### The Assembly Learning Grant (Further Education) Regulations 2009

#### Summary

The Welsh Ministers are required to enact the appropriate secondary legislation on the form of the Assembly Learning Grant (Further Education) Regulations 2009 for each academic year.

This scheme aims to provide guaranteed financial support for eligible students in further education.

Enclosed is a schedule setting out the policy changes and technical amendments to the existing legislation which are proposed for the 2008/09 academic year.

Actual draft regulations have not been enclosed and changes to the existing Regulations have been kept to an absolute minimum.

## THE ASSEMBLY LEARNING GRANT (FURTHER EDUCATION) REGULATIONS 2009: CHANGES

#### **Background**

- 1. The Assembly is required to enact appropriate secondary legislation in the form of the Assembly learning Grant (Further education) Regulations for each academic year.
- 2. The draft The Assembly Learning Grant (Further Education) Regulations 2009 provide support for students ordinarily resident in Wales taking designated further education courses in academic year 2009/10.

#### Student Support Changes for 2009/10

- 3. The Assembly Learning Grant Further Education Scheme was first introduced in September 2002 with the aim of providing guaranteed financial support for the least well off eligible students in further education. The support is a means tested grant and is available to eligible students wherever they study in the United Kingdom.
- 4. The regulations mirror the scheme in 2008/09. There are no principle policy changes to the scheme apart from technical changes included within the roll-over and enhancements relating to systems used to administer the scheme. This also includes the annual up-rating of the income thresholds increasing in line with the retail price index (RPI), the effect of the 2.6% up-rating is reflected in the table below. No other changes are proposed.
