

Attainment of the basics at age 11

Impact Indicator 1: Percentage of pupils achieving level 4 or above in reading, writing and mathematics

About the indicator


This indicator measures the percentage of all eligible pupils at the end of key stage 2 (typically age 11) who achieved level 4 or above in all of reading, writing and mathematics.

Why we measure it

The Government believes it is important that all pupils reach acceptable standards of literacy and numeracy. Ministers expect the majority of pupils to achieve at least level 4 in reading, writing and mathematics by the end of KS2. This indicator shows the percentage of pupils who have achieved that level in all these subjects.

The data

Reading, writing and maths replaced English and maths in 2013 as the combined headline indicator. Comparable data for reading, writing and maths is only available from 2012.
