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Local authority Skills levels in England

This analysis shows for each local authority in England the proportion of 16-64 year olds with level 3+ qualifications to support measurement of the Government's levelling up mission covering skills. This is a preliminary metric for monitoring progress against the mission, and will continue to be developed.

Data source

The data for this analysis is sourced from the Annual Population Survey (APS). The APS is a continuous household survey, covering the UK, with the aim of providing estimates of main social and labour market variables at a local area level.

The APS is not a stand-alone survey; it uses data combined from 2 waves of the main Labour Force Survey (LFS), combined with a local sample boost. Due to boosted sample sizes, the APS allows more robust analysis of sub groups such as by characteristics or lower level geography.

Measures and coverage

This analysis uses APS data for the 12 month periods ending December 2017, 2018 and 2019 published on Nomis¹ provided by the Office for National Statistics (ONS). The data have been filtered for households in England only and analysis is presented at upper tier local authority level using boundary definitions as of April 2021.

The level 3+ definition used in this analysis combines, for 16-64 year olds, the number of people with the following qualification levels^{2,3}:

- Level 4+
- Level 3 only
- Trade apprenticeships (assumed 50% of these are level 3+)
- Other qualifications (assumed 10% of these are level 3+)

Data quality

The APS provides estimates of population characteristics based on samples of the population rather than exact measures. In principle, many random samples could be drawn and each would give different results, due to the fact that each sample would be made up of different people, who would give different answers to the questions asked in

the household survey. The spread of these results is the sampling variability, which generally increases with smaller sample sizes, for this reason the analysis presented here uses the average of three years worth of APS data.
