USER QUESTIONNAIRE – Student Support Applications Statistics

The Student Loans Company (SLC) started the publication of this Statistical release in conjunction with the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS) in October 2009. It was started in response to public concerns about the processing and payment of student support for the 2009/10 academic year. The release has been repeated in subsequent academic years with progress reported (monthly) from an earlier point in the processing cycle. The problems of 2009/10 were not repeated in 2010/11 and performance has improved further in each of the two academic years since. In line with this trend there has been a continuous reduction in the access to the publications in this series.
