

Travel to/from School by Post Primary Pupils: NI 2013

Findings from Young Person's Behaviour and Attitudes Survey (YPBAS) 2013





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Introduction

The Department for Regional Development (DRD) has a key interest in the travel methods of young people. It leads the Travelwise NI¹ initiative which aims to promote sustainable methods of travel such as walking, cycling, public transport or car sharing.

Travelwise NI is an integral part of DRD's Transport Policy, Strategy and Legislation Division and delivers its programmes in partnership with TransportNI, the Department of Education, the Department of the Environment Road Safety Branch, Sustrans, the Public Health Agency and Translink.

Travelwise NI encourages schools, pupils and parents to investigate the benefits of replacing the daily school run by walking and cycling to/ from school where possible. In partnership with the Public Health Agency, it also funds the Active School Travel programme which delivers walking and cycling skills to both primary and post primary school children and supports schools to promote active travel.

The Travelwise NI initiative contributes to the DRD 2011- 2016 Programme for Government (PFG) target, to "*create the conditions to facilitate at least 36% of primary school pupils and 22% of post primary school pupils to walk or cycle to school as their main mode of transport*".

This report presents key findings from the 'Travelling to School' module of the Young Persons' Behaviour and Attitudes Survey, carried out between October and December 2013. The results from 3,164 post primary school pupils are based on data which has been weighted by year group, gender and religion in order to reflect the composition of the Northern Ireland post primary population (aged 11 to 16). It provides statistics on the methods of travel of post primary school pupils to/from school and their attitudes to walking and cycling to/from school. This information will be used to monitor the effectiveness of the Travelwise NI Initiative aimed at increasing the proportion of children who travel actively to school.

Key Points


- Just over a third (34%) of the 3,164 respondents live at least 3km from their school and a fifth (20%) live less than 0.8km from their school.
- Of the 3,164 respondents almost half (46%) travel <u>most</u> of the way to school by bus, almost a third (32%) by car, almost a fifth (19%) walk and 1% each said they travel by bicycle, taxi or train.
- Half (50%) of respondents travel <u>most</u> of the way home from school by bus, a quarter (25%) walk, over a fifth (21%) travel by car and 1% each said they travel by bicycle, taxi, train or other.
- Almost a fifth (18%) of respondents walk all of the way to school, almost two fifths (38%) walk part of the way and over two fifths (43%) don't walk any part of the journey to school.
- Just over a fifth (22%) of respondents walk all of the way home from school, over two fifths (43%) walk part of the way and over a third (35%) don't walk any part of the journey home from school.
- One in fifty (2%) respondents each cycle all or part of the way to school. The majority (96%) don't cycle any part of the journey to school.
- One in fifty (2%) respondents each cycle all or part of the way home from school. The majority (95%) don't cycle any part of the journey home from school.
- The main factor that would encourage pupils to walk (58%) or cycle (42%) to or home from school more often was 'living closer to school'.
- The majority of respondents said they felt safe when thinking about how they usually travel <u>most</u> of the way to school (93%) or home from school (92%).
- Just over a third (35%) of respondents travel by car to or from school with siblings, just over an eighth (13%) with friends/other pupils and a fifth (20%) who travel by car do not travel with siblings or friends/other pupils. Just over a third (34%) do not travel to or home from school by car.
- Just under half (47%) of respondents qualify for free school transport (e.g. free school bus/train pass). Almost four fifths (78%) of these pupils use it every day.

Results

1. Distance from home to school.

- Just over a third (34%) of the 3,164 respondents live at least 3km from their school, almost a fifth (17%) live at least 0.8km but less than 1.6km, just over an eighth (13%) live at least 1.6km but less than 2.4km and almost an eighth (12%) live at least 2.4km but less than 3 km.
- A fifth (20%) of respondents live less than 0.8km from their school.

2. Mode of travel most of the way to or home from school.

Respondents were asked 'How do you usually travel <u>most</u> of the way to school and home from school?'

2.1 To school.

• Of the 3,164 respondents almost half (46%) travel <u>most</u> of the way to school by bus, almost a third (32%) by car, almost a fifth (19%) walk and 1% each said they travel by bicycle, taxi or train.

2.2 Home from school.

• Half (50%) of respondents travel <u>most</u> of the way home from school by bus, a quarter (25%) walk, over a fifth (21%) travel by car and 1% each said they travel by bicycle, taxi, train or other.




Figure 2: Travel mode for most of the way to*/from** school

3. Walking and cycling to or home from school.

Respondents were asked 'Do you usually walk or cycle during any part of your journey to/from school? (e.g. walk/cycle to/from a bus stop/train station)',

'What do you like about walking/cycling to/from school? If you don't walk/cycle to/from school at the moment, what would you like about walking/cycling to/from school?' and all 3,164 pupils were asked 'Which, if any, of the following would encourage you to walk to or from school more often?'

3.1 Walking to school.

• Almost a fifth (18%) of respondents walk all of the way to school, almost two fifths (38%) walk part of the way and over two fifths (43%) don't walk any part of the journey to school.

3.2 Walking home from school.

• Just over a fifth (22%) of respondents walk all of the way home from school, over two fifths (43%) walk part of the way and over a third (35%) don't walk any part of the journey home from school.


3.3 Cycling to school.

• One in fifty (2%) respondents each cycle all or part of the way to school. The majority (96%) don't cycle any part of the journey to school.

3.4 Cycling home from school.

• One in fifty (2%) respondents each cycle all or part of the way home from school. The majority (95%) don't cycle any part of the journey home from school.


3.5 What do you like about walking to or from school?

Almost two fifths (38%) of pupils said that they liked or would like to walk to or home from school because 'I can talk with my friends'. Almost three tenths (28%) said 'I can travel without an adult', over a quarter (26%) cited 'I can choose my own route', almost a quarter (23%) said 'it makes me feel healthier', almost a fifth (18%) said 'I can do things on my way to school', approximately a sixth (17%) answered 'it saves money, just under a sixth (16%) said 'it is enjoyable', just under a seventh (14%) replied 'I can do things after school', just over an eighth (13%) said 'it helps me to arrive on time' and over a tenth (11%) stated 'it is better for the environment'. Almost one in twenty (4%) said something else.

3.6 What do you like about cycling to or from school?

- One fifth (20%) of pupils each said they liked or would like to cycle to or home from school because 'it is enjoyable' or 'it makes me feel healthier'. Almost a fifth (18%) said 'I can choose my own route', approximately a sixth (17%) answered 'I can travel without an adult', just over an eighth (13%) said 'it saves money', over a tenth (12%) each responded 'it helps me to arrive on time' or 'I can talk with my friends', approximately a tenth (11%) said 'it is better for the environment', 7% cited 'I can do things on my way to school' and 6% said 'I can do things after school'. Almost one in twenty (4%) said something else.
- Three tenths (30%) said 'nothing would make me cycle to school'.

Figure 4: What do you like about walking* or cycling** to/from school?



3.7 What would encourage you to walk to or home from school more often?

- Almost three fifths (58%) said that 'living closer to school' would encourage them to walk to or home from school more often. Over a third (34%) stated 'lf I did not have things to carry (school bag, P.E. kit, musical instruments, etc)', three tenths (30%) cited 'better weather', under a quarter (23%) said 'someone else to walk with', almost a fifth (18%) stated 'less traffic', approximately a sixth (16%) said 'more footpaths', just under a seventh (14%) said 'wider footpaths', just over an eighth (13%) replied 'more pedestrian crossings', a tenth (10%) of respondents each said 'keeping footpaths clear (e.g. no parked cars)' or 'better maintained footpaths', almost a tenth (9%) stated 'slower traffic', 7% said 'if I was not worried about crime/personal safety' and 1% said something else.
- A seventh of respondents (14%) said 'I already walk to or from school most days'.
- Just over a tenth (11%) said 'nothing would encourage me to walk to or from school'.

Figure 5: Which, if any, of the following would encourage you to walk to/from school more often?*



3.8 What would encourage you to cycle to or home from school more often?

- Just over two fifths (42%) said that 'living closer to school' would encourage them to cycle to or home from school more often. Over a fifth (21%) each stated 'lf I did not have things to carry (school bag, P.E. kit, musical instruments, etc)' or 'better weather', a fifth (20%) said 'cycle lane on my route to school', almost a fifth (17%) stated 'less traffic', just over an eighth (13%) said 'safer cycling routes (e.g. more markings, signs to distinguish cycle lanes)', over a tenth (11%) each replied 'keeping cycle lanes clear (e.g. no parked cars)' or 'more bicycle docks at school so bicycle can be secured', a tenth (10%) said 'motorists who are more considerate to cyclists (e.g. taking more care when overtaking)', almost a tenth (9%) stated 'slower traffic', less than one in twenty (4%) replied 'if I was not worried about crime/personal safety', 2% each said 'changing and showering facilities at school' or said something else.
- One percent of respondents said 'I already cycle to or from school most days'.
- Just over three tenths (31%) said 'nothing would encourage me to cycle to or from school'.

4. How safe do you feel when travelling to or home from school?


All 3,164 respondents were asked 'Thinking of how you usually travel <u>most</u> of the way to or home from school and your road safety, do you usually feel safe?' Only those respondents who said they felt unsafe were asked 'What is it that makes you feel unsafe travelling to or home from school?'


4.1 To school.

• Thinking about how they usually travel <u>most</u> of the way to school, the majority of pupils (93%) said they feel safe.

4.2 Home from school.

• Thinking about how they usually travel <u>most</u> of the way home from school, the majority of pupils (92%) said they feel safe.


4.3 Reasons for feeling unsafe when travelling to school.

Of the 189 respondents who said they felt unsafe travelling to school, almost half (45%) said 'driver drives too fast', a third (33%) stated 'other driver behaviour', a quarter (25%) answered 'traffic is too fast', almost a quarter (23%) cited 'passenger behaviour', a fifth (20%) said 'no seatbelts', almost a fifth (19%) each stated 'traffic blocking footpaths', 'drivers attitudes towards pedestrians' and 'footpaths poorly maintained', a seventh (14%) said 'drivers attitudes towards cyclists' and a twelfth (8%) said 'no cycle lane on my route'. Just over a tenth (11%) of respondents gave another reason for feeling unsafe when travelling to school.

4.4 Reasons for feeling unsafe when travelling home from school.

Of the 235 respondents who said they felt unsafe travelling home from school, just over two fifths (41%) said 'driver drives too fast', almost a quarter (24%) stated 'other driver behaviour', just over a fifth (21%) said 'traffic is too fast', a fifth (20%) said 'drivers attitudes towards pedestrians', approximately a sixth (16%) stated 'passenger behaviour' and 'footpaths poorly maintained', just over an eighth (13%) each stated 'no seatbelts' and 'traffic blocking footpaths', a tenth (10%) stated 'drivers attitudes towards cyclists' and one in twenty (5%) replied 'no cycle lane on my route'. Almost a sixth (16%) of respondents gave another reason for feeling unsafe when travelling home from school.

5. How do you like to travel most of the way to or home from school?

All 3,164 respondents were asked 'How do you like to travel <u>most</u> of the way to or from school?'

• The largest proportion of pupils said they like to travel <u>most</u> of the way to or from school by bus (37%) or car (36%). Just over a fifth (21%) said they like to walk, 3% like to travel by bicycle and 1% each like to travel by taxi or train.

Figure 9: How do you like to travel most of the way to/from school?*






6. Travel to or home from school by car.

All respondents were asked 'If you travel by car to or from school, do any other pupils travel in the car with you?'

- Just over a third (35%) of respondents travel by car to or from school with siblings, just over an eighth (13%) with friends/other pupils and a fifth (20%) who travel by car do not travel with siblings or friends/other pupils.
- Over a third (34%) of respondents do not travel to or from school by car.







7. Free school transport.

All respondents were asked 'Do you qualify for free school transport?' and those who qualify for free school transport were asked 'How often do you use free school transport to/from school?'

• A smaller proportion of pupils (47%) qualify for free school transport (e.g. free school bus/train pass) than those who do not (51%).

- Of the 1,484 pupils who qualify for free transport, the majority (78%) use it every day, a tenth (10%) use it a few times a week, 1% each use it once a week, once a fortnight or once a month.
- Almost a tenth (8%) use free school transport less than once a month.




Figure 12: How often do you use free school transport to/from school?*

Appendix A: User Information

The Central Survey Unit of the Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency was commissioned by a consortium of government departments and public bodies to design, conduct and report on a study of the behaviour and attitudes of young people in Northern Ireland.

The Young Persons' Behaviour and Attitudes Survey (YPBAS) is a school-based survey carried out among 11-16 year olds and covers a wide range of topics relevant to the lives of young people today.

The main aim of the YPBAS is to gain an insight into, and understanding of, their behaviour and lifestyle. It also aims to influence various government policies and practices relating to young people and to facilitate access to research findings and expertise.

Questionnaire

Two versions of the questionnaire were used to accommodate demand for topics on the 2013 survey. The content and structure of each questionnaire was agreed in consultation with clients. Schools were randomly assigned one version of the questionnaire.

A copy of the DRD questions on 'Travelling to School' are attached in Appendix C.

Methodology

A stratified random sample of 179 schools was selected from a list of all post-primary schools in Northern Ireland and 75 of these participated, resulting in a response rate of 42%. One class in each of the five year groups (years 8-12) was then randomly selected to take part in the study. A total of 3,164 pupils completed Version A (response rate 85%) and 3,902 pupils using Version B of the questionnaire (response rate 86%). DRD's questions on travelling to school were included in Version A.

Confidence intervals

3,164 pupils completed Version A - this is the sample. No sample is likely to precisely mirror the characteristics of the population it is drawn from and a confidence interval represents the range of values in which the true population value is likely to lie. It is based on the sample estimate and the confidence level (in this case 95%).

s.e. (p) = √(p*(100-p)/n)

A 95% confidence interval for the population percentage can be calculated using the following formula. This means that if 100 similar, independent samples were chosen from the population, 95 of them would yield a percentage within this range of values.

95% confidence interval = p + - 1.96 * s.e. (p)

For example, the 95% confidence interval for pupils who travel <u>most</u> of the way to school by bus is 46% +/- 2%. This means that there is a 95% probability that the proportion of Northern Ireland pupils (aged 11 to 16) who travel <u>most</u> of the way to school by bus lies between 44% and 48%.

Multiple response

For multiple response questions (i.e. more than one answer can be given), percentages may add to more than 100% as more than one answer can be given.

Rounding of figures

In tables where figures have been rounded to the nearest final digit, there may be an apparent slight discrepancy between the sum of the constituent items and the total shown.

Appendix B: Confidence Intervals

A confidence interval represents the range of values in which the true population value is likely to lie. It is based on the sample estimate and the confidence level.

As the percentages are calculated from a representative sample of the Northern Ireland school pupil population (aged 11 to 16), a confidence interval can be calculated to estimate the level of uncertainty in the sample estimate.

Table B1 below summarizes the confidence intervals for the young persons behaviour and attitudes to travelling to school.

- 19% of respondents walk <u>most</u> of the way to school. Calculating a 95% confidence interval from the results of the survey, it can be estimated that between 18% and 20% of the Northern Ireland population (aged 11 to 16) walk <u>most</u> of the way to school.
- The 95% confidence interval for the proportion of pupils who travel <u>most</u> of the way to school by bus is 46% +/- 2%. This means that there is a 95% probability that the proportion of pupils in Northern Ireland who travel <u>most</u> of the way to school by bus lies between 44% and 48%.
- 93% of respondents said they feel safe travelling to school. Calculating a 95% confidence interval from the results of the survey, it can be estimated that between 92% and 94% of the Northern Ireland population (aged 11 to 16) feel safe travelling to school.
