

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#### Introduction

The School Survey is a collaborative tool developed by the Audit Commission in partnership with Ofsted, Estyn, Wales Audit Office, councils, and headteacher and governor associations. The survey has been in operation as a national annual online exercise since summer 2002. The primary purpose of the school survey is to act as a source of evidence about schools' perceptions of the support provided by their council and the services provided locally for children and young people.

The survey was conducted online during a seven-week period in the summer term of 2008. The survey was available to all 13,262 schools from the 94 participating councils in England. The survey was completed by 4,485 schools (34 per cent).

This national summary examines schools' responses to the questions in the core survey, which cover six areas: being healthy; staying safe; enjoying and achieving; making a positive contribution; achieving economic wellbeing; and service management.

Schools were able to answer each question in the survey using one of six possible responses: (1) Very good (2) Good (3) Satisfactory (4) Poor (5) Very poor or (X) Unable to comment.

Councils received benchmarked analysis reports in early September 2008 and are expected to share the results with their schools.



# **Summary findings**

Of the 82 questions in the 2008 school survey:




- Seventy-seven questions were rated satisfactory or above (94 per cent) the same percentage as 2007.
- Five questions were rated below satisfactory (6 per cent).


Changes over time since 2007:

- Seventy-one per cent of questions received lower ratings this year (reverses the pattern between 2006-2007, however no changes are greater than 2 per cent)
- Twenty-nine per cent received higher rates this year (no changes greater than 2 per cent)

Highest-rated five questions (according to overall average):




 Ninety-four per cent of schools rated the effectiveness of the council in challenging your school to perform better as satisfactory or above (95 per cent in 2007).



 Ninety-two per cent of schools rated the support to develop self-management in your school in order to secure school per cent in 2007).







 Ninety per cent of schools rated the clarity of guidance on when to make a child protection referral to the relevant service as satisfactory or above (91 per cent in 2007).





- Fourty-four per cent of schools rated the effectiveness of local services in meeting the mental health needs of children and young people as below satisfactory (40 per cent in 2007).
- Thirty-seven per cent of schools rated the accessibility of the social workers responsible for the looked-after children in their school as below satisfactory (35 per cent in 2007).











• Twenty-nine per cent of schools rated the effectiveness of council provision for pupils out of mainstream schools, including pupils who have been excluded, as below satisfactory (28 per cent in 2007).
