

Learner Satisfaction Survey 2014 to 2015 National Results July 2015

# Introduction



- The Learner Satisfaction Survey 2014 to 2015 (Version 7) took place between November 2014 and March 2015.
- The survey was open to all Skills Funding Agency, Education Funding Agency funded learners or those with a 24+ Advanced Learner Loan. Those learners aged under 16, on Offenders' Learning and Skills Service (OLASS) or on Community Learning provision were excluded. Approximately 1.8 million learners were eligible to take part in the survey.
- 348,148 learners submitted a valid response.
- 95.6% of survey responses were submitted online and the remainder on paper questionnaires.

- There were 326,273 valid responses. These were linked to the Individualised Learner Record (ILR).
- The ILR was used to establish key learner and course characteristics of the respondents. Only these matched responses have been included in the National Results 2014 to 2015.

#### Response Rate

• The overall response rate was 17.9%\* and the overall confidence interval was 0.1%.

- The Learner Satisfaction survey has nine scoring questions where learners are asked to rate various aspects of their course, learning programme or training programme on a scale of 0 to 10 where 0 is 'very bad' and 10 is 'very good'.
- Learners were also asked two further questions. Responses to these questions were not included in the overall score.

#### These two further questions were:

- 'How good or bad has the course been at meeting your expectations?'.
   Learners could respond on a scale of 0 to 10 where 0 is 'very bad' and 10 is 'very good'.
- 'How likely is it that you would recommend the learning provider to friends or family?'. Learners could respond with the options of 'Extremely Likely', 'Likely', 'Neither Likely nor Unlikely', 'Unlikely', or 'Extremely Unlikely'.

#### The questions on the Learner Satisfaction Survey are:

- How good or bad was the information you were given when you were choosing your course?
- How good or bad was the help staff gave you in the first few weeks?
- How good or bad is the teaching on the course?
- How good or bad is the respect staff show to you?
- How good or bad is the advice you have been given about what you can do after the course?
- How good or bad is the support you get on this course?
- How good or bad are the staff at listening to the views of learners?
- How good or bad is the provider at acting on the views of learners?
- Overall, how good or bad do you think the provider is?
- How good or bad has the course been at meeting your expectations?
- How likely is it that you would recommend the learning provider to friends or family?

The report includes analysis of responses to each of the survey questions by the following variables:

- Age band and sex
- Highest level of study
- Deprivation
- Funding stream
- Provider type and size
- Ofsted grade
- Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP) area
- Sector Subject Area (SSA Tier 1) Question 9 & 11 only
- Apprenticeship Framework by SSA Tier 2 Question 9 & 11 only.


- Charts and tables in the report are based on survey responses which have been linked to the ILR.
- The charts in the report show the average (mean) scores and the percentage of learners who gave a score of 8 or higher.
- Subject scores are based on learners who are studying for at least 80% of their time in a particular subject area or the main framework aim for learners on an apprenticeship.
- All differences highlighted between groups in Key Findings are statistically significant (at the 95% Confidence Level).

How likely is it that you would recommend the learning provider to friends or family?



#### Summary of Results

- 74% of respondents gave a score of 8 or higher when asked how good or bad they thought their provider was.
- 76% of respondents gave a score of 8 or higher when asked how good or bad the teaching on their course was.
- The lowest satisfaction score given by respondents was for the quality of advice about what to do after their course has finished (67% gave a score of 8 or higher).
- 83% of respondents were 'Extremely Likely' or 'Likely' to recommend the learning provider to friends or family.

#### Results Analysis

The following sections shows the results from each of the 11 survey questions in detail.



#### Key Findings 1

- Older learners tended to be more satisfied with the information given when choosing a course. 84% of those respondents aged 60 and over gave a score of 8 or higher compared to only 66% of respondents aged 16-18.
- The lower the Level at which learners were studying, the more likely they were to be satisfied. Learners studying at Entry Level gave the highest satisfaction rating whereas Level 3 learners gave the lowest rating.
- Adult workplace learners were the most satisfied with the information they were given when choosing their course/programme and 16-18 classroom learners were the least satisfied.

#### Key Findings 2

 Learners who lived in the Liverpool City Region LEP area had the highest satisfaction rating with 78% scoring 8 or higher. In contrast, only 63% of learners living in the Gloucestershire LEP Area scored 8 or higher.

#### Key Findings 1

- The older the respondents were, the more likely they were to be satisfied with the help staff gave in the first few weeks of their course. 71% of respondents aged 16-18 gave a score of 8 or more, rising to 90% for those aged 60 and over.
- There was a close correlation between the level of deprivation and satisfaction. Respondents who lived in areas of higher deprivation tended to give higher satisfaction scores in comparison to those in less deprived areas.

#### Key Findings 2

 85% of respondents attending Other Public Funded providers and 83% of those attending Private Sector Public Funded gave a score of 8 or higher. This compares with 72% of respondents attending Special Colleges and Specialist Designated Colleges (SDCs) and General FE Colleges.

Question 3: How good or bad is the teaching on your course?



#### Key Findings 1

- 92% of respondents aged 60+ gave a score of 8 or more when rating the teaching on their course. This compares to only 69% of 16-18 year olds.
- Female respondents gave a slightly higher satisfaction score to males rating the teaching on their course.
- Level 3 learners were least satisfied with the teaching on their course and only 69% of respondents gave a score of 8 or more.

#### Key Findings 2

- Respondents living in more deprived areas were more satisfied with the teaching on their course than those living in less deprived areas.
- 93% of respondents on workplace learning gave a score of 8 or more in response to the survey question. The mean score for this group was 9.3 out of 10.

#### Key Findings 1

- Overall responses to 'How good or bad is the respect staff show to you?' had the highest satisfaction rating with 82% of all responses scoring 8 or higher.
- Over 90% of respondents aged 25 and over gave a score of 8 or higher when giving their satisfaction rating of the respect shown by staff.
- Learners studying with the highest level at Level 1 or Level
   were more satisfied than those studying at Level 3.

#### Key Findings 2

• The lowest level of satisfaction in relation to respect from staff was from respondents on 16-18 classroom based learning, where only 74% gave a score of 8 or more. This compares to over 90% for 19+ apprenticeships and workplace learning.

#### Key Findings 1

- Satisfaction with the advice given about what to do after the course was overall much lower than the other questions.
   This was even more evident when looking at the 16-18 age group where only 60% of respondents gave a score of 8 or more which resulted in a mean score of 7.7.
- The satisfaction ratings were highest at the lower levels (81% scored 8+ at Entry Level) compared to the higher levels (62% scored 8+ at Level 3).
- There are differences in satisfaction between the deprivation bands, with the highest rating in the most deprived band (72% scored 8+ in the most deprived band compared to 61% in the least deprived band).

#### Key Findings 2

• Respondents in Liverpool City Region LEP area had the highest level of satisfaction with the advice given by their college or training provider (76% scored 8+) whereas respondents in the Gloucestershire LEP area were the least satisfied (56% scored 8+).

- The pattern of responses to this question closely follows the previous question ('How good or bad are the college staff at listening to the views of learners?'). However the level of satisfaction for 'acting on the views of learners' is slightly lower, at 67% (scoring 8 or more).
- Satisfaction increased with age group. 58% of 16-18 year olds gave a response of 8 or higher for this question, compared to 74% of 19-24 year olds, and over 80% for the older respondents.
- Again females have a higher satisfaction score than males for this question.

- Overall satisfaction with the provider is highest among older learners, whilst satisfaction amongst the youngest age group (16-18) is lowest at 67% (scoring 8 or more).
- Female learners are more satisfied with their provider than male learners.
- Respondents studying with a highest level at Entry Level are significantly more satisfied (88% of respondents scored 8 or higher) than those studying at Level 3+ (68%).
- Satisfaction is highest for respondents living in areas identified as having higher levels of deprivation.

- Respondents on apprenticeships and workplace learning are more satisfied than those who are classroom based. This is also evident in that 'Private Sector Public Funded' providers have a higher satisfaction rating since these providers tend to have apprenticeship and workplace provision.
- The satisfaction rating of providers which have been given the top OFSTED grades are higher than respondents attending providers with an inadequate Ofsted grade.

 There are wide differences in satisfaction levels between apprenticeship frameworks. For example, 'Retailing & Wholesaling' has the highest satisfaction (93% of respondents score 8 or more) whilst the lowest satisfaction was in 'ICT Practitioners' (71% of respondents score 8 or more).
