Today the Chancellor Rishi Sunak announced a package of measures to support jobs. A total of £1.6 billion will be invested in scaling up employment support schemes, training and apprenticeships to help people looking for a job.

In addition to the 25% maximum contract value limit on supplier relief, we are aware that some providers are keen to know what their monthly funding cap will be. We can

confirm that this is now available to all eligible providers, and can be accessed by beginning a relief application on 'Submit Learner Data'. For further information you should refer to paragraph 10 of the application guidance.

4. Reminder: all new learners should start on apprenticeship standards from 1 August

learners must start on new, employer-designed apprenticeship standards. All remaining apprenticeship frameworks will be withdrawn to new learners on 31 July 2020. This follows the government's announcement on this matter in October 2018. Existing apprentices on frameworks will still be able to complete the framework,




Providers eligible to apply to the provider relief scheme are reminded that the closing date is 11.59pm this Thursday 9 July, and that their transition plan, an essential aspect of the application, should take account of all relevant guidance issued up to that date.
