



## Destination Measures 2010/11 and 2011/12

**Impact Indicator [14]: Percentage of children on free school meals progressing to any university**

### About the indicator

This indicator measures the percentage of children who were eligible for free school meals in year 11 who took A levels or other level 3 qualifications and then progressed to any UK university.

### Why we measure it

The Government believes that progression to higher education can advance social mobility. This indicator will show if the Government's education policies are raising standards and aspirations and closing the attainment gap so that more disadvantaged young people are able to go to university.

### The data

**Impact Indicator 14: Percentage of the key stage 5 cohort<sup>1</sup> on free school meals<sup>2</sup> progressing to any university<sup>3</sup>**

**Year: 2010/11 - 2011/12**

**Coverage: Mainstream state-funded schools and colleges**
