Impact Indicator 13: Percentage of children on free school meals progressing to a Russell Group university

About the indicator

This indicator measures the percentage of children who were eligible for free school meals in year 11 who took A levels or other level 3 qualifications and then progressed to a Russell Group university.

Why we measure it

The Government believes that progression to higher education can advance social mobility. However, the most advantaged 20% of young people are still seven times more likely to attend the most selective universities than the 40% most disadvantaged¹. This indicator will show if the Government's education policies are raising standards and aspirations so that more disadvantaged young people are able to go to Russell Group universities.

The data

- 4% of young people in the KS5 cohort¹ claiming free school meals² went to a Russell Group university^{3,4} in 2010/11.
- ¹The KS5 cohort includes young people who took A level or other Level 3 qualifications
- ² Claiming and eligible for free school meals at Year 11
- ³For a sustained period from October to March 2010/11
