## **Pre-registration applications** approved

To open an independent school in England, applicants must complete a registration process with the Department for Education (DfE).

Applicants must demonstrate they are likely to meet the Independent School Standards once registered.

## Material change applications approved

Before making any substantial changes to their registered details, independent schools must submit a material change request to DfE and obtain prior approval from, the Secretary of State for Education. This requirement applies to any significant alteration, including changes in:

- school address
- age range of pupils
- the maximum number of pupils

When an independent school decides to close voluntarily, it must notify DfE, so that its details can be removed from the Register of Independent Schools.
