Introduction

This note describes the pupil numbers that have been used for calculating the illustrative Pupil Premium allocations for the financial year 2013-14.

The final Pupil Premium allocations for 2013-14 will be based on corresponding pupil numbers taken from the 2013 Spring censuses, for which the count point is 17th January 2013, and the March 2013 SSDA903 collection on children looked after.

School Census January 2012

Data on pupils in every primary, secondary and special school in England is collected termly via the School Census (SC) and includes data on Free School Meal (FSM) eligibility and Service Child status. The count point for the 2012 Spring School Census was 19th January 2012.

Free School Meals

All pupils aged 4 and over as at 31 August 2011 in Reception to Year 11 (or aged 4 to 15 where National Curriculum year groups do not apply) as recorded on the January 2012 School Census who are known to have been eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in the previous six years (known as Ever 6).

FSM eligibility in the previous six years has been determined by those pupils recorded on the January 2012 School Census who were recorded as known to be eligible for FSM on any of the censuses (School Census, Pupil Referral Unit Census and Alternative Provision Census) since Summer 2006.

- January 2012, Autumn 2011 and Summer 2011
- January 2011, Autumn 2010 and Summer 2010
- January 2010, Autumn 2009 and Summer 2009
- January 2009, Autumn 2008 and Summer 2008
- January 2008, Autumn 2007 and Summer 2007
- January 2007, Autumn 2006 and Summer 2006

Service Children

All pupils aged 4 and over as at 31 August 2011 in Reception to Year 11 (or aged 4 to 15 where National Curriculum year groups do not apply) as recorded on the January 2012 School Census and recorded as a Service Child.

School Level Annual School Census January 2012

Data on pupils in general hospital schools in England is collected annually via the School Level Annual School Census (SLASC). The count point for 2012 was 19th January.

Free School Meals

All pupils aged 4 and over as at 31 August 2011 in Reception to Year 11 (or aged 4 to 15 where National Curriculum year groups do not apply) as recorded on the January 2012 School Level Annual School Census and recorded as known to be eligible for FSM.

Pupil Referral Unit Census January 2012

Data on pupils in Pupil Referral Units (PRU) in England is collected annually via the PRU Census. The count point for 2012 was 19th January.

Free School Meals

All pupils aged 4 and over as at 31 August 2011 in Reception to Year 11 (or aged 4 to 15 where National Curriculum year groups do not apply) as recorded on the January 2012 PRU Census who are known to have been eligible for FSM in any of the censuses in the previous six years.

FSM eligibility in the previous six years has been determined by those pupils recorded on the January 2012 PRU Census who were recorded as known to be eligible for FSM on any of the censuses (SC, PRU, AP censuses) since Summer 2006, including the January 2012 censuses.

Service Children

All pupils aged 4 and over as at 31 August 2011 in Reception to Year 11 (or aged 4 to 15 where National Curriculum year groups do not apply) as recorded on the January 2012 PRU Census and recorded as a Service Child.

Alternative Provision Census January 2012

This captures pupils for whom an English local authority has a financial responsibility and if not included on the Alternative Provision (AP) Census, would not be picked up by other collections for Dedicated Schools Grant funding purposes. The count point for 2012 is 19th January.

Free School Meals

All pupils aged 4 to 15 as at 31 August 2011 in settings not maintained by the authority for which the authority is paying full tuition fees, plus all pupils aged 4 and above educated otherwise than in schools under arrangements made by the authority as recorded on the January 2012 AP Census and known to have been eligible for FSM in the previous six years.

FSM eligibility in the previous six years will be determined by those pupils recorded on the January 2012 AP Census who were recorded as known to be eligible for FSM on any of the censuses (SC, PRU and AP censuses) since Summer 2006, including the January 2012 censuses.

Service Children

All pupils aged 4 to 15 as at 31 August in settings not maintained by the authority for which the authority is paying full tuition fees, plus all pupils aged 4 and above educated otherwise than in schools under arrangements made by the authority as recorded on the January 2012 AP Census and recorded as a Service Child are counted.

SSDA903 - Local Authority Collection March 2012

The pupils counted on the SSDA903 will be those pupils that have been continuously looked after for over 6 months aged 4 to 15 at 31 August 2011. The count point for 2012 is 31st March.
