



School Statistics by Assembly Constituency and Region, 2011

This Statistical Bulletin shows a breakdown of some headline school statistics by the Assembly Constituencies and Regions as defined by the boundaries used for the Assembly election in May 2010. The bulletin is produced using data collected for the 2010/11 academic year.

Key Points

Schools and Pupils

- The **number of full-time equivalent (FTE) pupils** in each constituency ranged between 7,426 in Dwyfor Meirionnydd, to 17,297 in Cardiff West. (*Table 2*)
- The lowest **average class sizes** in primary school Foundation Phase classes were in the constituency of Montgomeryshire with 21.0 pupils and the lowest average Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 classes were in the constituency of Dwyfor Meirionnydd with 19.6 pupils for Key Stage 1 classes and 20.2 pupils for Key Stage 2 classes. The largest average Foundation phase classes were in Pontypridd with 28.0 pupils, the largest average Key Stage 1 classes were in Pontypridd with 28.1 pupils, and the largest average Key Stage 2 classes were in Torfaen with 27.9 pupils. (*Table 4*)
- Ceredigion had the lowest primary **pupil teacher ratio** at 17.5, and Pontypridd had the highest at 23.5. The lowest secondary pupil teacher ratio was in Ceredigion at 14.6, and the highest was in Caerphilly at 18.3. (*Table 5*)
- Brecon and Radnorshire had the lowest percentage of pupils of compulsory school age entitled to free school meals at 10.7 per cent, whilst Rhondda had the highest percentage at 29.7 per cent. (<u>Table</u> <u>6</u>)

Absenteeism

- The **percentage of half day sessions missed through overall absenteeism** by pupils of compulsory school age in primary schools was highest in Rhondda (8.5 per cent) and lowest in Clwyd West (5.4 per cent). (*Table 10*)
- The **percentage of half day sessions missed through overall absenteeism** by pupils of compulsory school age in secondary schools was highest in Cardiff South and Penarth (12.0 per cent) and lowest in Alyn and Deeside (7.2 per cent). (*Table 11*)

Educational Attainment

- The constituency with the highest **percentage of pupils achieving the Core Subject Indicator at Key Stage 2** was at Gower (86.3 per cent), and the lowest percentage was at Blaenau Gwent (73.2 per cent). (*Table 13*)
- Gower had the highest percentage of pupils achieving the Level 2 threshold including a GCSE grade A*-C in English or Welsh First Language and Mathematics, at 65.5 per cent, whilst Blaenau Gwent was the constituency with the lowest percentage at 35.3 per cent. (<u>Table 15</u>)

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

Schools and Pupils

Here are the key points about schools and pupils:

- The constituency with the most **number of schools** was Dwyfor Meirionnydd with 73 schools, where the constituency with the fewest schools was Swansea West with 29 schools. (*Table 1*)
- The **number of full-time equivalent pupils** in each constituency ranged between 7,426 in Dwyfor Meirionnydd, to 17,297 in Cardiff West. (*Table 2*)
- The number of **full-time equivalent qualified teachers in schools** was highest in Cardiff West at 1,022.7 teachers, and lowest in Dwyfor Meirionnydd at 449.9 teachers. (*Table 3*)
- The lowest **average class sizes** in primary school Foundation Phase classes were in the constituency of Montgomeryshire with 21.0 pupils and the lowest average Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 classes were in the constituency of Dwyfor Meirionnydd with 19.6 pupils for Key Stage 1 classes and 20.2 pupils for Key Stage 2 classes. The largest average Foundation phase classes were in Pontypridd with 28.0 pupils, the largest average Key Stage 1 classes were in Pontypridd with 28.1 pupils, and the largest average Key Stage 2 classes were in Torfaen with 27.9 pupils. (*Table 4*)
- Ceredigion had the lowest primary **pupil teacher ratio** at 17.5, and Pontypridd had the highest at 23.5. The lowest secondary pupil teacher ratio was in Ceredigion at 14.6, and the highest was in Caerphilly at 18.3. (*Table 5*)
- Brecon and Radnorshire had the lowest percentage of pupils of compulsory school age entitled to free school meals at 10.7 per cent, whilst Rhondda had the highest percentage at 29.7 per cent. (*Table 6*)
- The percentage of **pupils with statements of Special Educational Need (SEN)** was highest in Wrexham with 4.9 per cent of pupils, and lowest in Ogmore with 0.4 per cent of pupils. (*Table 7*)
- Montgomeryshire was the constituency where the highest percentage of pupils considered themselves to be from a **white ethnic background**, 98.9 per cent. Cardiff Central had the highest percentage of pupils from an ethnic background other than white, 72.1 per cent white and 27.9 per cent from another ethnic background. (*Table 8*)
- Alyn and Deeside was the constituency where the lowest percentage of pupils considered their **national identity** to be Welsh (26.1 per cent), and both Arfon and Rhondda had the lowest percentage considering themselves to be British (15.1 per cent). Rhondda had the highest percentage considering themselves to be Welsh (81.2 per cent) and Monmouth had the highest percentage considering themselves to be British (51.4 per cent). (*Table 9*)

Absenteeism

Here are the key points about absenteeism:

- The **percentage of half day sessions missed through overall absenteeism** by pupils of compulsory school age in primary schools was highest in Rhondda (8.5 per cent) and lowest in Clwyd West (5.4 per cent). (*Table 10*)
- The **percentage of half day sessions missed through unauthorised absenteeism** by pupils of compulsory school age in primary schools was highest in Cardiff South and Penarth (2.6 per cent) and lowest in Carmarthenshire East and Dinefwr, Montgomeryshire, Gower and Neath (0.2 per cent). (*Table 10*)
- The **percentage of half day sessions missed through overall absenteeism** by pupils of compulsory school age in secondary schools was highest in Cardiff South and Penarth (12.0 per cent) and lowest in Alyn and Deeside (7.2 per cent). (*Table 11*)
- The **percentage of half day sessions missed through unauthorised absenteeism** by pupils of compulsory school age in secondary schools was highest in Cardiff West (3.6 per cent) and lowest in both Dwyfor Meirionnydd and Montgomeryshire (0.4 per cent). (*Table 11*)

Educational Attainment

Here are the key points about absenteeism:

- The constituency with the highest **percentage of pupils achieving the Core Subject Indicator at Key Stage 1** was at Newport West (89.7 per cent), and the lowest percentage was at Cynon Valley (74.9 per cent). (*Table 12*)
- The constituency with the highest **percentage of pupils achieving the Core Subject Indicator at Key Stage 2** was at Gower (86.3 per cent), and the lowest percentage was at Blaenau Gwent (73.2 per cent). (*Table 13*)
- The constituency with the highest **percentage of pupils achieving the Core Subject Indicator at Key Stage 3** was at Dwyfor Meirionnydd (78.8 per cent), and the lowest percentage was at Merthyr Tydfil and Rhymney (52.4 per cent). (*Table 14*)
- Gower had the highest percentage of pupils achieving the Level 2 threshold including a GCSE grade A*-C in English or Welsh First Language and Mathematics, at 65.5 per cent, whilst Blaenau Gwent was the constituency with the lowest percentage at 35.3 per cent. (*Table 15*)
- Vale of Glamorgan had the highest **average wider points score for pupils aged 17**, at 1,028.4 points, whilst Aberavon had the lowest at 547.0 points. (*Table 16*)
