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Executive summary

Purpose

1. This document lists the funding allocated through the second round of the Higher Education Innovation Fund over the two years 2004-05 to 2005-06. It also provides details of the assessment and award process.

Key points

- 2. The fund supports activities in higher education institutions to increase their capability to respond to the needs of business and the wider community, where this will lead to identifiable economic benefits. The initiative is a partnership between the Department of Trade and Industry/Office of Science and Technology, the Department for Education and Skills and HEFCE.
- 3. The invitation to apply for funding was issued in HEFCE 2003/58.

Action required

4. No action is required.

Background

- 5. Funding for the second round of the Higher Education Innovation Fund (HEIF 2) was announced following the Government's 2003 White Paper, 'The future of higher education'. It will continue and develop the work of the first round of HEIF, which itself built upon the Higher Education Reach-out to Business and the Community initiative (HEROBC). HEIF 2 will incorporate activities based on current Science Enterprise Challenge and University Challenge initiatives in England; and creates a network of 22 centres for knowledge exchange activity as exemplars of good practice. The Higher Education Active Community Fund is not incorporated into HEIF 2 but is continued in parallel.
- 6. We invited higher education institutions (HEIs) in England to apply for HEIF 2 funding to support activities to increase their capability to respond to the needs of business (including companies of all sizes and sectors, and other bodies in the wider community), where this will lead to identifiable economic benefits.
- 7. A total of up to £187 million has been made available over the two years 2004-05 and 2005-06.
- 8. We consulted English HEIs, and other interested parties, on the fund in HEFCE 2003/34. HEIs stated their broad support for the proposals in the consultation document. A summary of responses is in HEFCE 2003/58 Annex C.

Funding

- 9. HEIF 2 is a joint initiative by the Department of Trade and Industry/Office of Science and Technology (DTI/OST), the Department for Education and Skills (DfES) and HEFCE, with £131 million provided by OST and £56 million contributed by HEFCE.
- 10. We received 183 applications, including 69 proposals from consortia of HEIs. The value of applications received totalled approximately £307.3 million, far more than the £187 million available under HEIF 2. Funding of £186 million was awarded in support of 124 proposals, 46 of which were collaborative projects involving more than 100 HEIs. Around £16 million of the total funding will support a network of 22 new centres for knowledge exchange activity.
- 11. The awards ranged from £250,000 for a single institution to £12.9 million for a large scale strategic collaboration where the funding was shared among four partner HEIs. The maximum award to any HEI for a single non-collaborative bid was £2.4 million. HEIs who participated in collaborative bids and/or centres of knowledge exchange activity were eligible to receive a total maximum award of £3.25 million. This included any single HEI award and their indicative share of any collaborative awards.
- 12. The activities and outcomes resulting from all awards will be monitored through HEIs' annual monitoring statement to HEFCE, or a similar statement for collaborative projects. The Regional Advisory Groups (RAGs) may also be asked to extend their current role in monitoring collaborative HEI activities to include a yearly review of individual HEI activities in their region. This is in order to provide evidence of the regional impact of HEIF-funded activities, and to inform and support future government policy decisions regarding third stream activity.

Assessment and award process

- 13. Each application for HEIF 2 funding was assessed by four separate groups:
 - consultants appointed by OST to give an independent perspective and consistent assessment across all proposals
 - RAGs, comprising at least HEFCE regional consultants and representatives from the relevant Government Office and Regional Development Agencies (RDAs), to give a regional perspective
 - a HEFCE-nominated pool of heads of HEIs and business, including public sector leaders, to give an external and business oriented perspective
 - a team of DTI officials to make use of their broad experience of interaction between HEIs and business.
- 14. The groups of assessors provided differing but complementary areas of expertise to ensure that the selection procedure considered the strengths of each proposal from a broad perspective. The assessors all worked to the same basic criteria. The primary criterion against which applications were assessed was whether the proposal was likely to have a significant impact on achieving the objectives for HEIF 2. The assessments were then considered by a national advisory board, to recommend which projects to fund, and at what level. (Membership of the advisory board is at Annex A.)
- 15. The advisory board, chaired by Sir Keith O'Nions, Director General of Research Councils, reviewed all proposals in the light of the assessors' scores and comments, and its own assessment. It then made recommendations to the HEFCE Board and the Minister for Science and Innovation on full, reduced or nil awards. These recommendations were accepted in full, and are listed in Annex B.
