




Higher Education Statistical Fact Sheet 2: UCAS applicants and accepted applicants - 2010/11 to 2019/20

Section 1: NI Domiciled applicants applying and applicants accepted to UK institutions through UCAS – 2010/11 to 2019/20 (2010-2019 UCAS cycles)

The chart and table below provide information on the number of NI domiciled applicants applying to and accepted to UK institutions, through the UCAS process.

- Over the decade between 2010/11 and 2019/20, the number of NI domiciled applicants <u>applying</u> to UK institutions decreased by a net 4.6%, from 19,410 to 18,520. Over the same period, the number of NI domiciled applicants <u>accepted</u> to UK institutions increased by a net 3.0%, from 13,505 to 13,905.
- Between 2018/19 and 2019/20, the number of NI domiciled applicants <u>applying</u> to UK institutions decreased by 4.1%, from 19,310 to 18,520. Over the same period, the number of NI domiciled applicants <u>accepted</u> to UK institutions decreased by 1.6%, from 14,125 to 13,905.



Section 2: Applicants applying and applicants accepted to NI institutions through UCAS – 2010/11 to 2019/20 (2010-2019 UCAS cycles)

The chart and table below provide information on the number of applicants applying to and accepted to NI institutions, through the UCAS process.

- Over the decade between 2010/11 and 2019/20, the number of applicants <u>applying</u> to NI institutions increased by a net 5.4%, from 21,680 to 22,860. Over the same period, the number of applicants <u>accepted</u> to NI institutions increased by a net 9.5%, from 9,750 to 10,675.
- Between 2018/19 and 2019/20, the number of applicants <u>applying</u> to NI institutions decreased by a net 3.6%, from 23,720 to 22,860. Over the same period, the number of applicants <u>accepted</u> to NI institutions increased by a net 4.6% (10,210), compared with 10,675.
