Impact Indicator 7: Attainment gap at age 11 between free school meal pupils and their peers

About the indicator

This indicator measures the attainment gap at age 11 between pupils eligible for Free School Meals and their peers. The attainment gap is calculated from the percentage of all other pupils (those known not to be eligible for Free School Meals or with an unclassified status) achieving level 4 or above in reading, writing and mathematics minus the percentage of pupils known to be eligible for Free School Meals achieving level 4 or above in reading, writing and mathematics.

Why we measure it

This indicator is a measure of the attainment gap associated with economic disadvantage. Disadvantage remains strongly associated with poorer performance, on average, at every key stage. It is a leading Government priority to narrow the attainment gaps between disadvantaged pupils and their peers.
