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Following the UK Government's announcement of the Regional Innovation Fund, HEFCW has received £3.4m from the Welsh Government to support knowledge exchange and business engagement activities that further economic growth and productivity. This circular provides details of allocations of the Regional Innovation Fund to higher education institutions in Wales.

Introduction

- On 3 October 2023, the Department for Science, Innovation and Technology (DSIT) announced a £60 million Regional Innovation Fund (RIF) to support local and regional economies, commercialisation and economic growth.
- 2. Wales has been allocated £3.4 million of this funding, which HEFCW will distribute to Welsh higher education institutions to support knowledge exchange and business engagement activities that further economic growth and productivity. RIF is specifically focused on stimulating local and regional growth.

Use of funding

- 3. Funding from the Regional Innovation Fund can be used flexibly to support knowledge exchange and business engagement activities that further economic growth and productivity. The primary focus should be on local/regional partners, priorities and impacts.
- 4. Given the short timescale for expenditure, we anticipate that the funding will be focused on supporting and building on activities that are already in train (although funding can also be used to support new activity).
- 5. Funds can be used for revenue and capital expenditure. Capital expenditure relates to the purchase of equipment expressly for the purpose of knowledge exchange activities with external partners in line with fund priorities.
- 6. Funding should be committed in full within the current academic year, 2023/24, for activities from 3 October 2023, the date of the DSIT announcement. HEFCW reserves the right to recoup any part of an institution's allocation that is not spent on eligible activities by the end of the academic year.

Allocations

- The Regional Innovation Fund (RIF) is allocated using the formula funding element of the Research Wales Innovation Fund (RWIF) allocation methodology. This formula funding is based on HEFCW National Measures to incentivise performance, as outlined in circular <u>W22/41HE</u>.
- 8. For the avoidance of doubt, RIF is a separate one-off funding stream which should be used to support knowledge exchange and business engagement activities that further local/regional economic growth and productivity. We anticipate that these activities will be aligned with institutional RWIF strategies, but may enhance, or be additional to, existing delivery plans.
- 9. Individual institution RIF allocations are set out in **Annex A**.

Monitoring

- 10. Institutions should provide a brief, high-level summary (2 pages maximum) detailing the activities this funding has supported and how they contribute to meeting the objectives set out above.
- 11. This should be submitted by 26 July 2024, via email to Corinne Nguyen, <u>corinne.nguyen@hefcw.ac.uk</u>.

Conditions of funding

- The funding allocated by HEFCW is made available subject to the general conditions for payment of funds by HEFCW to the Governing Body of an institution. These are set out in the 2023/24 <u>Terms and Conditions of Funding</u>. Institutions should take account of the requirements of the Subsidy Control Act 2022.
- 13. Payments will be made in March 2024.

Acceptance of funding

- 14. HEFCW acknowledges the challenges associated with spending funding by the end of the academic year. While we encourage institutions to consider how they might make best use of the Regional Innovation Fund, we do offer the opportunity to opt-out and choose not to receive an allocation, or to receive a lower amount of funding.
- 15. Institutions should contact <u>corinne.nguyen@hefcw.ac.uk</u> by 22 March 2024 to accept or decline their allocations of funding.
- 16. Funding allocations shown in **Annex A** are therefore provisional and may be increased to ensure the total budget is allocated.
