Schools in England



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INTRODUCTION

This new edition of "Statistics of Education, Schools in England" includes school data for the academic year 2002/03, which was collected in January 2003. This is the latest in a series of volumes produced annually and its value is as the main source of school statistics for England as a whole, allowing comparisons to be made over time.

Most of the school information in this volume is from the Annual Schools' Census (ASC) which is undertaken in January each year. From January 2002 onwards maintained primary, secondary and special schools, as well as city technology colleges, have reported data at an individual pupil level. In January 2003 the pupil level coverage expanded to include non-maintained special schools and academies. Whilst the collection of the Pupil Level Annual Schools' Census (PLASC) for these schools has been very successful, it is possible that some discontinuity in the time series data has resulted from the change, though this is not thought to be significant.

The availability of pupil level data means that there are now more ways in which the information can be analysed and manipulated. This volume sees the introduction of three new tables as a result of this: tables 49, 50 and 52. Key figures from this survey have already been published in a series of Statistical First Releases. More comprehensive analyses of these figures will be published in two Bulletins between November 2003 and December 2003 in the Statistics of Education series (see paragraph 50 of the Explanatory Notes 'Related Publications').

Many of the tables provide information by Government Office Region (GOR). Local Authority breakdowns will be available separately from the DfES and on the website www.dfes.gov.uk/statistics. Explanation of the definitions and categories used in this volume are given in the "Explanatory Notes" section, together with details of how to obtain further information.

SUMMARY OF MAIN STATISTICS

Pupils

 In January 2003 there were 8.4 million pupils in 25,500 maintained and independent schools in England. The total number of school pupils is affected by demographic trends and so varies from year to year (Table 1). 92 per cent of pupils were taught in maintained nursery, primary and secondary schools, 7 per cent of pupils attended independent schools and 1 per cent went to maintained and nonmaintained special schools (Table 3).

School Workforce

- There were 420,000 full-time equivalent qualified teachers employed in maintained nursery, primary and secondary schools in January 2003 (Table 7a).
- In January 2003 there were over 225,000 fulltime equivalent support staff in maintained nursery, primary, secondary, special schools and pupil referral units. This compares to nearly 144,000 in January 1998 (Table 28).

Pupil:Teacher Ratios

- In January 2003, there were 17.9 pupils for every teacher (including all teachers employed by LEAs) in maintained nursery, primary and secondary schools (Table 7a), a slight reduction from 18.0 in January 2002.
- The pupil:teacher ratio does vary from region to region. A comparison of Government Office Regions (GORs) shows that North East has the lowest pupil:teacher ratios for primary schools and Inner London has the lowest pupil:teacher ratios for secondary schools (Table 7a).
- Pupil:teacher ratios in independent and special schools in England were 9.7 and 6.4 respectively in January 2003 (Table 7b).

School meals

 As at January 2003, 16.8 per cent of all pupils in maintained nursery and primary schools were known to be eligible for free school meals.
 Equivalent percentages for secondary and special schools are 14.5 per cent and 35.3 per cent respectively (Tables 13,14 & 37).

• Class Sizes

 The number of pupils in key stage 1 classes of 31 or more pupils taught by one teacher in January 2003 was 16,400 or 1.1 per cent (Table 17b).

• Special Educational Needs

- 251,000 pupils, some 3 per cent of all pupils, had statements of special educational needs (Table 32).
- In January 2003, 60 per cent of pupils with statements were placed in maintained mainstream schools (nursery, primary and

secondary), 35 per cent in either maintained special schools or pupil referral units (PRUs), and 5 per cent in either independent or non-maintained special schools (Table 33a).

• Minority Ethnic Pupils

- In maintained primary and secondary schools, 13.6 per cent of pupils aged above compulsory school age were classified as belonging to a non-white ethnic group (Table 47).
- The first language of 10.5 per cent of primary school pupils and 8.8 per cent of secondary school pupils was known or believed to be other than English (Table 51).

Permanent Exclusions

 There were 9,535 permanent exclusions from primary, secondary and special schools in 2001/02, an increase of some 400 compared with 2000/01 (Table 53).

• Admission Appeals

 94,900 appeals were lodged by parents against the non-admission of their children for 2001/02; the comparable figure for the previous year was 90,700 (Table 55).

Explanatory Notes

MAIN CATEGORIES OF SCHOOL

1 Schools may be divided administratively and financially into the following broad categories:

i Mainstream state schools

Under the School Standards and Framework Act 1998, four new categories: Community, Foundation, Voluntary Controlled and Voluntary Aided replaced from 1 September 1999 the previous five categories of mainstream state school: county, controlled, special agreement, aided and grant-maintained (GM). Schools in all the four categories have a lot in common. They work in partnership with other schools and with local education authorities (LEAs), and they receive funding from LEAs. But each category also has its own characteristics.

Community schools Community schools are very similar to former county schools. The LEA employs the school's staff, owns the school's land and buildings and has primary responsibility for deciding the arrangements for admitting pupils.

Foundation schools At Foundation schools, the governing body employ the school's staff and have primary responsibility for admission arrangements. The school's land and buildings are owned by the governing body or by a charitable foundation.

Voluntary Aided schools Voluntary Aided schools are similar to former aided schools. The governing body employ the school's staff and have primary responsibility for admission arrangements. The school's land and buildings are normally owned by a charitable foundation. The governing body contribute towards the capital costs of running the school.

Voluntary Controlled schools Voluntary Controlled schools are very similar to former controlled schools. The LEA employ the school's staff and have primary responsibility for admission arrangements. The school's land and buildings are normally owned by a charitable foundation.

ii Direct grant schools.

The governing bodies of these schools are assisted by departmental grants, and a proportion of the pupils attending them do so free or under an arrangement by which local education authorities meet tuition fees. From October 1980 these schools, with the exception of three nursery schools, (one of which has subsequently closed) were re-classified as independent schools. (See paragraph 12 below.)

iii Independent schools.

These are schools registered under Section 465 of the Education Act 1996. (See paragraph 11 below.)

iv City Technology Colleges.

These take the form of a charitable company limited by guarantee. The sponsors constitute an educational trust and will own or lease the college and appoint their representatives to the Board of Governors. The members of a CTC will consist of nominees of the sponsoring company and the Secretary of State. When a CTC is opened it will be registered as an independent school and is included in the independent schools tables.

v Academies.

These are all ability schools established by sponsors from business, faith or voluntary groups working in highly innovative partnerships with central Government and local education partners. Sponsors and the Department for Education and Skills (DfES) provide the capital costs for the Academy. Running costs are met in full by the DfES. Each Academy will be set up as a company limited by guarantee with charitable status and will have a board of governors responsible for the governance and strategic leadership of the school.

vi Non-Maintained schools.

Non-maintained schools are run by voluntary bodies; they may receive some grant from the Department for capital work and for equipment, but their current expenditure is met primarily from the fees charged to the local education authorities for pupils placed in the schools.

MAIN TYPES OF SCHOOL

Nursery Schools

2 These provide education primarily for children below compulsory school age, i.e. under 5.

Primary Schools

- **3** Primary schools consist mainly of *infant schools* for children aged 5 to 7, *junior schools* for those aged 7 to 11 and *junior and infant* schools for both age groups.
- **4** In addition, *first schools* cater for ages from 5 to 8, 9 or 10. They are the first stage of a three-tier (first, middle and secondary) school system.
- 5 Many primary schools provide 'nursery' classes for children under 5. A 'nursery' class is one which includes amongst its staff a qualified nursery assistant.

Middle Schools

6 Middle schools take children from first schools and generally lead on, in turn, to comprehensive upper schools. They cover varying age ranges between 8 and 14. Depending on their individual age range they are deemed either primary or secondary and are counted accordingly in many statistics of primary, secondary and (within secondary) comprehensive schools.

Secondary Schools

- 7 Secondary education is provided mainly in three types of school, the *secondary modern*, the *secondary grammar* and the *comprehensive school*.
- **8** There are also small and decreasing numbers of *technical schools*.
- **9** Schools which do not fall into any of the categories already mentioned are classified as *other secondary schools*.
- 10 With effect from 1 April 1993 Sixth Form Colleges were no longer classified as schools but come under the control of the Further Education Funding Council. They are not, therefore, included in the statistics in this volume for 1994 onwards.

Independent Schools

- 11 An independent school is legally defined as any institution providing full time education for five or more pupils of compulsory school age which is not maintained by a local education authority nor a non maintained special school. All independent schools are initially inspected by HMI from Ofsted.

 Approximately just over half of all independent schools choose to belong to the professional associations constituting the Independent Schools Council (ISC). Since 1999, ISC schools have usually been inspected by the Independent Schools Inspectorate (ISI) on behalf of the Department.
- 12 Since January 1980, figures for independent schools have included direct grant schools.

Special Schools

- 13 Special schools, both day and boarding, provide education for children with special educational needs who cannot be educated satisfactorily in an ordinary school.
- **14** Maintained special schools are run by local education authorities who pay all the expenses of maintenance.
- 15 Non-maintained special schools are run by voluntary bodies; they may receive some grant from the Department for capital work and for equipment, but their current expenditure is met primarily from the fees charged to the local education authorities for pupils placed in the schools.

- 16 General hospital schools provide education for children who are spending a period in hospital. In previous years some of these children remained on the registers of their usual school and were, therefore, counted twice. Since 1991 only those children who were taken off the register of their usual schools whilst in the hospital have been recorded, thus avoiding double counting.
- 17 In addition to special schools, provision is also made for pupils with special educational needs to attend special classes in maintained nursery, primary, middle and secondary schools.
- 18 Special schools also provide for Dually Registered pupils. These are pupils whose lesson time, during the week, is split between a mainstream primary or secondary school and a special school. Dually registered pupils are included in the figures for the school where their main registration is held (usually where they spend the majority of their time) to avoid double counting.
- 19 Some independent schools provide education wholly or mainly for pupils with special educational needs. These schools are not included with special schools in the tables but are included with independent schools.

City Technology Colleges

20 From January 1989, CTCs are included in relevant independent schools' tables.

Academies

21 This is the first year for which data on Academies are available. Figures are included in the relevant independent schools' tables.

AGE OF PUPILS

22 Up to January 1979 the age groups of pupils corresponded to the calendar year birth groups (ie ages at previous 31 December). Since January 1980, the age groups have corresponded with ages at the beginning of the school year (ie ages at the previous 31 August). A change in the method of classifying pupils' ages was made because pupils are normally promoted from maintained primary schools to secondary schools, and move through the secondary school system, according to their ages on 31 August.

TEACHERS AND NURSERY STAFF

- 23 The figures for teachers are derived from returns submitted by individual schools at the same time as the count of pupils that is in January of each year; they refer to teachers in post at the date of the return, including supply and relief teachers filling vacant posts, but excluding unfilled vacancies.
- **24** Prior to 1971 published figures for maintained primary, middle and secondary schools referred to all

teaching staff. However, since 1971 figures have distinguished between *qualified teachers* and *other teaching staff* (see paragraphs 25 and 26).

- **25** Qualified teachers are those who have been awarded qualified teacher status (QTS) following the successful completion of an approved course of initial teacher training or via an alternative route.
- **26** Other teaching staff includes:
- i Teachers not recognised as qualified (any person who is not qualified and not on any scheme leading to Qualified Teacher Status).
- ii Teachers on schemes leading to Qualified Teacher Status (a person who is either waiting to start an ITT course for which they have been accepted, is currently undertaking an ITT course, or has completed an ITT course but not yet been awarded QTS).
- **27** *Nursery staff* are persons appointed to help teachers in charge of nursery classes in addition to the teaching complement. They fall into two categories:
- i Nursery assistants (persons who hold the certificate of the National Nursery Examination Board (NNEB) or some equivalent qualification, or have completed a similar course, or persons employed exceptionally);
- **ii** NNEB students (who help part time in nursery classes as part of their course).

The equivalent of at least one full-time nursery assistant or two NNEB students should be appointed to each nursery class.

- 28 Part-time teachers are counted once for each school in which they teach. For the purpose of reckoning the full-time equivalent (FTE) of part-time (PT) teachers, each teacher's part-time service is evaluated as a proportion of a full school week. Following the change in Teachers Pay and Conditions with effect from 1 August 1987 the FTE of PT qualified teachers in schools in 1988 has been calculated using the denominator of 32.5, this being taken as the average directed hours per week of a full-time teacher. This compares with the figure of 25 used previously. The FTE of part-time teachers in independent schools has been calculated using the denominator of 26, as in previous years for independent schools. FTE of support staff has been calculated using the denominator of 37, except for nursery assistants where a denominator of 32.5 has been used.
- 29 The pupil:teacher ratio within schools is the ratio of all pupils on the school registers (counting each part-time pupil as 0.5) to all qualified teachers (including the FTE of part-time teachers) employed in the schools on the day of the annual count. The pupil:teacher ratio relates FTE pupil numbers to FTE qualified teacher numbers. Teachers absent for long periods or seconded to

other duties are excluded from calculations of pupil:teacher ratios although their replacements – provided they are qualified teachers – are included. Since 1971 the ratios for maintained primary, middle and secondary schools have taken account of qualified teachers only; since 1974 the ratios for maintained and direct grant nursery schools and special schools have been calculated similarly.

30 This volume shows revised figures for the pupil:teacher ratio in independent schools and the full-time equivalent number of teachers in independent schools in 2002. Due to a coding error in 2002 the full-time equivalent number of part time teachers in independent schools was under reported in published figures. Revised figures are given in Table 1b and Table 46.

PUPILS UNDER FIVE

- **31** *Nursery classes:* These are classes in maintained primary schools that have been designated as nursery classes. Such classes normally include amongst their staff at least one qualified nursery assistant in addition to a qualified teacher.
- **32** *Number of maintained primary schools:* The figures quoted give the number of maintained primary schools which have designated nursery classes not the total number of primary schools in England.
- **33** Staffing of maintained nursery schools and nursery classes: The number of staff includes the full-time equivalent number of part-time staff. The School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document has, since 1987, required a full-time teacher to be available to undertake professional duties assigned to him or her by the head teacher for 1265 hours allocated reasonably throughout a working year of 195 days. The average "directed" hours per week of part-time teachers are converted to full-time equivalent teacher numbers by dividing by 32.5. This conversion factor is derived by dividing 1265 (directed hours per year) by 195 (working days per year) and multiplying by 5 (working days per week). This compares with the figure of 25 used previously to convert part-time teacher hours to full time equivalent teacher numbers.

Teaching staff refers to all qualified and other teaching staff actually employed in maintained nursery schools together with the qualified teachers and other teaching staff in maintained primary schools deployed to teach in designated nursery classes.

Adult staff includes all teaching staff together with nursery assistants in maintained nursery schools and nursery assistants in maintained primary schools deployed for service in designated nursery classes. Other categories of support staff are excluded.

Pupil:staff ratios relate the full-time equivalent numbers of teaching staff and adult staff to the total

numbers of pupils in maintained nursery schools and designated nursery classes in maintained primary schools regardless of age and count each part-time pupil as 0.5 full-time equivalents. The ratios so calculated do not necessarily reflect the actual deployment of staff in any particular school or class nor the size of classes in which pupils are taught.

Revised figures: Due to a coding error in 2002 the termly breakdown of pupils aged 3 and 4 was incorrect when previously published although the overall number of pupils aged 3 and 4 remains unchanged. Revised figures are shown in Table 29.

SCHOOL MEALS

- 34 Information is collected for the numbers of full and part time pupils (up to and including and above minimum school leaving age) on each schools' register known to be eligible for a free school meal and those who took a free school meal. In 2003 information on the number of boarding pupils known to be eligible for free school meals was collected for the first time from maintained primary, secondary and all special schools. The coverage of tables 13, 14, 15 and 37 has therefore changed to include boarding pupils as well as solely and dually registered pupils.
- 35 In previous years, the numbers eligible for a free school meal were those pupils who had or whose parents had, satisfied the relevant authority that they were receiving Income Support or income based Jobseekers Allowance or support provided under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999. For the 2001 census, this definition was modified to only include pupils where parents had indicated that they wished their child to have a free meal and had confirmed benefit receipt with the LEA or school.

SIZES OF CLASSES

- **36** In tables 17, 18 and 19 information is given for classes or groups of pupils being taught together at a particular point in the school time-table. This information has been obtained from each school for one selected period on the day of enumeration (the third Thursday in January).
- 37 Primary and middle schools are sub-divided into three groups of equal size and the selected periods are those occurring one hour after the start of morning school, one hour before the end of morning school and one hour after the start of afternoon school. Secondary schools are sub-divided into five groups of equal size, and these groups make returns in respect of the lst, 3rd, 4th, 5th and last periods of the day respectively.
- **38** At any selected period in the time-table there are some large teaching groups assembled for special purposes (physical education, religious instruction, choir practice, etc), mainly within the charge of two or more teachers.

39 The pupil figures do not include pupils engaged in private study, pupils on work experience, pupils attending courses at Further Education Colleges or pupils attending courses at other schools or establishments during the selected period.

CHANGES TO CODING FRAMEWORK

- **40 Part-time Pupils** These are pupils who do not attend school both morning and afternoon at least five days a week. They are counted in full, except when used to derive staffing ratios when each part-time pupil is counted as 0.5 full-time equivalents. In previous years part-time attendance was collected only for pupils aged under 5. However in 2003 a part-time indicator was allowable for pupils of all ages in maintained primary, secondary and all special schools.
- 41 Special Educational Needs The new SEN code of practice came into force in January 2002 and introduced new codes for recording SEN status which replaced the SEN stage codes used previously. In 2002 and 2003 both the new and old SEN codes were collected (although more schools were required to use the new codes in 2003). The effect of this change has been to reduce the number of pupils recorded as having SEN without statements. The data on SEN pupils without statements shown in Tables 33b, 34 and 35 are not therefore directly comparable with those for earlier years.
- 42 Ethnic background of pupils The categories for recording ethnicity data have changed to reflect the categories used in the 2001 National population census, with two additional categories for Travellers of Irish heritage and pupils of Gypsy/ Roma heritage. There is no direct mapping between this set of codes and those used in previous years which will result in some discontinuity in time series data.
- **43 First Language** "First Language" is the language to which the child was initially exposed during early development. Two new codes were introduced in PLASC 2003 'refused' and 'information not obtained' which could cause some discontinuity with time series data.
- **44 Teaching Staff** The categories for teaching staff collected in PLASC 2003 have changed from previous years (see Explanatory Notes 25 and 26) although the overall numbers of qualified and other teaching staff are comparable with previous years.

ADMISSION APPEALS

45 Admission authorities: LEAs for County and Voluntary Controlled schools and governing bodies for Voluntary Aided, Special Agreement and the former Grant-Maintained schools, are required under the 1996 Education Act to constitute an independent appeals committee to hear appeals by parents against the non-admission of their child to a school for which they have expressed a preference.

ROUNDING OF FIGURES

46 Where figures have been rounded there may be discrepancies between the sum of constituent items and the total as shown.

REGIONAL ANALYSES

- 47 The regional figures cover the schools administered by the local education authorities in that region. For schools other than LEA-maintained, the figures cover schools located in that region. Regional statistics of pupils therefore refer to the pupils in such schools irrespective of the pupils' normal place of residence.
- **48** The regions used in this volume are Government Office regions which have been adopted across all Government Departments for use in all government statistics (Map).
- **49** One maintained secondary school in Outer London did not submit data in the Annual Schools' Census and therefore, where applicable, aggregated figures for Outer London Government Office region and overall national do not include data for this school. Six independent schools submitted their data after the database for this publication had closed and are therefore excluded from the analyses shown here.
