Annex B

Impact assessment – Section 9 Academies Act Duty

- Section 9 of the Academies Act 2010 places a duty upon the Secretary of State to take into account what the impact of establishing the additional school would be likely to be on maintained schools, Academies and Further Education institutions within the area in which the additional school is (or is proposed to be) situated. Any adverse impact will need to be balanced against the benefits of establishing the new school.
- Below is an assessment of the likely impact of the proposed school on schools within four miles (plus one school within the six-mile catchment area but outside the four-mile catchment area because two pupils from this particular school have registered to attend Rainbow) of its temporary site at Coral College, and which we know will either lose pupils to Rainbow Free School or are deemed as/rated by Ofsted as 'inadequate' or 'satisfactory'. Our assessment has taken into account representations received from the LA and from one Primary School (Atlas Primary School), outlining their concerns about the location of Rainbow School.
- From our analysis, we consider that the likely impact on the schools assessed will be minimal and expect the net effect will be positive in that the Rainbow Primary School will increase the choice available to parents. Therefore we have not undertaken a detailed assessment of each individual school within the inner and outer catchment areas or sought views directly from individual schools.
- As part of their consultation, the Trust has undertaken and sought the views of all primary and secondary schools. They have also written to Bradford Council and councillors and to residents local to the proposed site at Coral College.
- This area is among the most deprived in England and characterised by low educational achievement. Generally across Bradford, there is a need for more primary places due to an increasing population. Figures provided by the LA suggest that the pupil population is set to increase by at least 14% by 2018. This represents an increase in pupil numbers from 30,982 to 38,077 by 2014/2015. The LA calculates that this will reduce the number of surplus places available, from 39% to 2.19%.

Impact on maintained Primary Schools

The Trust has not received any direct representations from local

primary schools in the District. However, Atlas Primary school did raise directly with officials that the opening of Rainbow would impact on their own school as they do not have a full intake for their Reception class. Representations supporting the proposed Free School were received from parents and other stakeholders.

- There are a total of 88 maintained primary schools within the four mile area of the temporary site of Rainbow Free School. Six of these schools are rated by Ofsted as 'inadequate', 24 as 'satisfactory', 48 as 'good' and 8 as 'outstanding' (see Annex D – please note that there is no inspection report available for Bradford Girls Grammar School).
- Currently 43 pupils have confirmed that they will attend Rainbow Primary School in September 2011. Of these 43 pupils, 23 children want to join the reception class, 9 want to join year 1 (including 2 previously home-schooled children) and 11 want to join year 2 (this figure includes one pupil whose previous school that they attend is unknown). Table 2 below shows those pupils currently in year 1 and year 2 that are attending other institutions. It can be seen that the impact of Rainbow Free School on these schools will be negligible due to the low numbers involved. The net effect of pupils moving from those primary schools to Rainbow Primary School is ≤0.5% of the total student population at those eight schools. Four of those schools are over-capacity with the other four near to full capacity.

- There are six schools within the four-mile area which are rated by Ofsted as 'inadequate' (see Annex D), and which may lose pupils when places become available at Rainbow Primary School. Whilst there may be some impact on these schools, we consider that the competition for places created by the establishment of Rainbow Primary School will provide an incentive for these poor-performing schools to compete and improve. All primary schools in Bradford were consulted with by the proposers however no formal response was received. Officials consider this significant because if any of these schools were concerned about their viability as a result of this proposal we can expect them to have taken this opportunity to raise their concerns.
- A number of schools within the local area are undersubscribed, which may indicate that these schools are unpopular with local parents or pupils. Twelve schools are oversubscribed (see Annex D), and it is possible that some of these pupils will be interested in attending Rainbow Primary school.
- As stated previously, no formal responses were received from any primary schools when they were consulted. Atlas Primary School did however raise concerns directly with DfE officials about the sustainability of their own school if Rainbow Primary opened. This was on the basis that they already do not have a full intake of children in Reception class. Officials consider the initial impact on Atlas Primary School, due to the low pupil intake at Rainbow Primary School for September 2011, to be minimal. In determining this, officials considered the fact that no children currently attending Atlas Primary School are known to have expressed an interest to attend Rainbow Primary School this coming September. There may be an impact on Altas Primary and other primary schools within the immediate area as pupil admissions rise and Rainbow Primary School reaches capacity of 525 pupils by 2015. However, given the

rising pupil population across Bradford and the number of schools within Rainbow Primary School's admissions catchment area, we anticipate that the impact on Atlas, and other individual schools, is likely to be minimal.

• We expect that any such impact will be greatest on those schools that are Ofsted rated as 'inadequate'. Rainbow Primary School will draw pupils from a wide area in which there are a large number of primary schools and therefore any potential impact will be dispersed across a large number of schools within the inner and outer catchment areas. Officials have concluded that the impact on any one school following the establishment of Rainbow Primary School will be minimal. In addition, any negative impact on particular institutions is outweighed by the positive impact that Rainbow Primary School will have on parental choice and driving up standards in local primary schools.

Admissions policy

- During the process of developing their Admissions Policy, Rainbow Primary School had several meetings with the Bradford Local Authority, and the proposer has worked closely with the admissions lead at the LA.
- The Rainbow Primary School admissions policy is fully compliant with the Admissions Code. After children with a statement of Special Educational Needs naming the school, Looked After Children and the siblings of children already attending the school, if the school is over-subscribed, priority will be given in the following order;
 - 70% of children will be selected by random allocation within an inner catchment area of a four-mile radius of the school;
 - 30% drawn from an outer catchment six miles from the school; and
 - any remaining places will be allocated to children on the basis of proximity to the school using a straight line measurement from the main entrance of the school to the main entrance of the child's home.
- To date, 43 children have confirmed that they will accept their place to start in September 2011. The proposer remains confident that their target of 50 pupils will be reached once the Funding Agreement has been signed.

Local Authority opinion

- The Department wrote to the LA on 29 November and again on 15 June 2011 seeking views on Rainbow Primary School. This followed notification that Rainbow Primary School would share temporary accommodation in Coral College,
- In their response, the LA acknowledge that, over the next five years, the pupil population in the 5-11 age range (and the 11-16 age range) is forecast to rise across the District. For the 5-11 age range this increase is due to an increasing intake mainly from a rising birth rate. However, the LA does not feel the additional places identified by the proposer are required and that additional places will be managed through the incremental expansion, from reception year upwards over the next seven years, of a number of existing primary schools and the expansion of some existing Academies to all-through schools.
- The LA feels that the proposer has overstated the demand for additional places and argues, particularly in the timescales proposed for Rainbow Primary to reach capacity, that these additional primary places are not required, especially in light of their plans to expand a number of existing primary schools and the expansion of some existing Academies to all-through schools.
- It is the LAs view that these proposed expansions would adequately accommodate projected primary needs up to 2015 and therefore they do not feel that additional places provided by Rainbow Primary School within the 5-11 age range are required. We do not yet know which schools are included in the LAs expansion programme and from which point in time these places will become available.
- Given the need for additional primary places across Bradford, the mixed provision in the BD8 catchment area, and the absence of any serious representations opposing the opening of the Free School made during the consultation, it would appear unlikely that any single school, including Atlas Primary School, is likely to suffer uniquely or significantly as a result of the creation of Rainbow Primary School.

Impact on maintained Secondary Schools

• The Rainbow Primary School will not become a feeder school for any particular secondary school, and we consider that as a nonfaith mixed sex primary school it is very unlikely to have any impact on the choice of secondary schools that the children that attend it will go on to choose. Similarly, there is no likely impact on the FE institutions in the area local to the temporary site.

Conclusion

- The impact of the establishment of Rainbow Primary School on other primary schools in the area will be minimal. Pupils may be drawn away from other local schools but the number being drawn away from individual schools will be so small that the impact will be negligible and all other schools within the area will remain viable.
- Any negative impact on particular institutions is outweighed by the
 positive impact that Rainbow Free School will have on improving
 parental choice by widening the number and type of places
 available in local Primary state provision, and may drive up
 standards in surrounding schools. Both these features are key
 aims of the Free Schools policy and we would expect Rainbow
 Primary to help drive up standards in schools across the board,
 improving standards for all young people in the area.
- Given all this information, we consider that any marginal impact of establishing Rainbow Primary School on maintained schools, Academies and FE institutions in the surrounding area is outweighed by the positive impact that the school will have on parental choice and in driving up standards in nearby institutions.
