BIS Prevent advisers

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The Counter-Terrorism and Security Act 2015 contains a duty on specified authorities to prevent people from being drawn into terrorism. This is known as the 'Prevent Duty'.

Specified authorities, including higher and further education institutions, must comply with the Prevent Duty. This includes non-publicly funded providers with over 250 students.

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About BIS Prevent advisers

Under the Counter Terrorism and Security Act, the Secretary of State has the power to nominate advisers to monitor compliance with the Prevent duty in non-publicly-funded further education providers. A team of 5 advisers have been recruited from a wide range of backgrounds, including a background in safeguarding in one of the following:

- further education institutions
- police
- Muslim communities / interfaith relations
- local authorities
- community development and cohesion
- governance and leadership

Monitoring

The BIS Prevent advisers monitor independent and private training providers who don't receive public funding. They monitor any further education institution that meets the following criteria:

- over 250 students who are undertaking courses in preparation for examinations related to qualifications regulated by the Office of Qualifications and Examinations Regulation
- non-publicly funded

Other further education institutions may also be monitored if a referral is upheld by BIS.

The advisers:

- monitor the policies which providers have in place to comply with the Prevent duty
- provide advice on providers' compliance to the Secretary of State for BIS

Other further education institutions may also be inspected if a referral is upheld by BIS.

The advisers:

- monitor the policies which providers have in place to comply with the duty
- provide advice on providers' compliance to BIS Secretary of State
