

Statistical notice: Schools' preparations for the New National Curriculum

This statistical notice gives results from a question submitted by The Department for Education to NFER which was included in the Teacher Voice Omnibus Survey (and a Senior Leader Booster Survey) between March and May 2014.

The question asked whether the school had started to prepare to teach the new national curriculum.

Senior leaders were asked to respond to this question and 1430 responded: 625 in primary schools and 805 in secondary schools. The schools that responded to the survey were largely representative of schools nationally in terms of school type (including academies), region and LA type. However, there was a slight over-representation of the highest achieving schools at both primary and secondary level.

Table 1 gives the percentage of school leaders, by school phase, who said their school had started preparations for the new National Curriculum at the time of the survey, and those who said their school had not started such preparations.
