## Qualifications and Destinations of Northern Ireland School Leavers 2017/18

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This statistical bulletin presents an analysis of the GCSE and A-level qualifications and destinations of pupils leaving post-primary schools in 2017/18.

## Key Points

- The proportion of school leavers achieving at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}$ - C or equivalent has increased by 6.7 percentage points from five years ago, from $78.5 \%$ in 2012/13 to $85.2 \%$ in 2017/18.
- At $70.6 \%$, the proportion of school leavers achieving at least five GCSEs at grades $\mathrm{A}^{*}$ - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths has increased by 1.0 percentage point since 2016/17 (69.6\%) and by 8.4 percentage points since 2012/13 (62.2\%).
- The proportion of free school meal entitled school leavers achieving at least five GCSEs at grades A $^{*}$ C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths increased by 1.1 percentage points from $47.5 \%$ in 2016/17 to $48.6 \%$ in 2017/18.
- The proportion of school leavers achieving three or more A-levels at grades $\mathbf{A}^{*}$ - C or equivalent was $40.7 \%$ in 2017/18, an increase of 4.7 percentage points from five years ago (36.0\% in 2012/13).
- The proportion of school leavers continuing on to Institutions of Higher Education, at $43.1 \%$ in 2017/18, was similar to the proportion in 2016/17 (43.3\%). Overall, $96.2 \%$ of school leavers were recorded by their school as entering Education, Employment or Training.

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## Introduction

## Uses of Qualification and Destination data

The primary reason for this data collection exercise is to create a statistical base to inform a wide range of policy areas aimed at raising standards and tackling educational underachievement. Data collected throughout this process are used by policy teams within the Department of Education (DE) and by other users across the education service, most notably by the Education and Training Inspectorate and the Education Authority. The data are used to respond to Assembly questions and are included in the Department's accountability and performance management process. The data are also used in the development, implementation and monitoring of policies, in particular the Literacy and Numeracy strategy, school improvement programmes and relevant Departmental Milestones.

## Background information

## Extension of Free School Meal eligibility criteria

In 2013/14, there were 4,054 school leavers that were entitled to free schools meals, $17.9 \%$ of all school leavers. By 2017/18, this figure has increased to $5,493,25.5 \%$ of school leavers. This increase in the proportion of school leavers with Free School Meal Entitlement (FSME) coincides with an extension of the eligibility for free school meals under the Working Tax Credit free school meal criterion. This was introduced on a phased basis with Nursery, Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 pupils eligible from September 2010 and Key Stage 2 pupils eligible from September 2011. It was extended to post-primary pupils from September 2014.

## Other information

Information reported in this bulletin may reflect outcomes associated with a range of programmes specifically targeting the literacy and numeracy of young people in those schools serving the most disadvantaged pupils ${ }^{1}$.

## Draft Programme for Government 2016-2021

School leavers data informs two indicators in the Draft Programme for Government (PfG) 2016-20213. Both indicators use the 2014/15 year as the baseline year for comparison purposes.

## Indicator 11: Improve Educational Outcomes - Percentage of school leavers achieving at level 2 or above including English and maths

Current position: In 2017/18, the percentage of school leavers achieving at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}$ - C or equivalent including GCSEs in English and maths was 70.6\%. This represents an increase of 4.6 percentage points from the 2014/15 baseline year when 66.0\% of school leavers achieved this standard.

## Indicator 12: Reduce Educational Inequality - Gap between percentage of nonFSME school leavers and percentage of FSME school leavers achieving at level 2 or above including English and maths

Current position: In 2017/18, the percentage of school leavers not entitled to free school meals achieving at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}-C$ or equivalent including GCSEs in English and maths was $78.1 \%$, while the percentage of those entitled to free school meals achieving the same measure was $48.6 \%$. This represents a gap of 29.5 percentage points between these two groups compared with a gap of 32.4 percentage points between these groups in the baseline year of 2014/15.

The change in attainment for each group was as follows:

- In $2017 / 18,48.6 \%$ of those entitled to free school meals achieved this standard, an increase from $41.3 \%$ in the 2014/15 baseline year;
- In 2017/18, 78.1\% of those not entitled to free school meals achieved this standard, an increase from 73.7\% in the 2014/15 baseline year.

## Section 1: Qualifications

### 1.15+ GCSEs $\mathrm{A}^{*}$ - C including equivalent qualifications

- The proportion of school leavers achieving at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}-C$ or equivalent has increased by 6.7 percentage points from five years ago, from $78.5 \%$ in 2012/13 to 85.2\% in 2017/18 (Table 11, Figure 1).
- As in previous years, the proportion of girls leaving school with at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}-C$ or equivalent remains higher than the proportion of boys; $89.2 \%$ of girls leaving school in 2017/18 achieved this standard compared with $81.5 \%$ of boys (Table 1, Table 12, Table 13 \& Figure 1).

- The proportion of pupils leaving non-grammar schools who achieved at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}-C$ or equivalent has increased by 11.0 percentage points from $65.2 \%$ in $2012 / 13$ to $76.2 \%$ in $2017 / 18$. The corresponding proportion for grammar schools has decreased from 97.4\% in 2012/13 to $96.1 \%$ in 2017/18 (Table 1, Appendix A \& Figure 1).
- The proportion of pupils leaving non-grammar schools who achieved at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}-C$ or equivalent has increased by 2.5 percentage points from $73.7 \%$ in $2016 / 17$ to $76.2 \%$ in 2017/18. In contrast, the proportion of pupils leaving grammar schools who achieved this standard has decreased slightly from $96.6 \%$ in 2016/17 to $96.1 \%$ in 2017/18 (Table 1).
- The proportion of school leavers with a statement of special educational need (stage 5 of the statementing process - SEN) who achieved at least five GCSEs at grades $\mathrm{A}^{*}$ C or equivalent was $60.3 \%$ in 2017/18, compared with $90.2 \%$ for those pupils without a statement of SEN. $70.1 \%$ of pupils recorded as having SEN stage 1-4 achieved this standard (Table 10). At 60.3\%, the proportion of pupils at stage 5 of the statementing process achieving this standard has increased by 6.1 percentage points since 2016/17 (54.2\%).


### 1.2 5+ GCSEs A* - C and equivalent qualifications including GCSE English and GCSE maths

- At $70.6 \%$, the proportion of school leavers achieving at least five GCSEs at grades A* - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths has increased by 1.0 percentage point since 2016/17 (69.6\%) and by 8.4 percentage points since 2012/13 (62.2\%) (Table 11, Figure 2).
- The proportion of free school meal entitled school leavers achieving at least five GCSEs at grades $\mathrm{A}^{*}$ - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths has increased by 1.1 percentage points from $47.5 \%$ in 2016/17 to $48.6 \%$ in 2017/18 (Table 5, Figure 2).
- There is a 14.6 percentage point gap between the proportion of pupils achieving at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}-$ C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths ( $70.6 \%$ ) and the proportion of pupils achieving at least five GCSEs at grades A $^{*}-\mathrm{C}$ or equivalent (85.2\%) (Table 1).
- Three-quarters (75.6\%) of girls have achieved at least five GCSEs at grades A* - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths compared with $66.0 \%$ of boys, a difference of 9.6 percentage points (Table 1, Table 9 \& Figure 2).
- In 2017/18, $94.3 \%$ of grammar school leavers left with at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}-$ C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths, while $96.1 \%$ left with at least five GCSEs at grades $\mathrm{A}^{*}$ - C or equivalent, a difference of 1.8 percentage points. The corresponding proportions for non-grammar school leavers were $51.0 \%$ and $76.2 \%$ respectively, a difference of 25.2 percentage points (Table 1, Figure 2).
- Again, looking at the difference between these two indicators, $71.4 \%$ of Catholic pupils left school with at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}-C$ or equivalent including GCSE English and maths, while $85.3 \%$ left with at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}$ - C or equivalent, a difference of 13.9 percentage points. The corresponding proportions for Protestant school leavers were $69.7 \%$ and $85.4 \%$ respectively, a difference of 15.7 percentage points (Table 3, Table 9 \& Figure 2).
- The proportion of pupils leaving non-grammar schools who achieved at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}$ - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths has increased by 1.4 percentage points from $49.6 \%$ in $2016 / 17$ to $51.0 \%$ in 2017/18. The proportion of pupils leaving grammar schools who achieved this standard decreased slightly from $94.7 \%$ in $2016 / 17$ to $94.3 \%$ in 2017/18 (Table 1).

- In 2017/18, 37.2\% (334) of Protestant boys entitled to free school meals have achieved at least five GCSEs at grades $A^{*}-$ C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths compared with $46.7 \%$ (805) of Catholic boys entitled to free school meals (Table 8). A greater proportion of both Protestant boys and Catholic boys with entitlement to free school meals have achieved at least five GCSEs at grades $\mathrm{A}^{*}$ - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths in 2017/18 when compared with 2016/17, representing an increase of 0.6 and 1.7 percentage points respectively.
- Similarly, $49.1 \%$ (397) of Protestant girls entitled to free school meals have achieved at least five GCSEs at grades A $^{*}$ - C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths compared with $57.0 \%$ (884) of Catholic girls entitled to free school meals (Table 8). When compared with 2016/17, a similar proportion of Protestant girls entitled to free school meals achieved this measure (48.9\% in 2016/17) but there was an increase of 1.4 percentage points for Catholic girls (55.6\% in 2016/17).
- Geographically the data can be analysed in terms of the school leaver's place of residence (Table 6). Analysis conducted using the 2014 District Council (DC) boundaries showed a 12.5 percentage point difference between the lowest achieving DC which was Belfast ( $65.5 \%$ ) and the highest achieving DC which was Lisburn and Castlereagh (78.0\%) when comparing those leavers achieving at least 5 GCSEs A* C or equivalent including GCSE English and maths.


### 1.3 No GCSEs/ No Formal Qualifications

- More boys (101) left school in 2017/18 with no GCSEs than girls (63), equating to $0.9 \%$ of all male school leavers and $0.6 \%$ of all female school leavers in 2017/18 (Table 1, Table 12 \& Table 13).
- When free school meal entitlement is considered, $1.6 \%$ (89) of those entitled to free school meals left without any GCSEs compared with $0.5 \%$ (75) of school leavers who were not entitled to free school meals (Table 5).
- The proportion of pupils who left school in 2017/18 without any formal qualifications has increased from $0.3 \%$ in 2016/17 to $0.6 \%$ in 2017/18. This increase applied to both male and female school leavers: an increase from $0.3 \%$ to $0.7 \%$ for boys and from $0.2 \%$ to $0.5 \%$ for girls (Table 11, Table 12 \& Table 13).


### 1.4 A-levels and equivalent qualifications

- The proportion of school leavers achieving three or more A-levels at grades $\mathrm{A}^{*}$ - C or equivalent was $40.7 \%$ in 2017/18, an increase of 4.7 percentage points from five years ago (36.0\% in 2012/13) (Table 1, Table 11).
- The proportion of school leavers achieving two or more A-levels at grades A* - E or equivalent was $56.7 \%$ in 2017/18, an increase of 1.6 percentage points from $55.1 \%$ in 2012/13 (Table 1, Table 11 \& Figure 3).
- Girls continued to outperform boys in terms of A-level qualifications achieved. In 2017/18, 48.6\% of girls achieved at least three A-levels at grades A* - C or equivalent on leaving school compared with $33.3 \%$ of boys. Girls ( $65.6 \%$ ) also outperformed boys (48.5\%) in achieving two or more A-levels at grades $A^{*}$ - E or equivalent in 2017/18 (Table 1, Table 12, Table 13 \& Figure 3).
- The proportion of non-grammar school leavers achieving at least two A-levels at grades $A^{*}$ - E or equivalent has increased by 3.9 percentage points from $34.5 \%$ in $2012 / 13$ to $38.4 \%$ in 2017/18. Some $48.8 \%$ of non-grammar school girls have achieved this standard compared with $29.1 \%$ of non-grammar school boys (Table 1, Appendix A \& Figure 3).
- The proportion of grammar school leavers achieving at least two A-levels at grades $\mathrm{A}^{*}$ - E or equivalent has decreased by 5.5 percentage points from $84.4 \%$ in 2012/13 to $78.9 \%$ in $2017 / 18$. Some $84.9 \%$ of grammar school girls left school with two or more A-levels or equivalent compared with $72.9 \%$ of grammar school boys (Table 1, Appendix A \& Figure 3).

- The proportion of pupils leaving non-grammar schools who achieved at least two Alevels at grades $A^{*}-E$ or equivalent has decreased by 2.7 percentage points from $41.1 \%$ in $2016 / 17$ to $38.4 \%$ in $2017 / 18$. Similarly, the proportion of pupils leaving grammar schools who achieved this standard decreased from 80.4\% in 2016/17 to $78.9 \%$ in 2017/18, a difference of 1.5 percentage points (Table 1).
- When religion of pupil was considered, $59.9 \%$ of Catholic school leavers achieved two or more A-levels at grades $A^{*}$ - E or equivalent in 2017/18 compared with $53.4 \%$ of Protestant school leavers (Table 3, Figure 3).
- The proportion of pupils achieving at least two A-levels at grades $A^{*}$ - E or equivalent was higher for those school leavers who were not entitled to free school meals (NonFSME) $63.6 \%$, compared with $36.5 \%$ of school leavers entitled to free school meals (FSME) (Table 5, Figure 3).


## Section 2: Destinations

The main destination of the school leaver is reported by the pupil and recorded by the school.


- In total, 43.1\% of pupils leaving school in 2017/18 entered Higher Education Institutions (HEls). At $50.7 \%$, the proportion of girls continuing on to HEls was higher than that for boys (36.0\%) (Table 14, Figure 4).
- When religion of pupil was considered, $40.0 \%$ of Protestant school leavers entered Institutions of Higher Education compared with 45.8\% of Catholic school leavers (Table 15).
- The proportion of school leavers continuing on to Institutions of Higher Education has increased slightly by 0.5 percentage points from $42.6 \%$ in $2012 / 13$ to $43.1 \%$ in $2017 / 18$. The proportion continuing on to Institutions of Further Education decreased from 34.4\% in 2012/13 to 33.5\% in 2017/18 (Table 22).
- In 2017/18, school leavers not entitled to free school meals were more likely to continue their education with $80.2 \%$ entering institutions of Higher or Further Education compared with $65.8 \%$ of leavers who were entitled to free school meals (Table 17).
- The proportion of school leavers entering employment has increased by 3.3 percentage points from $6.4 \%$ in 2012/13 to $9.7 \%$ in 2017/18 (Table 22).
- At $14.5 \%$, the proportion of boys entering Training was almost treble that of girls (5.0\%) (Table 14).
- Overall, $96.2 \%$ of $2017 / 18$ school leavers were recorded by their school as entering Education, Employment or Training. When school type was considered, 98.1\% of grammar school leavers and 94.5\% of non-grammar school leavers were recorded as having these destinations (Table 14).


## National Statistics

1. The United Kingdom Statistics Authority (UKSA) has designated these statistics as National Statistics, in accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007 and signifying compliance with the Code of Practice for Official Statistics.

Qualifications and Destinations of Northern Ireland School Leavers were assessed by the Statistics Authority in July 2010. Following work to address recommendations that were identified from the assessment (https://www.statisticsauthority.gov.uk/wp-content/uploads/2015/12/images-
assessment-report-51-schools-for-northern-ireland tcm97-33759.pdf) the
UKSA confirmed the designation of these statistics as National Statistics in June 2011.

Designation can be broadly interpreted to mean that the statistics:

- meet identified user needs;
- are well explained and readily accessible;
- are produced according to sound methods, and
- are managed impartially and objectively in the public interest.

Once statistics have been designated as National Statistics it is a statutory requirement that the Code of Practice shall continue to be observed.

6. A comparison of Northern Ireland pupils is available in an international context through the Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA). PISA, organised by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) aims to compare standards of achievement for 15 year olds in reading, mathematics and science, between participating countries. It takes place every 3 years. 2015 results $^{6}$ were published in December 2016.

8. The numbers relating to qualifications are cumulative totals of the level detailed and those above. For example, $85.2 \%$ of school leavers achieved at least 5 GCSEs at grades $A^{*}-C$ including equivalents. This proportion is calculated by adding those with a highest qualification of $3+$ A-levels, 2 A-levels, 1 A-level \& 5 GCSEs $A^{*}-\mathrm{C}$ and dividing by the total number of school leavers.
9. Destinations are reported by the school leaver and recorded by the school.
10. Since 2012/13, two AS qualifications have not been counted as one A-level as in previous years.
11.The school leaving cohort comprises of year 12, 13 and 14 pupils leaving mainstream grant aided post-primary schools. As the school leavers data collection and validation process took place in the 2018/19 academic year, it was not possible to collect or validate information for a small number of pupils who left schools that had closed at the end of the 2017/18 academic year.
12. Percentages have been rounded to one decimal place and as a consequence, some percentages may not sum to 100 .

[^3]13. School leavers FSM entitlement is usually taken at the point pupils leave school. However, a quality issue was identified with the FSM entitlement information received as part of the school leavers data collection in 2016/17. A decision was made to make use of the Department's FSM entitlement data taken from the 2016/17 annual School Census. The FSM data were collected in October 2016 and validated by the Education Authority. Therefore any impact on FSM entitlement data will be minimal. This issue related to 2016/17 data only.
