Annual Qualifications Market Report England, Wales and Northern Ireland 2012/13 Academic Year

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Key points

This release presents information on the suppliers of qualifications, the numbers of qualifications regulated by Ofqual and the certificates in those qualifications received by learners for the academic year 2012/13. It covers all recognised awarding organisations and the regulated qualifications they offer. The key findings are:

- The number of available qualifications increased by 3,000 (15 per cent) from 2011/12 to nearly 24,000 in 2012/13. The majority of this increase came from qualifications other than GCSE and A level.
- The number of certificates increased by 4 per cent to 17.9 million between 2011/12 and 2012/13. Certificates were awarded in 54 per cent of available qualifications.
- The overall qualifications market remains highly concentrated, with 20 awarding organisations accounting for over 90 per cent of all certificates.
- Health, Public Services and Care is now the second largest sector following an increase in the number of certificates of 28 per cent in 2012/13. (Preparation for life and work is the largest sector).
- Certificates in functional skills increased significantly (31 per cent) between 2011/12 and 2012/13. From 1st October 2012 functional skills qualifications replaced key skills as a mandatory component of all apprenticeship frameworks.
- In schools in England, certificates in qualifications other than GCSE and A level fell by 9 per cent to 1.6 million in 2012/13.

Introduction

Ofqual regulates qualifications, exams and assessments in England, and vocational qualifications in Northern Ireland. Under the Apprenticeships, Skills, Children and Learning Act 2009, one of Ofqual's objectives is to improve public confidence in regulated qualifications and assessments by raising awareness and understanding of the qualifications.

This release presents data about the suppliers and the users of qualifications in this market, in a similar way to previous editions of the Annual Qualifications Market Report.

It reports in detail on the number of recognised awarding organisations offering qualifications, the qualifications that were available in the period covered, and the certificates in them. The report also covers participation rates in education and training for 16-19 year olds in England, including government-funded qualifications taken in schools and school sixth forms and the qualifications taken in the further education and skills sector.

In a change to format this year, the report does not cover some of the information covering external drivers in the market, awarding organisation type, legal status and income that were included in previous market reports. Later this year Ofqual expects to publish a companion report to this statistical release covering those excluded areas together with further analysis of the market for qualifications and its future direction.

The certificate data in this release covers England, Wales and Northern Ireland with the exception of the section on further education and the skills sector (page 60) where the data is for England only.

To help you interpret the content, a glossary of terms is available towards the end of this release.

Key statistics

The total number of awarding organisations remained unchanged from the previous year at 176 with few leaving or joining the regulated market in 2012/13.

The number of available qualifications increased by 3,000 (15 per cent) from 2011/12 to nearly 24,000 in 2012/13. Qualifications developed to meet the design requirements of the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF) showed the largest annual increase from 13,000 to 17,000 (31 per cent) with functional skills also showing a big increase (14 per cent from 203 to 232). This increase in functional skills is consistent with the changes in funding making them a mandatory component of all apprenticeship frameworks from October 2012.

For 2012/13 there were nearly 13,000 qualifications in which at least one certificate was awarded, accounting for 54 per cent of available qualifications. (Last year certificates were awarded in 56 per cent of qualifications.) As with the annual increase in available qualifications, qualifications on the QCF and functional skills showed the largest increases. The number of qualifications on the QCF in which at least one certificate was awarded increased from 7,000 to 9,000 (31 per cent). The number of functional skills qualifications increased from 154 to 183 (19 per cent). Between 2011/12 to 2012/13 the number of certificates awarded increased by 4 per cent to 17.85 million.

A high proportion of qualification certificates are concentrated in relatively few qualifications. For vocational qualifications and academic subjects excluding GCSE and A level and AS, 17 per cent of qualifications accounted for 90 per cent of certificates. For GCSE, A level and AS 29 per cent of qualifications accounted for 90 per cent of certificates.

Ninety per cent of certificates are in qualifications offered by 20 awarding organisations. Awarding organisation market shares by certificates in GCSE, A level and AS have been largely unchanged.

Health, public services and care is now the second largest sector in terms of 2012/13 certificates (with over 1 million awarded in 2012/13) following a large increase in the number of certificates since 2010/11. A number of new qualifications assessing first aid became available this year which contributed to this increase. The preparation for life and work sector remained the largest in terms of number of certificates (with over 3 million awarded in 2012/13).

Certificates in qualifications other than GCSE, A level and AS in schools in England fell by 9 per cent in 2012/13 from 1.8 to 1.6 million. Changes in funding and performance measures have contributed to this fall.

The number of adult learners (those 19 years and older) participating in further education in England in the 2012/13 academic year increased from 3.1 million to 3.3 million (4 per cent); the first annual increase since 2008/09.

In the further education and skills sector the Individualised Learner Record (ILR) – which records all Skills Funding Agency (SFA) or Education Funding Agency (EFA) funded qualifications – recorded nearly 5 million certificates; an increase in certificates of over 400,000 (over 9 per cent) between 2012 and 2013. The majority of this increase came from Employer Responsive provision¹ and Adult Learner Responsive provision² with increases of 31 per cent and 8 per cent respectively.

The SFA and EFA funded 96 per cent of certificates in the further education and skills sector. Funding through routes other than the SFA and EFA accounted for a small proportion of certificates.

Awarding organisations

Any organisation that wants to offer regulated qualifications has to be recognised by Ofqual. Since July 2011, any new awarding organisation needs to meet Ofqual's *Criteria for Recognition*³ and, once recognised, they need to continue to meet Ofqual's *General Conditions of Recognition*.⁴

Number of recognised awarding organisations

Figure 1 shows that since 2011 the upward trend in the number of awarding organisations between 2002/03 to 2010/11 has changed. One factor behind this change was the introduction of Ofqual's new recognition process which introduced criteria for recognition and a process for exit and surrender of recognition.

At the end of September 2013 the number of recognised awarding organisations (176) remained unchanged from the year before. Three awarding organisations – Association of Certified Project Accountants (ACPA), Focus Awards Limited (Focus Awards) and Training Qualifications UK Ltd (TQUK) were recognised out of 50 applications (from 38 organisations), and two organisations – the Market Research Society (MRS) and the University of East London Global Examinations Board (UELGB) – surrendered their recognition between October 2012 and September 2013. Pearson Education Limited (Pearson) acquired EDI in June 2011 and this is counted as one awarding organisation in this year's report.

Regulated qualifications

Figure 2 shows the number of available⁶ qualifications during the 2012/13 academic year increased by more than 3,000, bringing the total to nearly 24,000. The number of available qualifications has doubled in the last five years. That a qualification is available means that it only has to be available for one day during the year covered. On average the number of qualifications available is around 18,000 on any given day.

Trends in the number of qualifications by qualification type

Figure 3 shows the number of available qualifications from 2011/12 to 2012/13 for each qualification type⁷ as recorded on the Register of Regulated Qualifications (referred to as the Register). (Table 11 in the appendix shows the number of qualifications for 2008/09 to 2012/13.) It shows that qualifications developed to meet the design requirements of the QCF had the largest annual increase (31 per cent to 16,770), with functional skills also showing a big increase (14 per cent to 232). This increase in functional skills is consistent with the changes in funding making them a mandatory component of all apprenticeship frameworks from October 2012.

Available qualifications with certificates

Figure 4 shows that for 2012/13 nearly 13,000 qualifications recorded at least one certificate and accounted for 54 per cent of available qualifications. This is lower than in 2011/12 with 56 per cent. (Table 12 in the Appendix shows the number of qualifications for the period 2008/09 to 2012/13.) Qualifications developed to meet the design requirements of the QCF accounted for over 70 per cent of qualifications with certificates.

The number of qualifications with certificates increased by 11 per cent between 2011/12 and 2012/13, which is lower than the 15 per cent increase in the number of qualifications on the Register. There is generally a lag between a qualification appearing on the Register and the first certificate in that qualification.

The number of qualifications with certificates in the QCF increased by 31 per cent between 2011/12 and 2012/13. The 19 per cent increase in the number of functional

skills qualifications with certificates is consistent with the changes in funding making them a mandatory component of all apprenticeship frameworks from October 2012⁸.

Trends in certificates – the long tail

Table 1 shows that relatively few qualifications have large numbers of certificates. There were over 22,000 qualifications other than GCSE and A level and over 1,000 qualifications in GCSE/A level available on the Register for the 2012/13 academic year. Of these, 53 per cent of qualifications other than GCSE and A level and 81 per cent of qualifications in GCSE/A level had certificates.

Of the qualifications that registered no certificate during the year, some qualifications would have passed their expiry date and no longer been available to new students (although available for certification). Others would have become available during the

year but students might not have registered or may not have completed the qualifications. Of those qualifications other than GCSE and A level with no certificates, over 40 per cent were over three years old.

Table 2 highlights that a high proportion of certificates are concentrated in relatively few qualifications. Half of all certificates in available⁹ qualifications other than GCSE and A level come from 253 qualifications¹⁰ and three quarters of all certificates come from just 7 per cent of all qualifications that registered a certificate in 2012/13.

For qualifications in GCSE and A level this concentration is slightly less pronounced with 13 per cent of qualifications accounting for 75 per cent of total certificates.

Certificates for all qualifications

Overall picture

Figure 5 shows the total numbers of certificates for the last five academic years. Between 2008/09 to 2012/13, the number of certificates increased by 15 per cent to 17.88 million.

Between 2011/12 to 2012/13 certificates increased by 4 per cent. Certificates in qualifications other than GCSE and A level increased by 4 per cent, and GCSE certificates also increased by 4 per cent. Certificates in A level and AS qualifications increased by less than 1 per cent.

The main reason for the increase in total certificates over the past five years has been a 27 per cent increase in the number of certificates in qualifications other than GCSE and A level. The majority of this increase is due to new QCF qualifications and functional skills. The increase in certificates in qualifications in the preparation for life and work sector subject area accounts for 36 per cent of the increase in certificates in qualifications other than GCSE and A level.

Awarding organisation share of certificates

Figure 6 shows the trends in the total number of certificates for all qualifications for the 20 awarding organisations which reported the highest volume of certificates for 2011/12 to 2012/13. (Table 13 in the appendix shows the number of certificates for the period 2008/09 to 2012/13.) These organisations have awarded over 90 per cent of all certificates in the past five years.

The five largest awarding organisations by number of certificates – Pearson, AQA Education (AQA), OCR, City & Guilds of London Institute (City & Guilds) and WJEC-CBAC – have awarded over 75 per cent of certificates in each year, for the past five years. Among these five, OCR awarded fewer certificates in 2012/13 than in 2011/12 (13 per cent lower). Over the five-year period OCR awarded 16 per cent fewer. Over the same period Pearson had an increase in certificates of around 50 per cent.

Council for Awards in Care, Health and Education (CACHE) and Cambridge International Examinations are now in the 20 largest awarding organisations by number of certificates. CACHE had a significant increase in the number of certificates in qualifications relating to the knowledge and skills needed when working with children and young people. These qualifications were required by those taking Children and Young People's Apprenticeships.

Fourteen of the 20 largest awarding organisations by number of certificates reported an increase in the number of certificates between 2011/12 and 2012/13. Of these, NCFE had the largest increase in absolute terms (over 140,000 certificates; 45 per cent) with its qualification in Level 3 Certificate in the Principles of End of Life Care (QCF) showing the biggest increase. In addition NCFE's increase in certificates was also linked to a range of short vocational courses offered in schools.

Cambridge International Examinations had the largest percentage increase – growing by 210 per cent to 110,200. This is increase has mainly come from their first language English qualification.


Six of the 20 largest awarding organisations by number of certificates reported a reduction in the number of certificates between 2011/12 and 2012/13. Of these four Award Scheme Development and Accreditation Network (ASDAN) had the biggest reduction of 15 per cent owing to issuing fewer certificates for key skills qualifications. The single largest contributor to this change was the reduction in certificates in its Level 2 Key Skills in Improving Own Learning and Performance qualification. Key skills qualifications were being phased out and increasingly replaced by functional skills qualifications. Functional skills qualifications are requirements of apprenticeship frameworks and replaced key skills qualifications from October 2012.

Of these 20 awarding organisations, Cambridge International Examinations and Highfield Awarding Body for Compliance (HABC) showed the largest percentage increase in the number of certificates between 2008/09 to 2012/13; whilst Cskills Awards showed the largest reduction. HABC's increase was mainly driven by a number of new qualifications that first awarded within the period. This included a Level 2 Award for Upskilling Door Supervisors and a Level 2 Award in Emergency First Aid at Work (the latter gives students a licence to practise).

Certificates in GCSE qualifications

Figure 7 shows that the GCSE market has been relatively static. In 2012/13 the biggest annual change was a 1 per cent increase in market share for Pearson and a 2 per cent reduction for OCR. AQA had the highest market share over the entire period. The largest three organisations account for over 80 per cent of all certificates awarded. Note that ICAAE had a share too small (500 certificates in 2012/13) to appear on this graph.

Certificates in GCSE subjects




Figure 8: Distribution of GCSE certificates by subject for 2012/13

Figure 8 shows the distribution of certificates across different subjects for GCSE qualifications in 2012/13. The ten subjects with the highest number of certificates remained the same as in 2011/12. GCSEs in biology, French, chemistry and physics are the next subjects outside those in Figure 8. Certificates awarded in maths (1.3 million) were considerably higher than English (0.8 million) in 2012/13. This reflected

the extent of double entry in the summer of 2012/13 - 44 per cent in maths 11 per cent in English.¹¹

Total certificates in 2012/13 relative to 2008/09 are relatively static but this does not illustrate considerable variability at subject level. Of the ten largest subjects by number of certificates, there has been an increase in the number of certificates in maths, history, geography and art & design. Outside these ten subjects there has been increase in the number of certificates in biology, chemistry, physics and Spanish, reflecting the change in demand of subjects due to the English Baccalaureate (EBacc)¹² performance measure introduced by the government.

The distribution of GCSE qualifications across awarding organisations

Table 14 in the appendix highlights the variability of subject market shares between awarding organisations. AQA's market share in virtually all of its subjects in which it has certificates is in the top two by awarding organisation. The exceptions are health and social care and history. Pearson also has a significant proportion of its subjects

in the top two, with nine exceptions which include English and English literature, science and additional science.


Some of the key changes between 2011/12 and 2012/13 are increased market shares for AQA in biology, chemistry, physics and additional science with reductions for OCR.

Certificates in A level and AS qualifications

A levels are currently¹³ made up of advanced subsidiary (AS) units and A2 units. This section shows data and trends in the distribution of certificates of AS and A levels across awarding organisations. It also highlights high-volume AS and A level qualifications for 2012/13.

Certificates at AS

Figure 9 shows that changes in market share across awarding organisations over the period 2008/09 to 2012/13 have been negligible. AQA has the highest market share in 2012/13 at 43 per cent which is similar to the share it has in the GCSE market. The largest three organisations account for around 90 per cent of all certificates awarded.

Certificates in AS subjects

Figure 10 shows certificates by subject for AS qualifications in 2012/13. The ten largest subjects by number of certificates, and their rankings by certificate, are largely unchanged since last year. However, this year, certificates in physics were higher than those in business studies.

Certificates at A level

Figure 11 shows that changes in market share across awarding organisations over the period 2008/09 to 2012/13 have been negligible. AQA consistently awarded the largest proportion of certificates over the period with its market share in 2012/13 at 42 per cent.

Certificates in A level subjects




Figure 12: A level certificates by subject in 2012/13

Figure 12 shows certificates by subject for A level qualifications in 2012/13. The ten largest subjects by number of certificates, and their rankings by certificate, are largely unchanged since last year. However, this year certificates in chemistry were higher than those in history. The number of certificates in chemistry increased by 7 per cent in 2012/13: the biggest subject increase in these ten largest qualifications. Within these ten subjects the only decline in the number of certificates was in art & design and business studies.

Certificates in qualifications other than GCSE and A level

This section shows certificates in qualifications other than GCSE and A level¹⁴ by sector skills area, by qualification level and qualification type.

Distribution of certificates for qualifications other than GCSE and A level by awarding organisations

Unlike A level, AS and GCSE, where the largest three organisations (AQA, Pearson and OCR) account for the majority of certificates, other qualifications are not as concentrated. This is due to the number of awarding organisations specialising in niche qualifications within few sectors.

Figure 13 shows certificates by awarding organisation for 2012/13, and the change in the number of certificates between 2011/12 and 2012/13 for the ten awarding organisations with the highest number of certificates. Pearson has over a quarter of all certificates. OCR's share of certificates fell by 3 per cent last year. The largest ten organisations account for nearly three-quarters of all certificates.

NCFE and NOCN had significant increases in the number of certificates of 45 per cent and 34 per cent respectively. NCFE's increase was due to certificates in qualifications in two sector skills areas: Health, Public Services and Care, and Preparation for Life and Work. NOCN's increase in certificates resulted from qualifications in the preparation for life and work sector skills area. OCR had the biggest reduction in certificates (23 per cent) last year, and has reduced the number of qualifications it offers. The reduction was mainly in certificates of key skills, basic skills and OCR National in ICT qualifications which no longer attract funding.

In the last five years the total number of certificates increased from 7.3 million to 9.2 million (27 per cent). A key factor in this increase was the introduction of the QCF where certificates increased from 220,000 in 2008/09 to 6.2 million in 2012/13. Changes in the accountability framework that recognised certain vocational qualifications taken in schools for performance table purposes is also likely to have been a factor in driving the increase in certificates. Pearson has the highest number of certificates. The number of certificates it awarded over the period increased by over one million (72 per cent). Pearson accounted for 54 per cent of the increase in certificates, with increases in certificates in QCF qualifications being the largest factor. NCFE and NOCN have significant increases in the number of certificates awarded between 2008/09 and 2012/13 (134 per cent and 93 per cent respectively). The Chartered Institute of Environmental Health (CIEH) has seen the largest reduction over the five years.

Cambridge International Examinations (Cambridge International) is in the 20 largest awarding organisations by number of certificates this year whilst Skillsfirst Awards has dropped out. Cambridge International's increase is due to schools switching from GCSE qualifications to Level 1/2 qualifications (known as IGCSEs) and entering IGCSE as well as GCSE, particularly in English.

Certificates by sector skills area

Figure 14 shows the number of certificates by the 15 sector skills areas for 2011/12 to 2012/13. (Table 18 in the appendix shows the number of certificates for the period 2008/09 to 2012/13.)

The preparation for life and work sector skills area continues to provide the highest volume in terms of certificates with over three million in 2012/13, representing just under one-third of all certificates in qualifications other than GCSE and A level. Seven of the 20 largest qualifications by number of certificates other than GCSE and A level come from this sector skills area. In 2012/13 there were nearly one million certificates in the QCF in this sector. Outside of the QCF, functional skills and key skills qualifications provided the most certificates in the sector.

Health, Public Services and Care is now the second largest sector, a 28 per cent increase in certificates last year meant it was the fastest growing sector. A number of new qualifications assessing first aid became available this year – offered by Qualsafe Awards (QA), First Aid Awards Ltd (FAA), HABC, and CIEH – and students have begun to receive certificates in these qualifications this year, which partially explains the recent growth.

Science and maths was the fastest growing sector over the five-year period, with nearly a threefold increase in certificates. The year on year increase in this sector was largely due to a greater number of certificates in Level 2 BTEC Applied Science qualifications and Level 1/Level 2 qualifications in Maths.

Distribution of certificates across awarding organisations by sector skills area for qualifications other than GCSE and A level

Although there are over 170 awarding organisations providing regulated qualifications, most of them do not provide qualifications across many sector skills areas.

Table 3 shows the distribution of 93 per cent of all certificates in qualifications other than GCSE and A level across the largest five awarding organisations by number of certificates in 2012/13 for each sector skills area.

Only three awarding organisations appear in more than half of the 15 sector skills areas in Table 3. Pearson appears in 13, City & Guilds in 9 and OCR in 8.

In each sector skills area, the three largest awarding organisations by number of certificates account for more than 50 per cent of certificates. In three sector skills areas, the two largest awarding organisations account for 90 per cent or more of the certificates. The two largest awarding organisations by number of certificates account for 50 per cent or more of the certificates in 13 sector skills areas, and over 80 per cent in two sector skills areas. In eight of the sector skills areas, the most dominant awarding organisation awarded over one-third of certificates, and over 50 per cent in four.

The business, administration, finance and law sector skills area has the greatest number of awarding organisations with certificates. Level 2 qualification certificates account for 47 per cent of all certificates in qualifications other than GCSE and A level. The number of certificates awarded in Level 1_2 qualifications (known as Level 1/2 Certificates or IGCSEs), which are taken as an alternative to GCSEs, increased by nearly 300 per cent last year.

Certificates by qualification type

The significant upward trend has continued in both the number of QCF qualifications, and certificates in those qualifications, since many awarding organisations have revised their qualifications in the NQF¹⁶ to meet the requirements of the QCF¹⁷. The focus of the Skills Funding Agency since August 2010 to fund vocational qualifications in the QCF has been a major influence in this trend. Certificates in QCF qualifications account for over two-thirds of all certificates in qualifications other than GCSE and A level. Functional skills qualifications is the largest qualification type in the NQF by certificates. Their increased demand reflects the change in funding that has also led to the decrease in basic skills and key skills qualification certificates.



Whilst the number of certificates in QCF qualifications increased in 2012/13, the increase was smaller than the year before. Certificates increased by 18 per cent from 5.3 million in 2011/12 to 6.2 million in 2012/13. Table 20 in the appendix shows the number of certificates for the period 2008/09 to 2012/13 and shows that Pearson had an increase of nearly 1.8 million certificates over the last five years (28 per cent of the total increase).

Although certificates increased in nearly all sector skills areas, some were at much faster rates than others. Preparation for life and work is now the largest sector skills area in the QCF, increasing by over 300,000 certificates (an increase of 46 per cent) in the last year.

Number of certificates in the QCF by level

Figure 21 shows certificates by level within the QCF framework for 2011/12 and 2012/13. It shows that there were increases in the number of certificates awarded in all levels of qualifications, with over half of the certificates at Level 2 last year. QCF certificates by size: award, certificate and diploma

Qualifications that use the QCF rules are made up of units. Each unit has a credit value which tells you how many credits are awarded when a unit is completed. Units build up to qualifications. There are three different types of qualification in the QCF: award, certificate and Diploma. You can achieve an Award with 1 to 12 credits; for a Certificate you will need 13 to 36 credits and for a Diploma you will need at least 37 credits. Figure 22 shows the distribution across these types of qualification.

Award level remains the most commonly achieved qualification. This can be used as a stepping stone to a larger qualification. The proportions remain largely unchanged from last year.

The 20 largest QCF qualifications by certificates

The CIEH Level 2 Award in Food Safety and Catering remains the QCF qualification with the most certificates. All except one of the 20 largest qualifications are at either Level 1 or 2. This can be seen in Figure 49 in the appendix. NCFE's Level 1 Award in Learning to Learn was a 'new entry' to the 20 largest qualifications this year. The ten largest QCF qualifications by number of certificates also appear in the list of 20 largest qualifications other than GCSE and A level earlier in the report (Figure 48 in the appendix).


Certificates in functional skills qualifications

Functional skills qualifications assess the practical skills that allow people to use English, maths, and information and communication technology (ICT) in real-life contexts, and are currently included in apprenticeship frameworks.

There are 16 awarding organisations that awarded certificates in functional skills in 2012/13. Pearson and City & Guilds awarded three-quarters of all functional skills certificates last year.

Figure 23 shows the increase in the number of certificates awarded in functional skills qualifications over the past five years. Certificates before the 2010/11 academic year were for pilot functional skills qualifications.

Certificates in both Pearson and City & Guilds functional skills qualifications have increased by over 300,000 since 2008/09.

Demand for qualifications: participation in education and training

The demand for qualifications comes from those who use them: namely students, parents, employers, and further and higher education institutions. Although demand originates with these users, the immediate purchasers of qualifications are generally schools, colleges and independent training providers who offer qualifications as part of the learning package they provide to their students.

This section explores the level of participation in education and training provided by schools, colleges and independent training providers in England, Wales and Northern Ireland.

Participation in education

This part of the report looks at the trends in participation in education for those students taking qualifications up to the age of 18. There are many factors influencing the level of participation. Some examples are government policy, such as increasing the level of post-16 education by raising the participation age, increased employer demand for particular skills and qualifications, cohort sizes influenced by birth rates, and the costs of studying for qualifications.

Although there is a link between the level of participation in education and training and the number of qualifications achieved, this may not be proportionate to the participation rate since the number of qualifications an individual takes can vary. Changes in the demand for different types and size of qualifications, as well as access to funding may influence choices by students, schools, colleges and employers.

16-18 participation in England

The Department for Education (DfE) collects data for participation rates in England. It includes the three years of education and training after the age of 16 which the state funds. It includes students who are studying for degrees, although they are not included in any qualification data since Ofqual does not regulate degrees.

Figure 24 shows the number of 16- to 18-year-olds in education and training in 2011 and 2012. (Table 23 in the appendix shows the participation numbers for the period 2007 to 2012.) The estimates relate to a snapshot of activities at the end of the calendar year, and are based on academic age, defined as 'age at the start of the academic year'.

The fall of 1 per cent in the number of students in full-time education in 2012 was slightly larger than the fall in population of 0.7 per cent, due to changes in the number of students in employment and employer-funded training. There was a change in trend in the number of 16- to 18-year olds in employment, with an increase of 5 per cent in 2012, against a fall of 32 per cent over between 2008 and 2012. Employer-funded training increased by 9 per cent in 2012, against a fall of 10 per cent between 2008 to 2012.

Figure 25 shows the participation rate of 16- to 18-year-olds in education and training in England.

Figure 25 shows a slight increase in the participation rate for 16- to 18-year olds in education and training. The annual increase in 2012 was smaller than in each of the years from 2007. DfE states the fall in full-time education was driven mainly by a large fall at age 18 (-4.3 per cent), most of which was due to lower participation in higher education institutions.

In 2012, for the second consecutive year, the fall in full-time male participation of 0.8 per cent was larger than the fall in cohort (0.5 per cent). The fall in full-time female participation at 1.1 per cent was slightly larger than the cohort fall of 0.9 per cent. The fall in students who are not in any education, employment or training (NEET) was larger for females (7.5 per cent) than for males (4.8 per cent) in 2012. (Table 24 in the appendix shows the participation numbers for the period 2007 to 2012).

There are more females than males in full-time education and the gap remained the same at 5.5 per cent in 2012. This gap has narrowed from 7.1 per cent in 2007. The gap in NEETs remains at 1.7 per cent more males than females.

Table 4 shows the rise in the proportion of students attaining Level 2 or higher by age 19 was driven by the rise in attainment by age 16, up 3.2 per cent between 2012 and 2013. The proportion of students attaining Level 2 by taking vocational qualifications continued to fall, whether that was outside of apprenticeships (from 12 to 10.6 per cent) or within apprenticeships (from 3.7 to 2.9 per cent).

The previous table highlights the trend of a greater proportion of students achieving Level 3 attainment by age 19. Vocational qualifications outside apprenticeships accounted for 17 per cent of Level 3 attainment by 2013—a notable increase from 3 per cent in 2004.

16-18 participation in Wales




Figure 29: Percentage of 16- to 18-year-olds in education in Wales

There were 4.3 million students participating in further education in England in 2012/13, three-quarters of whom were adult learners (students aged 19 or over). The increase in adult learners of 4.2 per cent between 2011/12 and 2012/13 was the first since the 2008/09 academic year. There were 3.3 million students achieving a government-funded further education qualification in 2012/13, with adult learner certificates increasing by 8.7 per cent between 2011/12 and 2012/13. The most common level for both participation and certificate remains Level 2.

Qualifications in schools and school sixth forms

This section of the report considers qualifications in schools, including qualifications other than GCSEs and A levels. The types of schools included are: secondary comprehensive or middle community, voluntary aided/controlled; secondary selective community, voluntary aided/controlled; secondary modern community, voluntary aided/controlled; secondary comprehensive or middle foundation; secondary selective foundation; secondary modern foundation; independent; and academies.

Schools in England have seen a recovery in the number of certificates at GCSE in the past couple of years from their low in 2010/11. Certificates awarded in Wales and Northern Ireland reduced slightly by 0.5 per cent and 1 per cent respectively in 2012/13 on the year before, and fell by 4 per cent and 5 per cent respectively over the last five years.

Figure 31 shows that the largest increases in certificates last academic year were in geography (20 per cent), history (17 per cent) and French (15 per cent), reflecting the change in demand of subjects due to the English Baccalaureate (EBacc) performance measure introduced by the government. The subjects with the largest decreases last year were design and technology (9 per cent), religious studies (7 per cent) and science (7 per cent). The fall in science was due to more separate sciences being studied, as reflected in the increases in biology, chemistry and physics of 8 per cent, 7 per cent and 4 per cent.

Table 27 in the appendix shows that over five years certificates have increased in art and design subjects by over 250 per cent and have fallen in design and technology by 38 per cent. The trend to study separate sciences is reflected in the increase in biology, chemistry and physics of 80 per cent, 84 per cent and 80 per cent respectively in the last five years, and the fall in additional science of 27 per cent.

In England there was an increase in AS certificates of 2 per cent between 2011/12 and 2012/13 and 24 per cent between 2008/09 and 2012/13. There was little change in A level certificates over both these periods. In Wales there was a reduction in certificates for both AS and A levels between 2011/12 and 2012/13 of 1 and 4 per cent respectively, and falls 2 per cent and 8 per cent respectively between 2008/09 and 2012/13. In Northern Ireland the number of certificates awarded in AS qualifications fell by 6 per cent between 2011/12 and 2012/13. A levels were largely unchanged.

Figure 34 shows that the science subjects have had big increases in the number of certificates awarded between 2011/12 and 2012/13. This trend is also apparent over five years (see Table 29 in the appendix). Factors influencing this trend would be an increase in the uptake of separate sciences at GCSE, increase in participation age and guidance provided by Russell universities over 'facilitating subjects' which are more frequently required to enter these universities. The subject showing the biggest increase over one year was economics of 9 per cent, with the next two, chemistry and physics, showing 8 and 6 per cent respectively. There was a reduction in the number of certificates awarded in general studies (7 per cent) and English (3 per cent).

Table 29 in the appendix shows that over five years the certificates awarded in mathematics and chemistry increased by around 60 per cent. Other subjects with large increases in the number of certificates awarded were physics, economics and biology of 44 per cent, 50 per cent and 42 per cent respectively. Certificates awarded in general studies reduced by 8 per cent over five years, and is the only high-volume subject to show reductions over one and five years, due to changes in funding, and being a less valuable subject for entrance to university.

Economics and chemistry had the biggest increases in number of certificates awarded last academic year of 9 per cent and 5 per cent respectively. The biggest reductions in the number of certificates awarded were in general studies, media/film/TV studies and art and design subjects of 11 per cent, 8 per cent and 6 per cent respectively.

Over five years the biggest increases were in geography and chemistry of 80 per cent and 53 per cent respectively. The largest reductions were in general studies, business studies and media/film and TV studies of 37 per cent, 14 per cent and 12 per cent respectively.

There were over 1.8 million certificates for qualifications other than GCSE and A level in schools in 2012/13. Changes in funding and performance measures may have led to the first reduction in England for these qualifications of 9 per cent last year. Wales also showed a decrease of 8 per cent, with Northern Ireland increasing by 44 per cent.

Pearson awarded over a third of the 1.9 million certificates recorded in qualifications other than GCSE and A level, with OCR providing a further 23 per cent, although its number of certificates fell by 14 per cent last year. There was a distinct difference between Northern Ireland and the other countries, as the Council for the Curriculum, Examinations and Assessment does not operate outside Northern Ireland, where it is the largest awarding organisation. Changes in funding and performance measures in England may lead to further falls in the number of qualifications other than GCSE and A levels taken in schools.

The OCR Level 2 National First Award in ICT continued to be the most commonly achieved qualification in schools, but it was not the most commonly achieved qualification in both Northern Ireland and Wales, where numbers of all these qualifications were low in comparison to England. Ten of Pearson's BTEC qualifications were in the 20 largest qualifications by number of certificates.

The qualifications in Table 10 represent 39 per cent of all certificates in qualifications other than GCSE and A level in schools. Changes to the list of qualifications for inclusion in school performance tables from 2015 onwards mean that most of these qualifications will no longer be taken in schools or will have been re-designed to be included in performance tables.

Further education and the skills sector

Qualification certificates by funding streams

This section of the report uses the Individualised Learner Record (ILR). This is a database containing information about students and learning programmes that is collected from learning providers in the further education and skills sector in England by the Skills Funding Agency (SFA). The ILR provides information on the sources of funding for qualifications offered by learning providers in the further education and skills sector. Learning providers who receive funding directly from the SFA or the Education Funding Agency ²⁷ are required to submit ILR returns.

The further education and skills sector includes: further education colleges, sixth form colleges, former external institutions, independent learning providers, local authorities and voluntary and community organisations. Data is collected each year for the period 1st August to 31st July. This report contains data for the year 1st August 2011 to 31st July 2012.

For the year 1st August 2012 to 31st July 2013, three main sources of public funding for qualifications were offered by learning providers in the further education and skills sector. These sources of funding²⁸ were:

- 16-18 Learner Responsive Funding
- Adult Learner Responsive Funding
- Employer Responsive Funding

16-18 Learner Responsive Funding

This funding covers all students in the 16-18 age range:

- in colleges and other providers (not schools) following further education programmes such as GCSEs and A levels;
- taking Diplomas;
- undertaking Foundation Learning programmes.

Adult Learner Responsive Funding

This funding covers classroom learning for students aged 19 or over who are undertaking full- or part-time courses in the day or evening, including provision for full Level 2 and Level 3 qualifications, as well as other types of courses such as provision for the unemployed.

Employer Responsive Funding

This funding covers learning delivered by colleges and training providers either wholly or partially in the employer's workplace and classroom learning delivered by training organisations.

Workplace learning is defined as:

- any learning predominantly delivered in the workplace and in connection with an employed student's occupation or his/her employer's business;
- any learning in an apprenticeship framework;
- basic skills in literacy and numeracy delivered to an employed student, supported by his/her employer.

Classroom learning is learning not defined as workplace learning.

The main findings from the ILR data are:

- For the year 1st August 2012 to 31st July 2013 the ILR recorded nearly 5 million certificates; an increase in certificates of over 400,000 (over 9 per cent). The majority of this increase came from Employer Responsive provision and Adult Learner Responsive provision with increases of 16 per cent and 21 per cent respectively. (Figure 36).
- 2. The Skills Funding Agency (SFA) or the Education Funding Agency (EFA) funded 94 per cent of certificates through 16-18 Learner Responsive provision (LRP), Adult Learner Responsive provision (ALRP) or Employer Responsive provision (ERP), including Employer Responsive provision as part of an apprenticeship programme. Funding through routes other than the SFA and EFA was only available for a small proportion of certificates.




Figure 37: The 20 regulated qualifications with the most certificates between 1st August 2011 and 31st July 2012 funded by 16-18 Learner Responsive provision

- 3. The 20 qualifications with the highest number of certificates funded by 16-18 Learner Responsive provision accounted for 59 per cent of all the certificates in those qualifications. This represents quite a large reduction since last year when the top 20 accounted for 78 per cent of certificates in those qualifications, due to a smaller proportion of certificates in functional skills qualifications taken in 16-18 LRP. Half of the qualifications in the 20 with the highest number of certificates are

functional skills by type, with two AS and two GCSE qualifications. Seven qualifications were at Level 1 and the highest number of certificates was in NCFE Level 1 Award in the Learning to Learn qualification. (Figure 37).

- 4. The 20 qualifications with the highest number of certificates funded by Employer Responsive provision accounted for 72 per cent of all the certificates in those qualifications. Twelve were key skills qualifications by type, and five were functional skills qualifications. Half of the qualifications were at Level 1.The increase in the number of certificates awarded in functional skills qualifications is due to them becoming a mandatory component of all apprenticeship frameworks from October 2012. (Figure 38).
- 5. The 20 qualifications with the highest number of certificates funded by Adult Learner Responsive provision accounted for 45 per cent of all the certificates in those qualifications. Seven of these qualifications were at Level 1, and NCFE qualifications took the top five places in terms of certificates. (Figure 39).

Qualifications taken in apprenticeships

Each apprenticeship programme consists of a programme aim, one main learning aim and one or more component learning aims. The programme aim is the complete learning framework. The main learning aim is the competency-based qualification. The component learning aims are the knowledge and key/functional skills qualifications.

- 1. There is considerable variation between awarding organisations in the proportion of total certificates that were awarded in apprenticeships. For example NCFE's apprenticeship certificates accounted for 4 per cent of its total certificates whilst EAL's accounted for 67 per cent. Pearson and City & Guilds accounted for a significant number of the certificates in apprenticeships (80 per cent) with Pearson accounting for nearly half of the certificates. (Figure 40).




Figure 41: The 20 regulated qualifications with the most certificates between 1st August 2012 and 31st July 2013 funded by Employer Responsive provision (main aim as part of an advanced apprenticeship programme)

- 2. The three largest qualifications in terms of certificates funded by the Employer Responsive provision (main aim as part of an advanced apprenticeship programme) were in Health and Social Care. (Figure 41).
- 3. Over half of the 20 qualifications with the highest number of certificates funded as the main aim of an intermediate apprenticeship relate to Business Skills or Customer Service qualifications. (Figure 42).
- 4. Key skills accounted for 74 per cent of certificates in the top 20 qualifications funded by the Employer Responsive provision in advanced apprenticeships (key

skills, basic skills and functional skills only). This is changing, as functional skills qualifications replaced key skills qualifications as a mandatory component of all apprenticeship frameworks from 1st October 2012. Numeracy and Communication are the subjects with the highest number of certificates. (Figure 43).

- Business and management, customer services and social care qualifications provide most of the certificates for the 20 largest qualifications by number of certificates in advanced apprenticeships (other types of qualifications). (Figure 44).
- 6. Thirteen of the 20 qualifications with the highest number of certificates funded by the Employer Responsive provision in intermediate apprenticeships (key skills, basic skills and functional skills only) were key skills; the other seven were functional skills qualifications. The trend away from key skills is set to continue due to the changes mentioned under Figure 8. (Figure 45).
- 7. Over half of the certificates funded by the Employer Responsive provision in intermediate apprenticeships (other types of qualifications) were in principles of business and administration, customer service or adult social care qualifications. (Figure 46).

Figure 36: Analysis of funding sources for qualifications offered by learning providers in the further education and skills sector, 1st August 2012 to 31st July 2013

Background notes

In this release, Ofqual presents data on both the supply side and demand side of the qualifications market. On the supply side it reports on the number of recognised awarding organisations, the qualifications that were available in the period covered and the certificates in those qualifications. On the demand side it reports on the participation rates in England.

The certificate data in this release covers England, Wales and Northern Ireland with the exception of the sections on further education and the skills sector (page 60) where the data is for England only.

Data source

Information on qualifications is taken from Ofqual's Register. The Register is used by awarding organisations to submit qualifications for accreditation and maintain details of these qualifications. Ofqual uses the Register for regulatory activity. The data submitted by the awarding organisations includes information on qualifications, covering title, type, awarding organisation, sector skills area and level. This information is regarded as administrative data. Ofqual cannot amend this information – it is the responsibility of the awarding organisations. Where Ofqual sees anomalies in the data it requires awarding organisations to correct their information. Available qualifications are taken from the Register and awarding organisations are asked to send the associated certificates awarded.

Each quarter, all recognised awarding organisations submit data to Ofqual about the number of certificates they have awarded for non GCSE and A level qualifications in England, Wales and Northern Ireland, regardless of the age of the student and the type of school or college. Certificates are counted in the quarter when the qualification was awarded. This release shows the number of awards broken down by awarding organisation, sector skills area, type of qualification, level of qualification and country.

The number of qualifications and certificates awarded in all specifications for GCSEs, AS and A levels taken in England, Wales and Northern Ireland is sent to Ofqual annually by the Joint Council for Qualifications (JCQ). GCSE certificates cover full course, short course, applied double and applied single awards. A level also includes A level applied double award and A level applied single award. Similarly AS also includes AS applied double award and AS applied single award. The data has been cleaned to exclude candidates who achieved grade U or were absent. This data source will be referred to as 'JCQ data' throughout the report.

Subject level analysis based on subject categories is used by JCQ when publishing exam results. Tables may be sourced from either JCQ data or the combined data

depending on the statistics presented. If the JCQ data has not been matched this is reported as 'JCQ data (unmatched)'.

The number of qualifications and certifications for qualifications other than GCSE and A levels in schools has been collected from awarding organisations. This data is provisional and will become final in the next annual qualification market report. This data source is referred to as 'Ofqual – schools data'.

Data is requested annually from learning providers in the further education and skills sector by the Data Service on behalf of the Information Authority. This data source is referred as the 'ILR' throughout the report. The ILR includes both funded and unfunded qualifications data. For the purpose of this report Ofqual has extracted data for funded qualifications only, with the permission of the Data Service.

Data for participation rates in England is collected by DfE. It is the source for the data on participation and education and training data for 16- to 18-year-olds in England (*Statistical First Release SFR 22/2013*²⁹), and for Level 2 and Level 3 attainment data for 19-year-olds in England (*Statistical First Release SFR10/2014*³⁰).

The Skills Funding Agency is the source for student participation and certificate in further education data in England (*Statistical First Release SFA/SFR23*³¹).

The Welsh Government publishes data on participation rates of 16-to 18-year olds in education used in this report. The data for participation rates for Northern Ireland was published by the Department of Education in Northern Ireland (DENI) until 2011.

Limitations of data

Certification data for non GCSE and A level qualifications are collected at the earliest point available, which is the first day of the next reporting period. This reduces the time between the activity and reporting on the activity.

Ofqual cannot guarantee that the number of certificates sent are correct, although it expects awarding organisations send correct data. Summary data is sent to awarding organisations for checking and confirmation. The figures reported in this release are reflective of the certificates issued by awarding organisations at the time of data collection.

Ofqual carries out quality assurance procedures to ensure the accuracy of the data and challenge or question it where necessary. The publication may be deferred if the statistics are not considered fit for purpose.

This is the first time that Ofqual has collected schools data for qualifications other than GCSE and A levels. This is still being reviewed and quality assured and so the data is classified as provisional statistics within this report. These will become final statistics in the next edition.

Geographical coverage

The certificate data in this release covers England, Wales and Northern Ireland with the exception of the following sections, where the data is for England only:

- Qualifications in schools and school sixth forms (page 48); and
- Further education and the skills sector (page 60)

Revisions

Once published, data on the number of certificates issued for any qualification is not usually subject to revision, although subsequent releases may be revised to insert late data or correct an error. Qualifications may also be re-categorised to a different type, level, sector skills area or awarding organisation. In some cases, data may be amended to reflect the new categorisation.

The awarding organisations Edexcel and EDI merged to form Pearson Education Ltd, so qualifications by EDI no longer appear separately.

Completeness of the data

All awarding organisations with regulated, available qualifications have been included.

Confidentiality

To ensure confidentiality of the raw data published online, the number of certificates awarded for qualifications other than GCSE and A level has been rounded to the nearest five. If the value is less than five, it is represented as 0~ and 0 represents zero certificates.

Rounding

Figures in the commentary and tables for the number of certificates issued are rounded to the nearest 100 for ease of use. As a result of rounded figures, the percentages shown in any pie charts may not necessarily add up to 100. The numbers of qualifications have been left as exact figures.

Users of these statistics

These statistics are of particular interest to recognised awarding organisations who use these statistics for product development and business development strategies, and to gain insight into market share. Other users include the DfE and the Examination Officers Association.

Related statistics and publications

This statistical release presents annual data. There will be some overlap between the figures in this release and those in Ofqual's two quarterly publications: *Vocational and Other Qualifications Quarterly*³² and the *Higher Level Qualifications Quarterly*³³ release.

A number of other statistical releases and publications relate to this one, including:

- The Statistical First Release: GCSE and Equivalent Results in England 2011/12,³⁴ published by the DfE, which covers students' certificates in GCSEs and equivalent regulated qualifications in schools at the end of Key Stage 4. The Statistical First Release: A Level and Equivalent Results in England, 2011/12³⁵ covers certificates for 16- to 18-year-old students at schools and colleges in all Level 3 qualifications. These releases can be used to add context to the trends seen in Level 2 and Level 3 A level, AS and GCSE equivalent qualifications.
- The quarterly *Statistical First Release*, ³⁶ published by the Department for Business, Innovation & Skills, reports on apprenticeship volumes that cover statistics on adult (19+) government-funded participation, certificate and success rates for further education, and apprenticeships participation and certificates for all ages (16+) in England. It also shows figures on certificates issued for vocational qualifications in the UK, as collected by Ofqual and through the National Vocational Qualifications Database.

- The Statistical First Release: Participation in education, training and employment by 16-18 year olds in England, 37 published by the DfE, reports on participation in education, training and employment and those who are not in education, employment or training (NEET) for 16-, 17- and 18-year-olds in England. It provides information on different post-16 learning options (schools, further education (FE) colleges, Work Based Learning (WBL), higher education, etc).
- The Statistical First Release: Level 2 and 3 attainment by young people in England measured using matched administrative data: attainment by age 19 in 2013,³⁸ published by the DfE, provides information on the proportion of young people in England who attain Level 2 and Level 3 qualifications by the age of 19. It provides information at national level and analyses this information by institution and qualification type.

The raw data behind these certification statistics are available on Ofqual's website.³⁹ There you will also find a detailed guidance document and further information on data collection.

A glossary of terms is available in the next section to help you interpret this release.

You can find Ofqual's publication schedule for the next releases on it's website. 40 Ofgual's Statistical Publications Glossary provides further details on sector skills area classifications and qualification types and levels, and is available on Ofqual's website.41

The Register gives information on regulated qualifications and recognised awarding organisations in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. 42

Glossary of terms

A levels – also known as General Certificates of Education, are available as advanced level qualifications (A levels) and advanced subsidiary (AS). They are the main qualifications that young people use to gain entry to university.

Accreditation – a process that reviews and confirms certification to specific criteria and standards.

Accredited qualification – a qualification that has met the relevant criteria as set by the regulators of qualifications in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. Once approved for accreditation, a qualification will be awarded with a Qualification Accreditation Number, and specific dates set for the period for which the qualification will be accredited.

Active qualification – a qualification where a certificate has been awarded.

Available qualification – a qualification eligible for an award or a qualification that has made an award, even if it is no longer eligible (no longer available for students to enrol on). For the purpose of this release, a qualification is available until the certification end date or if an award has been certified during the reporting period.

Awarding organisation – an organisation recognised to develop, deliver and award descriptions of qualifications.

Certificate/certification – a formal acknowledgement of a student's certificate. This will be any award that is not graded as U (unclassified), absent or X (fail).

Certification end date – the last date on which a student may be issued with a certificate of certificate for the qualification.

GCSEs – General Certificates of Secondary Education are the main school-leaving qualification in England. They are available in a range of subjects and can be studied alongside other qualifications. They are generally sat by 15- to 18-year-olds in schools and colleges but are open to anyone who wants to gain a qualification.

Level – qualifications are assigned a level from Entry Level, then Level 1 through to Level 8 (equivalent to a doctorate).

National Vocational Qualifications (NVQs) – work-related, competence-based qualifications that cover a broad range of industry sectors and occupations, and are delivered in a workplace setting.

Other general qualifications – qualifications that assess a particular subject area, such as music or art, other than GCSEs, AS and A levels. These qualifications are not directly work-related but may support career development. They are often structured against graded exams. The category also includes qualifications at Level 1/Level 2, also known as IGCSEs.

Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF) – provides students, learning providers and employers with an inclusive and flexible regulated qualifications

framework, containing units and qualifications that recognise the widest possible range of quality-assured student certificates. There are three different types: Award (1 to 12 credits), Certificate (13 to 36 credits) and Diploma (37 or more credits).

Quarter – refers to calendar quarters. Quarter 1 (Q1) refers to January to March, quarter 2 (Q2) to April to June, quarter 3 (Q3) to July to September, and quarter 4 (Q4) to October to December.

Recognition – the formal process which Ofqual operates, whereby applicants who wish to offer regulated qualifications can demonstrate that they meet the recognition criteria. ⁴³ It is a robust gateway into the regulated marketplace. Only applicants who meet the criteria in full will be recognised.

Register – the Register of Regulated Qualifications contains details of recognised awarding organisations and regulated qualifications.

Regulated qualifications – when a qualification is accredited (see definition above), it is then said to be regulated.

Vocationally-related qualifications – work-related, competence-based qualifications designed to give students the skills and knowledge they need to do a job. They are related to employment but, unlike NVQs, do not necessarily require a work placement.
