## **About this consultation**

Sir Martin Narey writes:

The Prime Minister and Secretary of State for Education have asked me to lead an independent review of residential care. I am delighted to have this opportunity.

The aim of this review will be to examine the purpose and role of residential care. I intend to explore the following:

- the types of residential care that are currently provided, in order to understand the full range of provision which is available and when and for which young people it is best used
- what works within residential care settings to improve outcomes for the young people placed in them
- what improvements could be made to the way that residential care provision is commissioned, delivered, regulated and inspected to improve outcomes and value for money
- whether there are better alternatives for some of the children who are currently in residential care
- any other issues which might contribute to better outcomes for children in care

The review is due to report in the spring of 2016.

I would like my findings to be informed by as wide a range of views and evidence as possible. I am therefore launching a call for evidence. I would like to hear from people running or working in children's homes and other residential settings, whether regulated or unregulated, including secure children's homes, residential schools, secure training centres and young offender establishments. I would also like to hear from children, young people, parents and carers alongside local authorities, representative bodies from across the sector and academics with an interest in this issue and others. The views of those in residential care and adults who have left residential care would be particularly valuable.
