Executive summary

This bulletin is published jointly with the Council for the Curriculum, Examinations and Assessment (CCEA).

In this bulletin we present achievements awarded for all regulated qualifications in Northern Ireland (excluding GCSEs, GCEs¹ and the Diploma and its components) for the quarter July–September 2012.

Achievements are included in the quarter when the final qualification certificate is issued. Each quarter, awarding organisations submit data to us on the number of achievements they have awarded for regulated qualifications (excluding GCSEs and GCEs). We also collect data on behalf of CCEA on the number of achievements awarded in Northern Ireland. All regulated qualifications are included, regardless of the age of the student, the type of school or college and the funding status of the qualification.

- There were 73,132 achievements awarded in Northern Ireland this quarter, covering 1,653 individual qualifications from 84 different awarding organisations.
 - The awarding organisation that awarded the most achievements was City & Guilds with 20,201 (28 per cent of all achievements during July– September 2012).
 - The qualification with the most achievements awarded was the City & Guilds Level 2 Certificate in Essential Skills – Application of Number with 2,815 (4 per cent of all achievements awarded this quarter).
 - The type of qualification with the most achievements awarded was the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF) with 45,174 (62 per cent of total achievements awarded).
 - The sector subject area preparation for life and work had the most achievements awarded with 19,906 (27 per cent of total achievements awarded).
 - Level 2 qualifications had the most achievements awarded with 33,479 (46 per cent of all levels).

- There were 45,174 QCF achievements awarded in Northern Ireland, covering 1,201 individual QCF qualifications from 70 different awarding organisations.
 - The QCF qualification with the most achievements awarded was the Chartered Institute in Environmental Health (CIEH) Level 2 Award in Food Safety in Catering with 1,833 achievements (4 per cent of all QCF achievements awarded).
 - The awarding organisation that awarded the most achievements in QCF qualifications was Pearson Education Limited (Edexcel) with 10,406 achievements (23 per cent of achievements awarded in QCF qualifications).
 - The sector subject area with the most achievements awarded in QCF qualifications was arts, media and publishing with 12,199 (27 per cent of the total QCF achievements awarded).
 - There were 22,430 achievements awarded at level 2 in QCF qualifications
 (50 per cent of the total QCF achievements awarded).


Achievements

This section presents the number of achievements awarded by type of qualification, awarding organisation, sector subject area and level of qualification. Due to the range of the qualifications on the QCF, there is further analysis of QCF qualifications in Northern Ireland (see page 13).

At the point of accreditation, all regulated qualifications are classified into 18² qualification types (see our *Statistical Publications Glossary*³ for a full listing.)

There were 73,132 achievements awarded in Northern Ireland during July–September 2012 for all qualification types except GCSE, GCE and the Diploma (see figure 1 and table 1 in the appendix).



We can see from figure 1 that, each year, there is a peak in the number of achievements awarded during the July–September quarter, following the summer exam series. This is true for England, Wales and Northern Ireland combined, and for Northern Ireland alone. Interestingly, more qualifications are awarded in Northern Ireland in the April–June quarter, each year, compared with the three countries combined, for the same quarter.

Over the past year, there has been a steady increase in the number of qualifications that are available for certification/achievement, across England, Wales and Northern Ireland (see figure 2). During July–September 2012, 56 per cent of these qualifications awarded achievements in the 12-month period to September 2012 across the three countries combined, and 13 per cent in Northern Ireland alone. And, looking at figure 2, we see this percentage has increased this quarter, albeit very slightly.



From figure 3 above and figure 4 below, we can see that QCF qualifications dominate in Northern Ireland (62 per cent), and in England, Wales and Northern Ireland (also 62 per cent). The second most frequently awarded type of qualification was key skills, with 11,470 achievements awarded (16 per cent of all achievements awarded in Northern Ireland).

Key skills, entry level and higher level qualifications have a greater percentage of the achievements awarded in Northern Ireland than they do in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. In contrast, there are a lower proportion of achievements awarded in vocationally related, basic skills, English for speakers of other languages (ESOL), functional skills and free-standing mathematics qualifications.

Figure 4 shows the share of achievements awarded in Northern Ireland by type of qualification.

The qualification with the greatest number of achievements awarded was the City & Guilds Level 2 Certificate in Essential Skills – Application of Number (2,815). Six of the ten qualifications were in essential skills. Table 2 in the appendix shows the 40 qualifications with the greatest number of achievements awarded.

Awarding organisations

In July–September 2012 there were 18,321 available qualifications (excluding GCSEs, GCEs and the Diploma) in England, Wales and Northern Ireland, offered by 166 awarding organisations.

In Northern Ireland, 84 awarding organisations awarded achievements across 1,653 qualifications.

The awarding organisation that awarded the most achievements in Northern Ireland during July–September 2012 was City & Guilds with 20,201 (28 per cent of all achievements awarded in Northern Ireland; see figures 6 and 7).






Sector subject area

Regulated qualifications are allocated to one of 15 sector subject area codes (see our *Statistical Publications Glossary*⁴ for further details.)

The sector subject area with the highest number of achievements awarded in Northern Ireland during July–September 2012 was preparation for life and work with 19,906 (27 per cent of all achievements awarded (see figure 8)). The second most common sector subject area was arts, media and publishing with 12,416 achievements, representing 17 per cent of all achievements awarded. Full details of the number of achievements awarded for each sector subject area are given in table 4 in the appendix.

Figure 8: Achievements awarded in Northern Ireland by sector subject area, July–September 2012





Level of qualification

All regulated qualifications are assigned a level, ranging from entry, then 1 to 8 (see our *Statistical Publications Glossary*⁵ for full details.)

In July–September 2012 in Northern Ireland, level 2 saw the greatest proportion of achievements awarded with 33,479, representing 46 per cent of achievements awarded (see figure 9). Full details of the number of achievements awarded for each level are given in table 5 in the appendix.

Qualifications and Credit Framework in Northern Ireland

Please note: these figures refer to full qualifications, not units.

The QCF is a credit-based framework that lets students build up and transfer credit towards a regulated qualification. It is designed to give students, learning providers and employers an inclusive and flexible regulated qualifications framework, containing units and qualifications that recognise the widest possible range of quality-assured student achievements. The QCF introduces a standard currency for student achievement across the qualifications system through the award of credits. One credit is equivalent to ten hours of learning. There are three sizes of QCF qualification: award, certificate and diploma. Awards consist of 1 to 12 credits, certificates 13 to 36 credits, and diplomas 37 credits or more.

In July – September 2012, 45,174 QCF achievements were recorded at all levels in Northern Ireland. The QCF achievements covered 1,201 different qualifications, offered by 70 awarding organisations. In July – September 2012, achievements awarded in QCF qualifications represented 62 per cent of the achievements awarded in regulated qualifications in Northern Ireland.


Figure 10: The 20 QCF qualifications with the most achievements awarded in Northern Ireland, July – September 2012

The QCF qualification with the greatest number of achievements awarded was the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health Level 2 Award in Food Safety in Catering, with 1,833 (see figure 10). The 40 QCF qualifications with the highest number of achievements awarded are detailed in table 6 in the appendix.


Pearson Education Limited (Edexcel) awarded almost a quarter of all QCF achievements (10,406 achievements, 23 per cent of all QCF achievements (see figure 11)). The 40 awarding organisations that awarded the highest number of achievements are shown in table 7 in the appendix.

Figure 11: QCF achievements awarded in Northern Ireland by awarding organisation, July – September 2012




The sector subject area with the highest number of achievements awarded in the QCF was arts, media and publishing with 12,199 (27 per cent of QCF achievements awarded (see figure 12)). If we consider all regulated qualifications (not just those in the QCF) then this sector subject area had the second highest number of achievements awarded. The sector subject area with the next highest number of achievements awarded was retail and commercial enterprise with 9,427 (21 per cent of QCF achievements awarded). If we consider all regulated qualifications (not just those in the QCF) then this sector subject area had the third highest number of achievements awarded. Background information

Each quarter, awarding organisations submit data to us on the number of achievements they have awarded for the quarter. For Northern Ireland, we also collect these data on behalf of CCEA. Achievements are included only in the quarter when the final certificate is issued. All regulated qualifications are included, regardless of the age of the student, the type of school or college and the funding status of the qualification.

Geographical coverage

This bulletin covers the regulated qualifications of all awarding organisations recognised by us and/or CCEA for Northern Ireland. Four of these awarding organisations are based in Ireland: CCEA, Engineering Training Council Awards Limited (ETCAL), Open College Network Northern Ireland (OCNNI), and Accounting Technicians Ireland (ATI).

The remaining awarding organisations recognised by us and/or CCEA to award qualifications in Northern Ireland have their headquarters elsewhere.

Qualification type

At the point of accreditation, regulated qualifications are classified into 18⁶ qualification types. These are used to classify the qualifications in this bulletin. We recognise that the classification system is not ideal, as very similar qualifications may appear under different qualification types, for example NVQs and the QCF.

This bulletin presents figures on all types of qualifications awarded in Northern Ireland, except GCSEs, GCEs and the Diploma.

Revisions

Once published, data on the number of achievements awarded for any qualification are not usually subject to change. But, data may be changed in subsequent bulletins due to late data or if an error is found. Qualifications may also be re-categorised to a different type, level, sector subject area or awarding organisation. In some cases, previous data may be altered to reflect the new categorisation.

In this bulletin some figures have been revised since the April – June 2012 bulletin. These revisions were made because of updates from two awarding organisations. Some of these updates have affected data since July – September 2010.

Completeness of the data

Awarding organisations send us data each quarter. We contact any awarding organisation that does not return a complete set of data within the collection period to make sure that the data are as complete as possible. For this guarter, we received data from all the awarding organisations.

We started collecting country-level data at the beginning of 2011 and we collected a complete set of data for the first time at the beginning of 2012. By 2013, we expect to be able to make comparisons with data from the same quarter of the previous year. Data for Northern Ireland are complete for 2012. In 2011, 80 per cent of awarding organisations supplied data, and, prior to this, data are only partially complete and should be considered with caution.

Definitions

Some of the key terms used in this bulletin are defined as follows:

- Accreditation a process that reviews and confirms achievement to specific criteria and standards.
- Achievement any award that is not graded as U, absent or X or fail.
- Available qualification a qualification eligible for an award or a qualification that has made an award.
- Awarding organisation an organisation recognised to develop, deliver and award descriptions of qualifications.
- Active qualification a qualification eligible for award to students, even if the qualification is no longer available for enrolment.
- Certification a formal acknowledgement of student achievement.
- Recognition an evidence-based process of achieving compliance with the criteria for recognition.

Our Statistical Publications Glossary provides further details on sector subject area classifications and qualification types and levels. It is available as a separate document in the statistical section of our website⁷.
