## Core features and assessment criteria for foundation degrees

## **Core features**

- 1. To be eligible for consideration, all bids for foundation degrees were required to have a readily identifiable and distinctive set of core features covering the following broad areas:
- employer involvement
- development of skills and knowledge
- application of skills in the workplace
- credit accumulation and transfer
- progression within work and/or to an honours degree.

## Assessment criteria

- 2. Eligible bids were assessed against the following criteria:
  - a. The extent to which the market opportunity for the programme was demonstrated.
  - b. The extent, nature and added value of employer involvement.
  - c. The extent to which the programmes meet the needs of the target student groups.
  - d. The contribution of the programmes to students' employability.
  - e. The contribution of the programmes to widening participation and progression to further study.
  - f. The anticipated quality of teaching provision.
  - g. The overall coherence of the bid.
  - h. The strength of the proposed partnership.
  - i. The strength of the management arrangements.
  - j. The feasibility of the project plan.
  - k. The prospects of ensuring employer involvement.
  - I. The feasibility of meeting student recruitment targets.
