5. Information: 16 to 19 tuition fund Last week we confirmed details of the 16 to 19 tuition fund for 2020 to 2021.

The 16 to 19 tuition fund is £96 million one-off funding for the 2020 to 2021 academic

year only. The funding is ring-fenced and provided to support small group tuition for 16 to 19 students in English, maths, and other courses where learning has been disrupted as a result of coronavirus (COVID-19). We have published full details of who is eligible for this funding and how it will work

during 2020 to 2021 on GOV.UK.
