 This is a Department for Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS) report for the 24+ Advanced Learning Loans system and contains information relating to courses starting in the 2013/14 and 2014/15 academic years.

- 2. The report contains an outline of the source of the data, headline information and tables presenting application and processing figures. Information presented is as given in application forms and is subject to change.
- 3. For the 2013/14 academic year the report covers application data from 1-31 July 2014 and cumulative data from launch of the loans system (8 April 2013) to 31 July 2014.
- 4. For the 2014/15 academic year the report covers application data from the opening of the applications system (14 April 2014) to 31 July 2014.
- 5. The next release of 24+ Advanced Learning Loans Application Information will be on 25 September 2014. This release will cover only applications for courses starting in the 2014/15 academic year, as applications for courses starting in the 2013/14 academic year closed at the end of July 2014.

Main Headlines

- The total number of applications received, from 8 April 2013 to 31 July 2014, to fund provision in the 2013/14 academic year was 70,940 (excludes ineligible applications).
- The total number of processed applications from 1-31 July 2014 for applications for Loans to fund 2013/14 provision was **1,630** (includes ineligible applications).
- The total number of applications received for the 2014/15 academic year, from 14 April 2014 to 31 July 2014, was **15,080** (excludes ineligible applications).
- The total number of processed applications from 1-31 July 2014 for applications for Loans to fund 2014/15 provision was 8,460 (includes ineligible applications).
- The largest amount of applications received from 1-31 July 2014, to fund provision in the 2014/15 academic year (**4,510**, excluding ineligible applications), was in the **24-30** age band.

Data Sources

The statistics published in this release relate to applications for 24+ Advanced Learning Loans for courses starting in the 2013/14 and 2014/15 academic years.

The data used to produce this monthly report are sourced from the Student Loans Company (SLC) application database. It should be noted that the data refer to all received applications (both unprocessed and processed, but excluding those ineligible, cancelled, deleted and in data entry) for 24+ Advanced Learning Loans. Therefore, application figures are not necessarily indicative of actual learner starts.

The data used in this report are sourced from an operational database that is updated on an ongoing basis, and therefore month to month application figures may fluctuate due to further processing of received applications. This may sometimes result in total application figures from launch in a particular table category increasing more or less than would be expected based on the previous month's submitted applications, or even decreasing from one month to the next.

As a part of the Skills Funding Statement released on 10th February 2014, it was announced that **Apprenticeships are to be removed from the 24+ Advanced Learning Loans system, and regulations came into force on 7th March 2014.** However, data from applications for Loans to fund Apprenticeships in the 2013/14 academic year are to be included in this report until they are removed from the SLC applications system.

Other Related Statistics

On Thursday 26th June 2014 the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills published the Further Education and Skills Statistical First Release, which contains figures relating to learners participating in FE in the first three quarters of the academic year (August 2013 to April 2014, provisional) who were funded through the 24+ Advanced Learning Loans system.
