- 2. The results recorder and the processing operative We have also assumed that in all settings staff testing will require one testing assistant per 5 bays and desks.
- additional qualifications or experience While the assumptions above will be used to determine funding allocations, decisions on specific requirements for staffing are for individual institutions to make.
- 2021 • this will only be available in exceptional circumstances where the funding allocation is not sufficient and after every other alternative option has been exhausted
- reasonable costs claims will also need to be supported by an invoice or other documentary evidence of the costs incurred

To calculate funding, we will estimate the number of bays and desks a school or college would have required in order to complete the number of test results recorded based on an average testing volume. We will then apply an average cost per bay.

For testing conducted in the period from 4 January up to 5 March 2021, we will make payments in April 2021 to colleges, non-maintained special schools, and local authorities and in May 2021 to academies. • independent special schools The Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) will only provide funding to institutions which are on a list of confirmed participants in the rapid testing programme provided by the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC).

Institutions will have discretion on how they spend this funding in support of testing.

We expect most of these costs to relate to workforce costs using the roles set out in the COVID-19 National Testing Programme Secondary Schools and Colleges Document Sharing Platform but we will also allow for waste disposal and minor incidental costs.
