Vocational Qualifications Quarterly: October to December 2011

February 2012

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Key findings

This bulletin covers all National Vocational qualifications (NVQ), vocationally related qualifications (VRQ), Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF) qualifications, and occupational qualifications (OQ) at all levels. For the purposes of this bulletin these four types are considered to be vocational qualifications. The qualification type is that recorded in the Register of Regulated Qualifications; please see the glossary¹ for further details. There is some overlap between the figures in this bulletin and those in the Higher Qualifications Quarterly, which covers all qualifications at level 4 and above.

There were 912,050 regulated vocational qualification achievements recorded in October to December 2011, an increase of 22% on the same quarter of 2010. There were 13,971 available regulated qualifications, an increase of 30% on the previous year. The achievements covered 5,519 different qualifications, offered by 117 different awarding organisations.

National Vocational qualifications

In October to December 2011, 50,950 NVQ achievements were recorded, a decrease of 72% on the same quarter of the previous year. These achievements covered 781 different qualifications (representing 55 per cent of all available NVQ qualifications) offered by 38 different awarding organisations. The decline in achievements reflects in part the restructuring of some qualifications, which have then been re-coded as QCF type. Please note that the figures in this bulletin refer to qualifications coded as NVQ type and do not include NVQs on the QCF.

There has been a downward trend in NVQ achievements since April to June 2010 (figure 2), which has been particularly dramatic in this quarter.

The NVQ with the greatest number of achievements was the City & Guilds Level 2 NVQ in Health and Social Care, which recorded 3,300 achievements, representing a decline of 53% on the same quarter of last year. The awarding organisation that recorded the most NVQ achievements was City & Guilds, with 23,050 achievements (45 per cent of all NVQ achievements).

Vocationally related qualifications

From October to December 2011, 55,600 VRQ achievements were recorded, a decrease of 81% on the same quarter of the previous year. These achievements

covered 820 different qualifications (representing 39 per cent of all available VRQ qualifications) offered by 56 different awarding organisations. The number of available qualifications declined by 12% when compared with the same quarter of the previous year; 2,114 in 2011 compared with 2,388 in 2010. The decline in achievements reflects in part the restructuring of some qualifications, which have then been recoded as QCF type. Please note that the figures in this bulletin refer to qualifications coded as VRQ type and do not include any qualifications on the QCF.

The VRQ with the greatest number of achievements was the OCR Level 2 National First Award in Information and Communication Technology (ICT), which recorded 4,700 achievements, a 25% increase on the same quarter in 2010. The awarding organisation that recorded the most VRQ achievements was City & Guilds, with 21,250 achievements (38 per cent of all VRQ achievements).

Qualifications and Credit Framework qualifications

From October to December 2011, 803,550 QCF achievements were recorded. This figure increased from 274,750 for quarter 4 in 2010, representing an increase of 192%. These achievements covered 3,867 different qualifications (representing 37 per cent of all available QCF qualifications) offered by 101 different awarding organisations. Please note that these figures refer to full qualifications, not units. The increase in achievement numbers reflects the restructuring of many qualifications which have been put onto the QCF. The QCF is a credit-based framework which enables learners to accumulate and transfer credit towards a regulated qualification.

The QCF qualification with the greatest number of achievements was the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health (CIEH) Level 2 award in Food Safety in Catering, with 50,900 achievements. The awarding organisation that recorded the most QCF achievements was City & Guilds, with 91,900 achievements (11 per cent of all QCF achievements).

Introduction

This statistical bulletin is published by the Office of Qualifications and Examinations Regulation (Ofqual). We regulate qualifications, examinations and assessments in England and vocational qualifications in Northern Ireland. In this bulletin we present data on achievements for regulated vocational qualifications in England, Wales and Northern Ireland during the October to December 2011 quarter.

This bulletin is one of a suite of three publications presenting quarterly data on achievements for regulated qualifications, excluding GCSEs, GCEs² and the Diploma. The other two bulletins are:

- Higher Qualifications Quarterly (covers all qualifications at level 4 and above)
- Supplemental Qualifications Quarterly (covers Entry to level 3 for Basic Skills, Entry level, English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL), Free-standing Mathematics Qualifications, Functional Skills, Key Skills and other general (OG) qualifications).

Each quarter awarding organisations submit to us data on the number of achievements for regulated qualifications (excluding GCSE and GCE) during the quarter. Achievements are recorded in the quarter during which the final certificate is issued. This bulletin presents this data, giving information on the number of achievements recorded by awarding organisations, along with the sector subject area (SSA), qualification type and level of achievements. All regulated qualifications are included, regardless of age of learner, centre type and funding status of the qualification.

We will no longer present a section exploring the trends in occupational qualifications separately, as the numbers of achievements in these qualifications are now very low. The achievement figures for these qualifications are, however, presented in tables 16 to 19.

Geographical coverage

The bulletin covers the regulated qualifications of all recognised awarding organisations in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. Only one figure for the total number of achievements for each qualification is available, so it is not currently

possible to present the data at country level. We have now started collecting more comprehensive data and eventually expect to be able to present data at country level.

Qualification type

At the point of accreditation, regulated qualifications are allocated to one of 18 qualification types, which are used to classify qualifications in this bulletin. It is recognised that the current classification system is not ideal, as very similar qualifications can be classified under more than one type, for example NVQs can also be on the QCF. We are working with experts to investigate how this situation might be improved in the future.

Revisions

Once published, data on the number of certifications for any qualification is not usually subject to revision. However, data may be revised in subsequent bulletins due to late-received data or if an error is identified. Qualifications may also be recategorised to a different type, level, SSA or awarding organisation. In some cases, this may result in previous data being amended to reflect the new categorisation.

In this bulletin some figures have been revised since the quarter 3, 2011 bulletin. These revisions were due to historical updates from two awarding organisations.

Completeness of the data

Awarding organisations sends us data every quarter. We contact any awarding organisation that does not return a complete set of data within the collection to ensure the data is as complete as possible. For this quarter, we received data from all the awarding organisations.

Figures in the commentary and tables for the numbers of achievements recorded are rounded to the nearest 50. This reflects the inaccuracies inherent in any large-scale data collection. As a result of rounded figures, the percentages shown in pie charts will not necessarily sum to 100%.

Due to seasonal variation in the number of achievements over the year, comparisons in this bulletin are only made with data in the same quarter of the previous year.

Definitions

A glossary is available as a separate document in the statistics section of our website: www.ofqual.gov.uk/research-and-statistics/165/411 with further details on SSA classifications, qualification types and levels.

In the charts in this bulletin quarter numbers refer to calendar quarters. So Q1 refers to January to March, Q2 to April to June, Q3 to July to September, and Q4 to October to December.

Achievements this quarter

To provide an overall perspective on achievements during the latest quarter, this section presents figures for all qualification types, except GCE, GCSE and Diploma types. Further details for types not included in this bulletin can be found in the companion bulletins on higher and supplemental qualifications.

The total number of achievements across all qualification types for the period October to December 2011 is shown in the table below (with October to December 2010 shown for comparison).

From the table above we can see the impact of qualifications being restructured onto the QCF, with an increase of over 190% in the number of achievements for these qualifications. Qualifications in ESOL also increased, by 22%.

We also see an increase of 431% in Functional Skills achievements, a qualification type which replaces Key Skills and Basic Skills. Key Skills and Basic Skills have a corresponding decline of 12,450 (10%) and 27,000 (21%) on the achievements given in October to December 2010. The increase in Functional Skills could also be attributed in part to the increase in Apprenticeships. In 2010/11 academic year, there were 200,300 apprenticeship achievements compared with 171,500 in 2009/10.³

With qualifications being restructured onto the QCF we see a decline in all other qualification types, with the largest decreases in achievements reported in other general qualifications (84%), VRQs (81%), NVQs (72%) and OQs (68%). The decrease in other general qualifications is largely caused by the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music (ABRSM) transferring their qualifications onto the QCF. Those with a rather smaller decline were higher level (41%) and Entry level (26%) qualifications.

As with the same quarter of last year, no awards were reported in Free-standing Mathematics Qualifications.

The 20 qualifications with the highest number of achievements across all qualification types, for the period October to December 2011, are shown in the table below.



Regulated vocational qualifications

(See figure 1 and tables 1-2.)

There are currently 13,971 available regulated vocational qualifications: those qualifications that have not yet passed their certification end date and so are available to be awarded. This figure is an increase of 30% on the previous year, mainly due to the increase in QCF qualifications. These qualifications comprise 10,338 QCF qualifications (74 per cent of available vocational qualifications), 2,114 VRQs (15 per cent), 1,432 NVQs (10 per cent) and 87 OQs (less than 1 per cent) (see figure 1 and table 1).

Figure 1: Number of available regulated vocational qualifications per quarter, October–December 2006 to October–December 2011



We can see from figure 1 that the QCF has been growing at a consistent pace since quarter 3, 2009, and OQs stay relatively stable. The figure shows that NVQs and VRQs decrease in number very slightly. As QCFs are replacing NVQs and VRQs there will be a duplication of qualifications available until the old qualifications finish certificating. Over time we expect the availability of each of these qualification types to decline.

During the last quarter, 882 new vocational qualifications were added to the list of available regulated qualifications. These included 876 QCF qualifications and six VRQs.

During the last quarter, two QCF qualifications changed awarding organisation and three changed SSA. No qualifications were re-categorised in terms of type or level.

National Vocational qualifications


Figure 2: Total number of NVQ achievements per quarter, October–December 2006 to October–December 2011

(See figures 2-7 and tables 1-6.)

Please note that these figures refer to qualifications coded as NVQ type and do not include NVQs on the QCF.


NVQs are work-related, competence-based qualifications which cover a broad range of occupations and are delivered in a workplace setting. NVQs are made up of units taken from the National Occupational Standards (NOS), which define the knowledge, understanding and competence required to perform a particular job.

Achievements

In October to December 2011, 50,950 NVQ achievements were recorded at all levels, a decrease of 72% on the same quarter of 2010 (see figure 2 and table 2). There is a downward trend in NVQ achievements since April to June 2010 (figure 2). This decrease partly reflects the restructuring of some qualifications, which have then been re-coded as QCF type. The decrease in the last quarter, is particularly dramatic when we consider that the usual seasonal spike of achievements reported in quarter 3 did not occur but the decrease between quarters 3 and 4 has.

These achievements covered 781 different qualifications (quite a significant decrease on 911 in the previous quarter) offered by 38 different awarding organisations. In October to December 2011, these NVQs represented 55 per cent of the total available NVQs, 10 per cent of available vocational qualifications and 6 per cent of achievements.

Qualifications

The NVQ with the greatest number of achievements was the City & Guilds Level 2 NVQ in Health and Social Care, with 3,300 achievements. The 40 NVQs with the greatest number of achievements are shown in table 3. And figure 3 shows the five-year trend for the five NVQs with the highest number of achievements in October to December 2011.

Awarding organisations

The awarding organisation that recorded the highest number of achievements for NVQs was City & Guilds, with 23,050 achievements (45 per cent of all NVQ achievements). Figures for all awarding organisations are shown in table 4, which also shows the corresponding figures for the same quarter of the previous year. The awarding organisations with the most achievements are shown in figure 4.

Figure 4: NVQ achievements – by awarding organisation – October to December 2011





Figure 5 shows the five-year trend for the five awarding organisations that recorded the greatest number of achievements in October to December 2011. These five represent 83 per cent of all NVQ achievements in October to December 2011. In figure 5 the downward trend since October to December 2010 can be seen for all of the awarding organisations.

Figure 5: The five awarding organisations that recorded the greatest number of achievements for NVQs in October to December 2011, showing trend from October to December 2006




Sector subject area

Regulated qualifications are allocated to one of 15 SSA codes (see the glossary for further details). The SSA that recorded the highest number of achievements for NVQs was health, public services and care, with 20,900 achievements, representing 41 per cent of NVQs in October to December 2011. The second largest area was engineering and manufacturing technologies, with 13,500 achievements, representing 26 per cent of NVQ achievements (see figure 6 and table 5).

All SSAs have declined in achievements since quarter 4 of the previous year. The greatest decline has been in business, administration and law (90% decline from 45,700 to just 4,650 achievements) and retail and commercial enterprise (84% decline from 26,800 to 4,150 achievements).






Level of qualification

The majority of NVQ achievements were at level 2, with 25,000, representing 49 per cent of NVQ achievements in October to December 2011 (see figure 7 and table 6).

Please note that NVQ qualifications at level 4 are in fact equivalent to achievement at levels 4, 5 and 6 when compared with other qualifications. Similarly, level 5 NVQs are equivalent to achievement at levels 6, 7 and 8.

Vocationally related qualifications


Figure 8: Total number of VRQ achievements per quarter, October–December 2006 to October–December 2011

(See figures 8–14 and tables 1–2 and 7–10.)

Please note that these figures refer to qualifications coded as VRQ type and do not include any qualifications on the QCF.


VRQs are work-related, competence-based qualifications designed to provide learners with the skills and knowledge needed to do a job. They are related to employment but, unlike NVQs, do not necessarily require a work placement and are not purely based on the NOS.

Achievements

In October to December 2011, 55,600 VRQ achievements were recorded at all levels, a decrease of 81% on the same quarter of 2010 (see figure 8 and table 2). There is a downward trend from quarter 4, 2010 (October to December), and this is the second October-to-December quarter that has seen a year-on-year decline since quarter 4 of 2005. This decrease partly reflects the restructuring of some qualifications, which have then been re-coded as QCF type.

The VRQ achievements covered 820 different qualifications offered by 56 different awarding organisations. In October to December 2011 these VRQs represented 39 per cent of the total available VRQ qualifications, 15 per cent of available vocational qualifications and 6 per cent of achievements.

Qualifications


Figure 9: The five VRQs with the highest number of achievements for October to December 2011, showing trend from October to December 2006

The VRQ with the greatest number of achievements was the OCR Level 2 National First Award in ICT, with 4,700 achievements. The 40 VRQs with the greatest number of achievements are shown in table 7. Figure 9 shows the five-year trend for the five VRQs with the highest number of achievements in October to December 2011.

Note, there are two qualifications entitled City & Guilds Level 3 Certificate in the Requirements for Electrical Installations and the latter shown is the larger in terms of size of qualification.

Although VRQs are in decline, if we examine the top ten qualifications, we see a varied picture of growth and decline (see figure 10). Four of the top ten qualifications are growing in the number of achievements since the same quarter of the previous year, and some qualifications are seasonal with high peaks in quarters 2 and 3. Other qualifications have a consistent number of achievements throughout the year.

Awarding organisations

The awarding organisation that recorded the highest number of achievements for VRQs was City & Guilds, with 21,250 achievements (38 per cent of all VRQ achievements). Figures for the 40 awarding organisations with the greatest number of achievements are shown in table 8, which also shows the corresponding figures for the same quarter of the previous year. The awarding organisations with the highest number of achievements are shown in figure 11.

If we examine the top ten awarding organisations with the largest number of achievements, we see that all but one have decreased achievement, reflecting in part the movement to QCF. Only EAL is showing growth (of 11%).

Figure 11: VRQ achievements – by awarding organisation – October to December 2011





Figure 12 shows the five-year trend for the five awarding organisations with the highest number of achievements in October to December 2011.

Figure 12: The five awarding organisations with the greatest number of achievements for VRQs in October to December 2011, showing trend from October to December 2006




Sector subject area

The SSA that recorded the highest number of achievements for VRQs was engineering and manufacturing technologies, with 15,700 achievements, representing 28 per cent of VRQs in October to December 2011 (see figure 13 and table 9).

There has been a decline in achievements across the board for the SSAs, the largest of which was in retail and commercial enterprise (98% decline from 25,650 achievements to 600). Three other sectors saw a decline of more than 90%: health, public services and care (92% from 111,450 to 8,500); languages, literature and culture (91% from 550 to 50); and preparation for life and work (also 91% from 4,350 to 400).






Level of qualification

The majority of VRQ achievements were at level 3, with 28,300, representing 51 per cent of VRQ achievements in October to December 2011 (see figure 14 and table 10).

Qualifications and Credit Framework


Figure 15: Total number of QCF achievements and vocational achievements per quarter, October–December 2007 to October–December 2011

(See figures 15–20 and tables 1–2 and 11–15.)

Please note that these figures refer to full qualifications, not units.

The QCF is a credit-based framework which enables learners to accumulate and transfer credit towards a regulated qualification. It is designed to give learners, learning providers and employers an inclusive and flexible, regulated qualifications framework containing units and qualifications that recognise the widest possible range of quality-assured learner achievements. The QCF introduces a standard currency for learner achievement across the qualifications systems through the award of credit. One credit is equivalent to ten hours of learning. There are three sizes of QCF qualification: award, certificate and diploma. Awards consist of 1 to 12 credits, certificates 13 to 36 credits, and diplomas 37 credits or more.


Achievements

In October to December 2011, 803,550 QCF achievements were recorded, an increase of 192% on the same quarter of the previous year (see table 2 and figure 15). In October to December 2010 QCF achievement represented 38 per cent of all vocational achievements. In October to December 2011, this figure increased to 88%. The increase reflects the restructuring of many qualifications, which have then been put onto the QCF.

These achievements covered 3,867 different qualifications offered by 101 different awarding organisations. In October to December 2011 QCF qualifications represented 74 per cent of available vocational qualifications.

Whilst the number of certifications increased significantly when compared with the same quarter of 2010, we can see from figure 15 that the awarding of QCF qualifications seems to be becoming more seasonal (the spike of achievements in line with the end of the academic year is very pronounced for 2011). This trend is clear when we consider that the drop in certification numbers between quarters 3 and 4 of 2010 was 21%, whereas this year the drop was 42%. This drop may be related to the types of qualification being awarded as qualifications are moved onto the QCF.

Qualifications


Figure 16: The number of QCF qualifications available and the number of qualifications awarded, by quarter, October–December 2007 to October–December 2011

There were achievements in 3,867 qualifications in October to December 2011. These qualifications represent just 39 per cent of all available QCF qualifications, which in part due to new qualifications requiring time to run before they certificate. However, figure 16 shows that over time the gap is widening between those qualifications that are available and those certifying.

The QCF qualification with the greatest number of achievements was the CIEH Level 2 Award in Food Safety in Catering, with 50,900 achievements. This qualification was a VRQ in the same quarter of the previous year and has now been restructured and moved onto the QCF. The 40 QCF qualifications with the greatest number of achievements are shown in table 11.


Figure 17: QCF achievements – by awarding organisation – October to December 2011

This quarter City & Guilds recorded the highest number of QCF achievements, with 91,900 awards (which equates to 11 per cent of all QCF achievements). Figures for the 40 awarding organisations with the greatest number of achievements are shown in table 12, which also shows the corresponding figures for the same quarter of the previous year. The ten awarding organisations with the greatest number of achievements are shown in figure 17.

Sector subject area

The SSA that recorded the greatest number of achievements for QCF qualifications was retail and commercial enterprise with 165,250 achievements, which represents 21 per cent of QCF qualifications in October to December 2011 (see figure 18 and table 13).

The table below shows that all SSAs have shown growth since quarter 4 of 2010. The SSA with the largest growth since October to December 2010 was history, philosophy and theology. There were no awards in this SSA code in quarter 4 of 2010, but in this quarter two NOCN awards in religious education have contributed 550 certifications between them. Science and mathematics continues its significant growth, with an increase of 1800% on the same quarter of 2010. As with quarter 3 of 2011, this growth is mainly caused by the uptake of Edexcel (Pearson) BTEC qualifications in applied science. The largest growth area in terms of number of achievements was retail and commercial enterprise, which has seen 110,750 more achievements since quarter 4 of 2010. This is in line with the large decline in NVQs and VRQs in this sector.

Interestingly, health, public services and care increased by 63,950 achievements but saw a decline in VRQs and NVQs of 102,500 and 28,100 achievements respectively. This pattern is in line with the overall decline of achievements in this sector, which saw a 34% decrease from 213,650 in October to December 2010 to 140,750 in October to December 2011.


Similarly, business, administration and law increased by 71,250 achievements but saw a decline of 58,150 achievements in VRQs and NVQs qualifications combined. This sector overall has seen 12% growth in certifications since October to December 2010.




Figure 19: QCF achievements by level, October to December 2011


