Stakeholder update

Publication: 2018 primary assessment video

We have published our 2018 primary assessment video on the <u>STA media and training site</u>. The video is accompanied by a PowerPoint presentation which local authorities and schools can use for additional staff training.

The video outlines the minor changes that come into effect this year for assessment at both key stages 1 and 2. It also summarises changes that will come into effect over the next few years following the 2017 public consultation on primary assessment.

Reminder: recruitment for temporary STA external moderator roles

Each year, STA carries out external moderation visits to a sample of local authorities (LAs) to observe and scrutinise their moderation processes and standards.

At the end of January, temporary vacancies to support the delivery of STA's 2018 external moderation of LA's teacher assessment processes, for the early years foundation stage, key stage 1 and key stage 2 will go live on REDIMO2.

If you wish to apply, you will need to have registered with REDIMO2 before the

vacancies go live.

Details of how to register are available <u>here</u>. Registration is a 4-part process. Each stage must be completed fully in order to access these vacancies.
