#### **North East**

#### Introduction

The North East region covers approximately 8,600 km² and has a population of around 2.6 million. It is the smallest of the English regions in population terms. It contains highly urbanised areas and large areas of both farming land and national park. The population density is relatively low at 300 per km², but more than 61 per cent of the inhabitants live in the urban areas of Tyne and Wear, Middlesbrough, Redcar and Cleveland, and Stockton-on-Tees. According to the midyear estimates, the population of the North East increased by 1.7 per cent overall between 2004 and 2009. While Durham experienced a 7.9 per cent increase in population over the period, the populations of Redcar and Cleveland and Sunderland decreased by at least 1 per cent.

#### The economy

The economic output of the region in 2009 was £34.2 billion, 3.4 per cent of the total UK gross value added (GVA).

In 2008 manufacturing industries generated 16 per cent of the region's total GVA. This was a significant decline from the sector's 27 per cent share in 1991, and reflects the overall decline of manufacturing in the UK – from 21 per cent of the UK GVA in 1991 to 12 per cent in 2008. The chemicals, chemical products, and man-made fibres industries produced 24 per cent of the total GVA of the manufacturing industries in the region in 2008.

Gross disposable household income (GDHI) was £13,000 per head in 2009, 16 per cent below the UK average. It ranged from £12,200 in Sunderland to £15,220 in Northumberland.

#### **Qualification levels**

In 2009, 24.3 per cent of the North East working age population's highest qualification was Level 4 or above. This was the lowest of all the English regions and compares with 30.0 per cent for England.

In the North East, 48.1 per cent of pupils achieved five or more grades A\* to C at GCSE level or equivalent including English and mathematics in 2008-09, compared with 49.8 per cent for England as a whole.

#### **Higher education provision**

There are five universities in the region and no higher education colleges. In addition, there are 17 further education colleges (FECs) offering a range of higher education (HE) courses. In 2009-10 these institutions attracted 126,255 full-time and part-time HE students, equating to 93,605 full-time equivalents; 8,285 of them were registered at FECs. The universities range in size from the University of Northumbria at Newcastle with 29,337 students, to the University of Sunderland with 14,621 students.


The largest concentration of higher education is in the Tyne and Wear area, where there are three universities and five FECs providing higher education.

#### Student profile

The North East has a high percentage of young full-time first degree students remaining in the region to study, and the inflow of students from other regions in the UK is much greater than the

outflow. There are also a high proportion of young full-time first degree entrants from low participation neighbourhoods.




#### Profile of students' study methods in the North East (based on student FPEs)



# HE students taught at HEIs in the North East 2007-08 to 2009-10 (OU and distance learners excluded)




### HE students taught at FECs in the North East 2007-08 to 2009-10

Higher education student numbers for further education colleges 2007-08 to 2009-10




# HE students taught at North East HEIs 2009-10: characteristics (OU and distance learners excluded)



# **HE students taught at North East HEIs: subject 2009-10 (OU and distance learners excluded)**




# **HE students taught at North East FECs 2009-10:** characteristics






# Flows of young, full-time, first degree students between regions (OU and distance learners excluded)

#### Where do young students at North East HEIs in 2009-10 come from?




### Where in England do young students from the North East study? 2009-10


### **Employment destinations of first degree graduates**

#### First degree students graduating from HEIs in 2008:





#### First degree students from the region graduating in 2008:




#### Income to HE institutions in the North East

#### Total income\* by source 2009-10








