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## Enrolments at schools and in funded pre-school education in Northern Ireland 2013/14 (revised)

(Figures detailing pupils entitled to free school meals and enrolments (Tables 1b, 1c, 3a and 3b) have been revised to correct for a miscount in primary/prep departments and nursery classes. Figures relating to ethnicity (table 6a) have also been revised). Enrolment data from the 2013/14 annual school census was released in December 2013. The purpose of this statistical release is to present a more detailed analysis of enrolment figures for schools in Northern Ireland. The data are taken from the school census exercise, which ran in October 2013.

Data collected through the school census exercise are used by policy branches within the Department of Education (DE) and by others across the education service, most notably by the Education and Library Boards (ELBs). The main driver for the school census is to create a statistical database to inform a wide range of policy areas, including: finance allocations; school estate development and planning; special education, school improvement; area based planning; extended schools, additional educational needs; early years; and integrated and Irish medium schools. The data are also the basis of a number of responses to Assembly questions and are used in the ELB auditing process. Other users include the Education and Training Inspectorate, in preparation of background material for schools inspections. The data also inform responses to requests from various sources, including academic researchers, journalists, lobby groups and the public.

## KEY POINTS

## Schools in Northern Ireland

- The number of schools in Northern Ireland continues to decrease. In October 2013, there were 825 primary schools in Northern Ireland, a decrease of 31 since October 2008. The number of post-primary schools was 210, compared to 223 in 2008. This decrease is accounted for by a drop in the number of non-grammar schools (table 2b).



## Funded pre-school education

- There are 23,507 children in funded pre-school education (table 1a). This has increased by approximately 2,500 pupils since 2006/07.
- The majority of pupils in funded pre-school provision attend nursery schools or nursery units in primary schools $(14,804)$. Pupils enrolled in nursery schools have remained steady since 2006/07, whereas there has been an increase of almost 1,000 pupils attending nursery classes within primary schools in the same period.
- Voluntary and private pre-school education centres are the next most common form of pre-school provision, with 8,360 pupils enrolled in $2013 / 14$. There has been a sharp increase of approximately 2,000 pupils in funded pre-school centres since 2006/07.
- There are 343 reception pupils in $2013 / 14$, representing just $1.5 \%$ of all funded pre-school provision. This number has almost halved since 2006/07 when there were 650 reception pupils (3.1\%).

## Grant-aided Schools

- There are 162,253 pupils in primary schools and preparatory departments (Year 1-7) (table 1c). This is an increase of more than 3,300 pupils compared to last year, and 7,800 compared to 2010/11 which had the lowest primary school enrolment in recent years. 2013/14 has the highest number of primary school pupils recorded since 2005/06.
- There are 143,973 pupils in post-primary schools (Years 8 - 14) (table 1c). This has steadily decreased by almost 4,000 pupils since 2010/11 and 1,700 pupils since last year. It is in fact the lowest post-primary enrolment recorded in over twenty years.
- The decrease in post-primary enrolments is attributable to a decrease in non-grammar school enrolments. The number of pupils attending grammar schools has, however, remained consistent over the last few years and stands at 62,634 this year. Given the declining overall post-primary enrolment, a greater proportion of pupils are attending grammar schools than before ( $43.5 \%$ in 2013/14 compared to $41.6 \%$ in 2006/07).
- The decline in post-primary school enrolments, however, masks a steady rise in the number of pupils in post-year 12. Some 30,917 year 13 and 14 pupils attend post-primary schools in 2013/14, and this is approximately a $20 \%$ increase on ten years ago.


- 21,745 pupils ( $6.9 \%$ of the total enrolment in primary and post-primary schools) attend integrated schools (table 1e). This continues to increase; enrolments in integrated schools have risen by almost 2,400 in the last six years. Much of this increase is attributable to a rise in integrated primary school enrolments. However, the rate of increase has slowed in recent years; just 250 more pupils attend integrated schools than last year.
- A total of 4,907 pupils (1.5\% of pupils in grant-aided nursery, primary and post-primary schools) participate in Irish medium education (table 1d). 3,913 pupils attend Irish medium schools with a further 979 pupils attending Irish medium units attached to English-medium schools. The total number of pupils in Irish medium education has steadily risen over time, increasing by almost 1,000 pupils since 2008/09 and almost 300 pupils since last year. Most of this increase is coming from greater enrolments in Irish medium schools rather than units.
- A quarter (25.2\%) of pupils in primary and post-primary schools are entitled to free school meals (table 3b), similar to the proportion recorded in the last few years. Some 31.1\% of year 1-7 pupils in primary schools and
preparatory departments are entitled - an increase from 30.0\% last year. There has also been an increase in the proportion pupils in funded preschool education (including reception) entitled to free school meals ${ }^{1}$, rising from $22.6 \%$ in $2012 / 13$ to $23.9 \%$ this year. Free school meal entitlement stands at $18.5 \%$ of pupils in post-primary schools, and this breaks down to 27.1\% of pupils in secondary (non-grammar) schools and $7.4 \%$ of grammar school pupils. There has been a slight drop in the proportion of nongrammar pupils entitled compared to 2012/13 (27.8\%).
- The average number of pupils per class in primary schools (year 1 year 7) was 24 (table 4), and this has remained largely static over the last few years. Average class sizes differ depending on school type, from 18 in preparatory departments and 19 in Irish medium schools, to 27 in grant maintained integrated schools.
- The reported religion of pupils has remained broadly consistent over time. The breakdown is as follows: 166,758 (51.1\%) Catholic, 118,101 (36.2\%) Protestant, 9,679 (3.0\%) Other Christian, 2,227 (0.7\%) Non Christian, and 29,440 (9.0\%) No Religion/Not recorded. (Table 5b).

- The reported ethnicity of pupils in schools is $96.7 \%$ white (excluding Irish Travellers), with 3.3\% pupils of mixed or minority ethnic groups (Table 6b).
- $21.7 \%$ of pupils in schools were recorded as having special education needs; $4.7 \%$ of pupils had a statement of special educational needs (Table 7). The number of pupils with special educational needs has steadily risen over time, with almost 2,000 more special educational needs pupils and approximately 700 more statemented pupils compared to last year. Much of this increase has been pupils in mainstream schools as opposed to pupils in special schools.

## School Census

The statistics in this press release have been derived from the annual School Census; details about the survey may be found at http://www.deni.gov.uk/census description for web 1314 r.docx For preschool centres and nursery schools the Census consists of a paper return comprising a number of tables; for primary, special and post-primary schools, it consists of a return comprising individual pupil records, made by Electronic Data Interchange. The tables presented in the release reflect key information on enrolments, as determined by Departmental needs and also on requests for information from other sources.
5. The 2013/14 figures in this press release are based on information as at 11th October 2013. They may be subject to minor revision and these will be notified in accordance with our revisions policy. This can be accessed at http://www.deni.gov.uk/de statement on statistical revisions-2.doc.
6. The figures for nursery classes relate to approved nursery classes in primary schools. The figures for reception refer to pupils who were below compulsory school age at 1 July 2013, who were admitted to a reception class or group in primary school following their $4^{\text {th }}$ birthday. Schools may admit reception pupils throughout the year, but only those who have been admitted by 31 October are counted in the school census.
7. The figures for pre-school children in this release relate to children in funded pre-school education. Previous releases included small numbers of children in non-funded pre-school places in preparatory departments of grammar schools. While previous statistical releases have not been revised to take account of this minor change, time series and other tables
available on the Education statistics section of the DE website have been revised, so that the figures are consistent in definition and relate to children in funded pre-school education.
