure 1 and table 1).

Figure 1: Number of available regulated Vocational Qualifications, per quarter, Apr-June 2006 to Apr-Jun 2011



We can see from Figure 1, the continual growth of QCF which has been growing at a consistent pace since quarter 3, 2009. The NVQs, VRQs and OQs are stable as although QCFs are replacing these qualifications there will be a duplication of qualifications available until the old qualifications finish certificating. Over time we expect the availability of each of these qualification types to decline.

During the last quarter 955 new Vocational Qualifications were added to the list of available regulated qualifications. These included 954 QCF qualifications and one VRQ.

During the last quarter, five existing Vocational Qualifications were re-categorised to a different sector subject area (two from Business, Admin and Law to Health and Public Service, one from Education and Training to Health and Public Service and Two from Engineering and Manufacturing to Construction, Planning and the Build Environment). During the last quarter 332 qualifications transferred from the Hospitality Awarding Body and the National Proficiency Tests Council to City and Guilds. Thames Valley University changed its name to University of West London Qualifications, which affected 79 Vocational Qualifications, and 2 qualifications changed from CIOB/CIH to CIH.

During the last quarter, no Vocational Qualifications were re-categorised to a different level or changed qualification type.

National Vocational Qualifications (NVQ)





Figure 2: Total number of NVQ achievements, per quarter, Apr-June 2006 to Apr-Jun 2011

(see figures 2-7 and tables 1-6)

Please note: these figures refer to qualifications coded as NVQ type, and do not include 'NVQs' on the QCF.

National Vocational Qualifications are work related, competence-based qualifications that cover a broad range of occupations and are delivered in a workplace setting. NVQs are made up of units taken from the National Occupational Standards (NOS), which defines the knowledge, understanding and competence required to perform a particular job-related role. The standards for NVQs are designed and set by the appropriate Sector Skills Council or sector body.

In Apr-Jun 2011, 128,550 NVQ achievements were recorded at all levels, a decrease of 40 per cent from the same quarter of 2010 (see figure 2 and table 2). There is a downward trend in NVQ achievements since April-June 2010 (figure 2). This decrease partly reflects the restructuring of some qualifications, which have then been recoded as QCF type. In addition we can see that there is a seasonal spike in quarter 3 which is in line with the academic year and the awarding of NVQ's to learners in further education.

These achievements covered 938 different qualifications (a slight decrease from 954 in the last quarter), offered by 36 different awarding organisations. In Apr-Jun 2011 NVQs represented 12 per cent of available Vocational Qualifications and 10 per cent of achievements.

We can see in Figure 2 that there is a seasonal spike

The NVQ with the greatest number of achievements was the C&G Level 2 NVQ in Health and Social Care, with 7,750 achievements. The 40 NVQs with the greatest number of achievements are shown in table 3, and Figure 3 shows the five year trend for the five NVQs with the highest number of achievements in Apr-Jun 2011.

In Figure 3, it is interesting to see that the top 5 NVQs are not generally in decline as seen for the NVQ category. This is due to the fact that individual qualifications become restructured to QCF type and therefore until they are restructured they will continue to certificate.





Figure 4: NVQ achievements, by awarding organisation, Apr-Jun 2011

The awarding organisation that recorded the highest number of achievements for NVQs was City & Guilds (C&G), with 52,300 achievements (41 per cent of all NVQ achievements). Figures for all awarding organisations are shown in Table 4, which also shows the corresponding figures for the same quarter of the previous year. The awarding organisations with the most achievements are shown in Figure 4, and Figure 5 shows the five year trend for the five awarding organisations that recorded the greatest number of achievements in Apr-Jun 2011. These five represent 83% of all NVQ achievements in Apr-Jun 2011. In Figure 5 the downward trend since July-September 2010 can be seen for C&G, Edexcel and OCR.




Figure 6: NVQ achievements, by sector subject area, Apr-Jun 2011

Regulated qualifications are allocated to one of 15 Sector Subject Area (SSA) codes; (see the glossary for further details). The sector subject area which recorded the highest number of achievements for NVQs was Health, Public Services and Care, with 45,000 achievements, representing 35 per cent of NVQs in Apr-Jun 2011. The second largest area was Engineering and Manufacturing Technologies with 26,600 achievements, representing 21 per cent of NVQ achievements (see Figure 6 and Table 5).




Figure 7: NVQ achievements, by level, Apr-Jun 2011

The majority of NVQ achievements were at Level 2, with 77,850 achievements, representing 60 per cent of NVQ achievements in Apr-Jun 2011 (see figure 7 and table 6).

Vocationally Related Qualifications (VRQ) (see figures 8-13 and tables 1-2, 7-10)


Please note: these figures refer to qualifications coded as VRQ type, and do not include any qualifications on the QCF.

Vocationally Related Qualifications are work-related, competence-based qualifications designed to provide learners with the skills and knowledge needed to do a job. They are related to employment but, unlike NVQs, do not necessarily require a work placement and are not purely based on the National Occupational Standards (NOS).

In Apr-Jun 2011, 386,900 VRQ achievements were recorded at all levels, a decrease of 47 per cent from the same quarter of 2010 (see figure 8 and table 2). There is a downward trend that is seen from Quarter 4 2010 (October-December), and this is also the first Apr-Jun quarter that has seen a year on year decline since quarter 4 of 2005. This decrease partly reflects the restructuring of some qualifications, which have then been recoded as QCF type.


The VRQ achievements covered 1093 different qualifications (1000 in the last quarter), offered by 80 different awarding organisations. In Apr-Jun 2011 VRQs represented 18 per cent of available Vocational Qualifications and 31 per cent of achievements.

The VRQ with the greatest number of achievements was the OCR Level 2 National First Award in ICT, with 57,050 achievements. The 40 VRQs with the greatest numbers of achievements are shown in Table 7, and Figure 9 shows the five year trend for the five VRQs with the highest number of achievements in Apr-Jun 2011.





Figure 10: VRQ achievements, by awarding organisation, Apr-Jun 2011

The awarding organisation that recorded the highest number of achievements for VRQs was OCR, with 140,800 achievements (36 per cent of all VRQ achievements). Figures for the 40 awarding organisations with the greatest numbers of achievements are shown in Table 8, which also shows the corresponding figures for the same quarter of the previous year. The awarding organisations with the highest numbers of achievements are shown in Figure 10, and Figure 11 shows the five year trend for the five awarding organisations that recorded the highest number of achievements in Apr-Jun 2011.




Figure 12: VRQ achievements, by sector subject area, Apr-Jun 2011

The sector subject area which recorded the highest number of achievements for VRQs was Information and Communication Technology, with 128,900 achievements, representing 33 per cent of VRQs in Apr-Jun 2011 (see figure 12 and table 9).




Figure 13: VRQ achievements, by level, Apr-Jun 2011

The majority of VRQ achievements were at Level 2, with 299,550 achievements, representing 78 per cent of VRQ achievements in Apr-Jun 2011 (see Figure 13 and Table 10).

Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF)



Please note: these figures refer to full qualifications, not units.

The Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF) is a credit-based framework which enables learners to accumulate and transfer credit towards a regulated qualification. It is designed to provide learners, learning providers and employers with an inclusive and flexible regulated qualifications framework containing units and qualifications that recognise the widest possible range of quality-assured learner achievements. The QCF introduces a standard currency for learner achievement across the qualifications systems through the award of credit. One credit is equivalent to 10 hours of learning. There are three sizes of QCF qualification: award, certificate or diploma. Awards consist of 1-12 credits, certificates: 13-36 credits, and diplomas: 37 or more credits.

In Apr-Jun 2011, 713,400 QCF achievements were recorded, an increase of 252 per cent from the same quarter of the previous year (see Table 2 and Figure 14). This increase reflects the restructuring of many qualifications, which have then been put onto the QCF. These achievements covered 3011 different qualifications (a huge increase from 2028 in the last quarter), offered by 78 different awarding organisations. In Apr-Jun 2011 QCF qualifications represented 69 per cent of available Vocational Qualifications and 58 per cent of achievements.

The QCF qualification with the greatest number of achievements was the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health (CIEH) Level 2 Award in Food Safety in Catering, with 51,400 achievements. This qualification was a VRQ in the same quarter during the previous year and has now restructured onto QCF. The 40 QCF qualifications with the greatest numbers of achievements are shown in Table 11.




Figure 15: QCF achievements, by awarding organisation, Apr-Jun 2011

This quarter (after rounding) both City and Guilds and Pearson Education Ltd. (Edexcel) recorded the highest number of QCF achievements, with 92,300 awards each (which equates to 13 per cent of all QCF achievements each). Figures for the 40 awarding organisations with the greatest numbers of achievements are shown in Table 12, which also shows the corresponding figures for the same quarter of the previous year. The awarding organisations with the greatest number of achievements are shown in Figure 15.





Figure 16: QCF achievements, by sector subject area, Apr-Jun 2011

The sector subject area which recorded the greatest number of achievements for QCF qualifications was Retail and Commercial Enterprise, with 136,475 achievements, representing 19 per cent of QCFs in Apr-Jun 2011 (see Figure 16 and Table 13).

The most common level for QCF achievements was Level 2, with 397,400 achievements, representing 56 per cent of QCF achievements in Apr-Jun 2011 (see Figure 17 and Table 14).




Figure 18: QCF achievements, by size, Apr-Jun 2011

The most common size for QCF achievements was Award (credit value of 1 to 12, corresponding to 10 to 120 hours of learning), with 446,000 achievements, representing 63 per cent of QCF achievements in Apr-Jun 2011 (a decrease from 74 per cent in Jan-Mar 2011). See Figure 18 and Table 15.


Occupational Qualifications (OQ) (see figures 19-21 and tables 1-2,16-19)

Please note: these figures refer to qualifications coded as OQ type, and do not include any qualifications on the QCF.

Occupational Qualifications (OQ) develop with the skills and capabilities needed for a particular occupation or job. Skills are developed to an industry standard and to a level of competence needed to use them in a workplace. Occupational Qualifications are directly based on the National Occupational Standards (NOS) and are assessed in a workplace environment, but are not NVQs.

In Apr-Jun 2011, 3,600 Occupational Qualification achievements were recorded at all levels, a decrease of 36 per cent from the same quarter of the previous year (see Table 2 and Figure 19). These achievements covered 58 different qualifications (compared to 54 in the last quarter), offered by 16 different awarding organisations. In Apr-Jun 2011 OQs represented less than 0.7 per cent of available Vocational Qualifications and 0.3 per cent of achievements.

Figure 19: Total number of OQ achievements, per quarter, Apr-Jun 2006 to Apr-Jun 2011




The Occupational Qualification with the greatest number of achievements was the C&G Level 3 Award in Assessing Candidates Using a Range of Methods, with 950 achievements. The 30 Occupational Qualifications with the greatest number of achievements are shown in Table 16.

The awarding organisation that recorded the highest number of achievements for Occupational Qualifications was C&G, with 1,350 achievements (38 per cent of all

OQ achievements). Figures for all awarding organisations are shown in Table 17, which also shows the corresponding figures for the same quarter of the previous year. The awarding organisations with the highest number of achievements are shown in Figure 20.

The sector subject area which recorded the highest number of achievements for Occupational Qualifications was Education and Training, with 3,100 achievements, representing 87 per cent of OQs in Apr-Jun 2011 (Table 18).

The majority of Occupational Qualification achievements were at Level 3, with 2,500 achievements, representing 69 per cent of OQ achievements in Apr-Jun 2011 (see Figure 22 and Table 19).




Figure 21: Occupational Qualification achievements, by Level, Apr-Jun 2011
